# Protestant Chaplain's Report

(No 1)

October 20<sup>th</sup> 1886

Fredrick Simpson, Compositor, a Protestant came into the Workhouse about five or six weeks ago suffering acutely from Consumption. He was placed in the Infirmary Ward where he had another Protestant along side of him. On my first and subsequent visits until his Protestant Companion left the House Simpson complained to me that the food he got was most unsuitable and that sometimes he could not take it. From Charity I gave him some money every time I visited him that he might purchase some thing, that a sick man could eat & drink. No sooner however, had his Protestant Companion left the house than he told me "The Nuns are very good to me now!" and on the occasion of my visit early last week he had just finished taking some whiskey - In answer to my question he told me "They give me four ounces of Whiskey a day - O indeed, they are very good to me now." A day or two after this I received a letter from him announcing his intention to change his religion. I visited him next day, Saturday, 16<sup>th</sup> inst when he said "I do not know well what to do" but I am in a difficulty. That difficulty he explained to me when I visited him yesterday. He said I am very sorry that I gave way to their influence at first but I cannot go back now or I'll be persecuted (meaning badly treated) while I am here. He further told me "The more he read of their books, and the more they talked to him on their religion he was the more disgusted."

When I visited him on Tuesday although he was able to remain out in the yard and walk about,



I found him basking himself at a splendid fire in another room reading a book on "Indulgences" it was the only fire I saw in the house since last Spring. In answer to my question on Tuesday he said "Indirect influence (hinting at the extra supply of good things) had been brought to bear on him".

It will be seen from this that while the poor man was a Protestant - while he was very ill and in need of Extra Kindnesses - he received but poor attendance; that when he got well and his Protestant Companion had left him, he was tampered with and skilfully bribed to change his religion for one that he told me on Monday last (Yesterday) he could not believe -

Nº 2

When I visited Anne Moulton yesterday & today I found her room had been changed for the third time within about four weeks. She has nothing under her but straw & a piece of cloth, nothing in the shape of a tick. She has very little clothes of any kind on her bed, further, she is in such a dirty condition, that it is a great trial to me to look at her while performing my Divine Office. She does not seem to have had, hands, arms, head or face washed for years. She is the only dirty looking invalid I have seen in the house - This kind of bad treatment of Protestant invalids seems to me to be one of the means adopted in this Union, for the proselytizing of the few poor Protestants who have to come in here.

(to use her own words I am washed every day and sure I was washed this morning) The Committee examined other Protestant inmates who stated that they were well treated, and that there was no distinction made whatever as to the treatment of either Sects."

# Simpson's Statement read for him by Clerk, in presence of Master.

Simpson, who had been sent for, here came before the meeting.

The Chairman—Are you changed from a Protestant to a Catholic.

Simpson—Yes, so far as the registry is concerned.

The Chairman—I want to ask you if it is a fact that you have been treated better since you became a Catholic than you were before.

Simpson—I would like to make a statement, because I have good reason to know that the Protestant chaplain made a report, and I would like to hear it read.

The Clerk (Mr. Brennan) re-read the above report.

Simpson—I would like the statement I make to be brought before the public, and to exonerate the nuns, in the first place, from all blame (at the present time I am neither a Protestant or a Catholic). When I came into this public institution suffering from consumption I was superstitious over the question of religion, because I was never a great fellow for religion until I got sick, and being in a public institution like this I knew I could not have two clergymen attending me. I was therefore necessitated to have my religion changed, so far as the registry was concerned, from Protestant to Catholic. I signified my intention of changing my religion to the nuns, who sent for the master. I told him that there was no influence whatever brought to bear on me to become a Catholic, that it was my own free inclination to become a Catholic. A number of the guardians came afterwards and questioned me, and I told them there was no influence brought to bear on me, and neither is there. I sent a letter to the chaplain, stating that I thought well to change my religion since last I saw him, and thanking him very much for the service rendered to me since I came to the hospital. That so far as the little money he gave me—(he gave me on four occasions 6d)—that I would send it to him if I thought I had not a gentleman to deal with, but as I had it would be an insult to send it to him. On Monday he came and asked me if I was fully inclined to be a Catholic; I said I was, inasmuch as I wanted to see and work out for myself, by reading such books as I could get, whether the Catholic religion was right or not, and if I found for myself of course I should be one. He went away, and on Tuesday came again. I was sitting at the fire along with a woman, an inmate that was very kind to me, giving me a cup of tea, and when the chaplain came in I was reading a book, the title page of which was "On Indulgences." He looked at it and asked me what I thought of it. I told him my mind because I have not yet satisfied myself. I am not a Catholic properly. "Well," said I, "to tell the truth, I look upon it as ridiculous," and we both laughed. He then asked me what I would do, and I said I could say nothing, only do what I had done, that I would read any books which might be supplied by the Catholic chaplain. Since I came into the hospital there was a fire night and day in the ward I was in, and I could have sat at it if I thought fit. Furthermore, he stated that there was influence brought to bear on me to change my religion. Now, that is a lie. I never gave him any reason to know that there was—the Nuns or no other person in the house brought any influence to bear on me. I told him what I done I did it with my own free will.

