On my first and subsequent Visits until his Grotestant Companion left the House Simpson Complained to me that the good Ire got was most unsuitable and that corretimes he could not take it, From Charity of gave him some money every time visited him that he might purchase some thing, that a pick man could Eat + drink. No sooner however, had his Erotestant Companion left the house than he told me " The Nuns are very good to me now ! and on the occasion of my visit early last welk he had just finished taking some whiskey - In answer to my question he told me They give me four ounces of whickey a day - O indeed, they we very good to me now: a day or two after this I received a letter from him amouncing his intention to change his religion. I visited him next day, Saturday, 16th inst when he said "I do not Know well what to do: but I am in a difficulty: That difficulty he explained to me when I visited him Jesterday. 

With reference to my report of the 20th inst, regarding the immate, Simpson, I have to state that I am prepared to swear on oath to the accuracy of every sentence I wrote regarding what he said to me regarding his perversion. Further, I have to state, I—That a week before Simpson signified to the Master of the Workhouse his intention to become a Roman Catholic, I found on his seat at the head of his bed, his own Bible, and on the Bible a book called "The Rock of the Catholic Faith." I lifted it, asking him how that book came there? He seemed a great deal confused on my drawing his attention to it—widently having forgotten to hide it. He eagerly reached for it, saying it belonged to the man at the other side of him. Both the book and Simpson's confusion aromed my suspicion. If a man had been at the other side of him I aw none. Hetwould not likely have come round Simpson's bed and placed the book on the latter's seat. 2—That when Measrs. Cummins and Whelam were sent as a deputation from the board to examine Simpson as to the altering of his religion, they, on their return to the boardroom, stated that "the man was dying and anxious to see a priest." This was palpable misrepresentation. I saw him on the morning of the previous day, and he told me he was so well that he was just about to get up and dress. On the second day after, I visited him and he was walking about in the ward. On the fifth day after he stood with me in the yard a considerable time in very good health and spirits, and eight days after the deputation studed "he was dying and spirits, and eight days after the deputation studed" he was dying, "he gave evidence at length before the board. Sir.—In reference to the order of the board on the 28th ult., we beg to say that our inquiry into the case of Simpson does not enable us to add anything of importance to the statement already made to the board by Simpson himself. Simpson is a young man, not only intelligent, but well read, and appears to us to be a person altogether unlikely to fall under the influence of any one, and least of all of one who should happen to hold religious views different from his own. He states that the desire of being instructed in the doctrines of the Catholic Church originated entirely from himself—that he made up his mind to this step when he was, as he thought, in the presence of death, and he resents as an intrusion the action of any one who should attempt to restrict the liberty of his conscience at such an hour. The allegation that he has been led on by unworthy motives, or influenced by the officers of the house, he repudiates as utterly without foundation, and this repudiation on the part of the man who is alone interested, and who must be considered the best juuge, ought, in our opinion, to put an end to all further inquiry on this subject. With regard to the book found with Simpson it is only necessary to state, that as over 90 per cent. of the immates are Catholic, and as these poor people have a right to read Catholic books, it is scarcely possible to prevent some of these books from coming into the hands of Protestants and others, who may wish to read them; but inasmuch as such books can only be read with the full consent of such party, we cannot consider this as a subject of consideration for us. We think Simpson has just ground for complaint when he states that after having made known to the master and to the board his desire to see the Catholic Priest, and to be instructed in the doctrines of the Catholic Church, and after having been registered in due form as a Catholic, he should have been subjected to such Luseomly wrangles as those forced upon him by a minister whose ministrations he had declined, and who
