

Report of 22 Clerk of Works

The following report was read from the Clerk of Works:—

GENTLEMEN—I have to report three houses in Ballyhogue almost completed, plots fenced and quicks set; three in Ballyhuskard, fences made and quicks set; one in Ballyvaldon, fence made, no quicks; three in Bolaboy, not fenced. I must state for the information of the Board that I inspected house No. 4 in Glenegark last Monday, and after a close examination I could find nothing wrong, only the walls are three inches lower, from floor to wall-plate, than is given on plan, and the loft window of small room something smaller than the usual size. I have no other fault to find with the internal or external workmanship of this house, so far as it has proceeded. One in Bree almost finished, fences made and quicks set; three in Castletalbot completed, fences made, no quicks; two in Castledockrel finished, and fenced with paling; three in Clonroche almost finished, not fenced; six in Edermine, all in a forward state, and fences made. I must here state that the slating in particular, and the workmanship in general, in the Division of Clonroche and Edermine is of a first-class quality, and is creditable to the tradesmen who have done the work. Two in Enniscorthy, fencing not completed; one in Kilmallock almost finished, fences making, quicks setting; one in Kilrush, finished and fenced; one in St. Mary's, finished and fenced; three in The Leap near finished, not fenced. The following is a correct list of the number of houses in each division, set down, where the contractors have not yet begun to build:—Ballyvaldon, 1; Bolaboy, 3; Castletalbot, 3; Castle Hill, 2; Clonroche, 4; Enniscorthy, 2; Kilmallock, 2; Tinacross, 1; total, 22. I have to remark for the information of the Board that some contractors dashed and plastered in a bad season, the frost destroyed the bonding. In such cases I will require the contractors to re-dash and plaster to my satisfaction before I will recommend the payment of the last instalment. I would recommend the contractors for their own sake as well as for the benefit of houses not to dash or plaster until they get a good season. Feb. 18, 1886. MAURICE MURPHY, C.W.

The Minutes of last Meeting were read and signed.

The Workhouse Register was produced, examined, and authenticated, from No. 1087 to No. 1189 both inclusive, by the signature of the Chairman, and countersignature of the Clerk.

The Out-door Relief Register was produced, examined, and authenticated, from No. 8925 to No. 8924 both inclusive, by the signature of the Chairman, and countersignature of the Clerk.

The Clerk's Report was read to the following effect:—

Seed Supply acct.

CLERK'S REPORT.

"In Re the Seed Rate and Seed Supply.
"To the Board of Guardians, Enniscorthy Union.
"GENTLEMEN—As all accounts connected with the seed rate and seed supply in this union are now closed, I beg to lay before the board the following facts:—The amount borrowed by this union from the Board of Works was £1147. In the proper disbursement of this, the number of accounts necessary was very large, and exacted great care and particularity. Those also involved in the collecting of the repayments from ratepayers were still more troublesome and labourious, as they were sub-divided over the various electoral divisions for a period of five years, so as to make the repayment easy to the borrower. This, of course, increased the labour four-fold, and altogether it was exceptional work, and totally unconnected with previous poor-law business. For all this work I have never received any remuneration from the board. There is now lying to the credit of the seed supply account a sum of £20 3s. 7d., which I ask to be awarded to me, as, at least some slight reward for my trouble. I am more than justified in asking this, when it is known that this balance to the credit has been created by my own exertions on behalf of the fund in question. On April 15th, 1880, Mr. Flynn (our present chairman), Mr. O'Farrell, and Mr. R. Jordan appeared before the board, and stated that if cash in hand were given them they could buy potatoes in the open market at 2s. 6d. per barrel less than the board could purchase by tender, and they requested the chairman of the day, Mr. N. P. Ryan, to sign a cheque for £200, to enable them to purchase without delay. This Mr. Ryan refused to do. Seeing the advantages of such a course, I advanced to the above-named gentlemen, from my own private means, the necessary amount. They accordingly bought in the market at once 224 barrels of potatoes at 11s. 6d. per barrel, while the tenders sent in showed an average of 14s. as the price asked. The difference, therefore, made by my advance of capital amounts to £28. Of this £20 3s. 7d. remains in the board's hands, and to this I think I am fairly entitled. I lay before the board all the necessary proofs of this transaction, signed by the present chairman, Mr. Flynn, who can vouch for their accuracy. I think, therefore, I am fully justified in asking that the money made by the advance of my own private capital should be handed over to me, as some little recompense for a mass of labour and trouble which could scarcely be tabulated or scheduled in any way."
Proposed by Mr. Goodisson, seconded by Mr. P. Murphy, and ordered—"That this £20 3s. 7d. be allowed to Mr. Keohler, subject to the sanction of the Local Government Board."

—Now, sir, allow me to make a remark to the board in connection with such an unwarrantable and uncalled-for side attack on the sanitary-officers of this union. I would venture to say there is not a rural sanitary district in Ireland—quietly and without making any row about it—the sanitary-officers, so far as I am aware, get so many nuisances remedied. I speak of the medical-officers of the district as well as the sub-sanitary-officers. They do not bring half the things before the board as they might, but use their personal influence to get the things remedied if possible. As I have stated over and over again, my difficulty has been to get the sanitary reports dealt with by the board. Whenever I mentioned that these sanitary reports were to be considered, as a rule, what occurred? There was a regular stampede of the guardians from the room. I had sometimes to use a little personal pressure while going over a few sanitary notices. This has constantly been brought up here. It would have been far better, as they could have easily done, for the guardians to have come and mentioned this thing before the board than to go behind our backs and complain of it, get the matter put into the public Press, and have us paraded before the world as neglecting our duty, as if there was any reason for it. The Dispensary Committee required some amusement for a long time back, and the principle business which they amused themselves with was to attack some officer. He then read a number of reports of various dates from both sanitary officers and also the orders made on this nuisance complained of. Since July or August last they had heard nothing of the matter. It was the simplest thing possible to have asked the guardians if the order was not carried out to have a prosecution instituted. I was informed that the matter was grappled with, and that Father Marshall was perfectly satisfied.