Chairman—No person at all interfered with you?

Simpson—Certainly not. He made another statement that I was influenced with whiskey. I consider that is an indirect libel on the doctor. I would not like to be insulting to the chaplain; I respect him as being a Protestant all my life. I was very bad when I came in, and I believe patients must be under observation for some days, and the doctor will not put you on proper diet until he sees whether you are a case for it or not. After a fortnight I asked the doctor for a drop of stimulants. When out working I used stimulants medicinally. I got the stimulants. Another explanation I think it necessary to make is—When I went into the hospital first I could not make use of or relish the diet, and I asked the Chaplain on the first day to try and get me into the County Infirmary by the interest of the Rector, Rev. Mr. Murdock. A few days after he brought me word that they had got a letter from the resident medical officer, Dr. Boxwell, to go if I was able. During the time I got very weak and ill and unable to travel, and, indeed, I am not able to come down here to-day, only for the sole purpose of exonerating the officers from all blame in the matter. The Doctor did not give me anything extraordinary.

The Chairman—That is a very ample explanation, and there is no need for further inquiry. Is there any truth in the report that you are treated very much better since you became a Catholic than you were previously?

Simpson—If such is the case, I never took notice of it.

# Protestant Chaplain's Report In re "Simpson"

The following report was read from the Rev. Mr. Pillar:—

Thursday, 28th Oct., 1886.

With reference to my report of the 20th inst., regarding the inmate, Simpson, I have to state that I am prepared to swear on oath to the accuracy of every sentence I wrote regarding what he said to me regarding his perversion. Further, I have to state, 1.—That a week before Simpson signified to the Master of the Workhouse his intention to become a Roman Catholic, I found on his seat at the head of his bed, his own Bible, and on the Bible a book called "The Rock of the Catholic Faith." I lifted it, asking him how that book came there? He seemed a great deal confused on my drawing his attention to it—evidently having forgotten to hide it. He eagerly reached for it, saying it belonged to the man at the other side of him. Both the book and Simpson's confusion aroused my suspicion. If a man had been at the other side of him I saw none. He could not likely have come round Simpson's bed and placed the book on the latter's seat. 2.—That when Messrs. Cummins and Whelan were sent as a deputation from the board to examine Simpson as to the altering of his religion, they, on their return to the boardroom, stated that "the man was dying and anxious to see a priest." This was palpable misrepresentation. I saw him on the morning of the previous day, and he told me he was so well that he was just about to get up and dress. On the second day after, I visited him and he was walking about in the ward. On the fifth day after he stood with me in the yard a considerable time in very good health and spirits, and eight days after the deputation stated "he was dying," he gave evidence at length before the board. I charge the deputation—composed exclusively of Roman Catholics—with sympathising with and aiding in the perversion of Simpson. They stated, "he was dying and seemed very anxious," but he is not a Roman Catholic yet. 3.—When Simpson was asked by the Chairman of the Board whether he was changed from a Protestant to a Roman Catholic, he answered, "yes, so far as the registry is concerned." He further stated, "at the present time I am neither a Protestant nor a Catholic." I respectfully submit the question to the Local Government Board whether the guardians have not acted improperly in altering an inmates religion from "Protestant" to "Roman Catholic," solely for the purpose of giving the Nuns and the Roman Catholic Chaplain a license to pervert the inmate, when the inmate declares himself not a Catholic. He was entered as a "Protestant" (what he has been all his life); and as only Protestant and Roman Catholic are acknowledged on the register, I respectfully submit to the Local Government Board that an inmate entered as a Protestant ought to remain so until he declares himself a Roman Catholic. All this time, though he publicly declares himself not a Roman Catholic, he declares publicly that he is receiving instructions and Roman Catholic books from the Roman Catholic chaplain. This, I submit, is most irregular and dishonest. 4.—When asked by the Chairman, "Are you treated better since you became a Roman Catholic than before it?" Simpson gave no answer, and when asked this vital question a second time, he said, "if such is the case I never took notice of it." This is his public statement, and what is written remains. There is not, I think, a jury of sane men in Europe who would not receive such an answer to be affirmative, which the witness was afraid to give in distinct terms. I can produce the other Protestant inmate who heard him (Simpson) complain piteously to me for the first fortnight after his coming into the house that "he could not use the food he was getting," and I felt so much for him that I was going to report the matter at the time. 5.—According to the evidence of this man (Simpson), with which the board expressed its satisfaction, the Doctor is unable to put an invalid on proper diet until he watches him a fortnight. If this be true, it is monstrous; if it be true, I should like to know who outside the workhouse would employ him? I refuse to believe it to be anything but a miserable excuse, put into Simpson's mouth by those who are more anxious about their own defence than about the Doctor's reputation. 6.—He offered to return me the little money I gave him in his extremity. He had not a farthing coming into the house, and he says I gave him

