I beg to mention that I have been going over the Counter parts of my Sanitary report book for this time last year & I find that on two occasions I had to report the scanty Supply of water to the Town of Gorey, I now have to state that for the last in my own case which I am prepared to Swear to if necessary that the supply that comes into my water barrel is not sufficient for the use of the house for the day - I purchased a water barrel some time ago, had it in perfect order, without leak or other damage from never having a supply to fill it the sun had the effect of opening the staves, & I may say rendering my barrel useless, I hear the supply of water in Carrion Row is good, but that is no advantage to my family when we are left without water except a scant flow for a few minutes in the morning, not sufficient by any means to supply the want of a family for a few hours. I will thank the Sanitary Board to have this case looked into as the want of water to a household in summer is prejudicial Signed G.
