Read Letter from 1002 Law Commissioners dated 21 July 1811 AC. 18489 stating that Informs the Board that they have received the Inspector's report of his inspection of the govery Coolgrener & amolin Districts he states the Chinney shafts of the gorey Dispensary requires to be repaired; & the floor of the boolgreney Dispensary is in a very bad Condition; & they request the Board will have the chimney shaft repaired, & a new floor put down, He reports that in consequence of a recent change in the Committee of management of boolgrency Dispensary District there is at present no person in that village empowered to que tickets for Medical relief, that the nearest member of the formulter live. about a mile from loolgrency; & the Medical Afficer informed him that it is sometimes in convenient in the sick pon to go that distanco for a ticket; They are of opinion that some perion residing at foolgreney should be appointed a Warden, & they suggest to the suardians the propriety of making such an appointment He also reports that the house securied as a Dispensary at bamolin is very damp, and quite unfit for the purpose, from the nature of the building Non & not be Kept sufficiently drif even if additional fires were allowed, & that the Medical officer informed him that he is often obliged to throw away Medicines which are destroyed by damp & that the strength & quality of others become effected by the same cause he adds that some of the medicines Shown him were mouldy & injured that the labels would not adhere properly to the bottles & that the books were damp. The very unsattsfactory state of that Dispensary was brought under the notice of the Board by the Commissioners in their letter of the yth opt 1869, & in Jep 1840 it was stated by the Dispose Committee that the building was imper for the preservation of Medicines, on the 11th October 18%, a meeting of the Committee was again held when it was considered that the premises were fit for the purpose of a Dispensary with some repairs! & M. Robinson states that since that time the waiting come has been boarded, but that the lurgery has not been made dry, + Cannot be put into good order Considering the hature of the walls & coof & in his opinion it is quite infit for a Dispensary.