two shillings. I should like to know how he would get two shillings to return me, if not from his proselytisers, in order to have him freed from any supposed obligation of respect to me, in consequence of my material kindness to him. 7.—I saw Anne Moulton yesterday. I am perfectly satisfied with her improved condition. She was washed on the evening of the day I wrote my report and the following morning, in order to be in good order for the guardians' inspection. The guardians should not have examined herself as to how she had been treated, for it was only a chance whether she can give any correct statement of anything, as her mind has been affected for some time past, in consequence of which she was recently removed to the idiot ward. Yesterday, however, I asked her what she meant by saying to the guardians that she was washed every day, when she answered, "Yesterday and day." All this I have witnesses to prove before any tribunal. Further, I have witnesses to prove the accuracy of the description I gave of her condition in my former report. Finally, I consider it only a farce to have deputations sent from the board to inquire into the subject of my reports where such deputations are composed exclusively of Roman Catholic members of the board, as was the case on last Thursday.

*Matter of Common Cause for the Board  
 & after some repudatory remarks  
 handed in the following*

SIR—In reference to the order of the board on the 28th ult., we beg to say that our inquiry into the case of Simpson does not enable us to add anything of importance to the statement already made to the board by Simpson himself. Simpson is a young man, not only intelligent, but well read, and appears to us to be a person altogether unlikely to fall under the influence of any one, and least of all of one who should happen to hold religious views different from his own. He states that the desire of being instructed in the doctrines of the Catholic Church originated entirely from himself—that he made up his mind to this step when he was, as he thought, in the presence of death, and he resents as an intrusion the action of any one who should attempt to restrict the liberty of his conscience at such an hour. The allegation that he has been led on by unworthy motives, or influenced by the officers of the house, he repudiates as utterly without foundation, and this repudiation on the part of the man who is alone interested, and who must be considered the best judge, ought, in our opinion, to put an end to all further inquiry on this subject. With regard to the book found with Simpson it is only necessary to state, that as over 90 per cent. of the inmates are Catholic, and as these poor people have a right to read Catholic books, it is scarcely possible to prevent some of these books from coming into the hands of Protestants and others, who may wish to read them; but inasmuch as such books can only be read with the full consent of such party, we cannot consider this as a subject of consideration for us. We think Simpson has just ground for complaint when he states that after having made known to the master and to the board his desire to see the Catholic Priest, and to be instructed in the doctrines of the Catholic Church, and after having been registered in due form as a Catholic, he should have been subjected to such unseemly wrangles as those forced upon him by a minister whose ministrations he had declined, and whose religious opinions he had publicly renounced. This manifest violation of the rules of the house is, in our opinion, the only subject of investigation at present incumbent on the board. In order, therefore, to prevent all such violation in future, we think it desirable that the rules of the house be henceforth, in all cases, strictly enforced, as otherwise those who endeavour to perform their duty to the inmates and to the board will be at the mercy of every irresponsible individual who may wish to seek notoriety by making reckless charges against the officers of the house.
