

One in Bree almost finished, fences made and quicks set: three in Castledackrel finished, and fenced with paling; three in Clonroche almost finished, and fenced with paling; three in Clonroche almost finished, not fenced; six in Edermine, all in a forward state, and fences made. I must here state that the slating in particular, and the workmanship in general, in the Division of Clonroche and Edermine is of a first-class quality, and is creditable to the tradesmen who have done the work. Two in Ennisoorthy, lencing not completed; one in Kilmallock almost finished, fences making, quicks setting; one in Kilrush, finished and fenced; one in St. Mary's, finished and fenced; three in The Leap near finished, not fenced. 
