DEAR SIR—We had received the writ in this matter from counsel and were about issuing it when our client, Mr. Maher, wrote to us directing us before doing so to communicate to the guardians a course which he would be prepared to adopt in order, if possible, to avoid litigation with the guardians. We will therefore be obliged if you will lay the following offer before them. Mr. Maher has made enquiries as to the exact positions of the various cottages proposed to be erected on his property, and he finds that the building of the cottages on Garrentrowlin and on that part of Kilpierce in the tenancy or occupation of Mr. James Cummins is very far advanced, and the stopping of them by the Court of Chancery will render the expense heretofore incurred as so much money thrown away, and inflict very serious loss upon the guardians which is not at all Mr. Maher's object in this matter. Mr. Maher would, therefore, be prepared to withdraw all objections to these cottages, and to execute a conveyance of the sites to the guardians if they on their side will consent to abandon these cottages which have not yet been commenced—namely, the cottages proposed to be built on Kilcotton, Coolgarrow, and that part of Kilpierce, in his own possession. This offer is, of course, made without prejudice, and solely with a view to avoid litigation; and if the guardians decline it, kindly say whether you will accept service of the writ, as our instructions are, if the offer be not accepted, to issue it forthwith, and at once apply for the injunction ~~and~~ the cottages. If we do not hear from you on or before next Friday, the 6th inst., we will assume that the offer is declined, and will issue the writ and serve it in the ordinary way.—Yours truly,

Medical Officer Report  
Iure Medicini Contract

The Clerk read the following report from Dr. Furlong :-

In anticipation of the new contract for medicines, which I believe will be considered to-day, I feel it my duty to make a few remarks. As spokesman for the medical committee this time twelve months, I told your board that we could not recommend Mr. Corcoran's tender, as most of the medicines were quoted so much below the market that he could not supply genuine articles at the prices. Subsequently I had occasion to examine some of his drugs, as under the present anomalous arrangement, the medicines for the use of the fever hospital are drawn from the dispensary store. Many of them were totally unrecognisable even from their general appearance, not to speak of a chemical analysis; and I verily believe that even a healthy Esquimaux could not swallow a table-spoonful of the cod-liver-oil, so old and so rancid was it. I also noticed that the packages were sent out from Leslie and Co., a former contractor to this union, and whose medicines were most unsatisfactory. From the knowledge thus gained, I fully resolved not to order a particle of medicine during the year, as I shall not on any account, undertake to prescribe inferior drugs, even though some people might consider them good enough for the poor. Anything that was required I supplied myself at my own expense, and this, no doubt, throws some light on the smallness of the amount expended on medicines during the past twelve months. Perhaps, too, some of the other medical officers were obliged to do as I have done. Should such a contract be again entered into, and the lives of the suffering poor be sacrificed for a mere paltry consideration, I shall feel in consequence bound to request the Local Government Board to be allowed to order my hospital requirements from some reliable source.

GENTLEMEN—I beg to draw your attention to my tender for 200 tons of Newport coal at 17s. 6d. per ton, which I sent in in accordance with your advertisement, and on your tender form supplied to me for the purpose. I have heard that another tender has been accepted at 18s. per ton, and as this, if so, may have resulted from misrepresentation, or other occult influence, I desire to wait on your Board to-day to learn particulars, and if possible, to set myself right, as I am not disposed to think that the guardians, many of whom are amongst my best customers for coals, would, except for some extraordinary reason, do me such a grievous wrong, and at the same time inflict on the ratepayers a permanent, and probably increasing loss, by the distinction of legitimate competition. Since I commenced to tender and to pull down prices generally, you are getting coals at 1s. 6d. per ton less, and had my tender been accepted the saving would be 2s. per ton, or £20 per year, on 200 ton. This would be a very respectable sum to give in out-door or other charitable relief, and I therefore believe that you have been misled.
