Collectors Defalcation The question of the Rate collector's defalcation was introduced and a lengthy conversation thereon ensued. The Solicitor explained the legal measures to be taken to secure the amount for which the collector is in default and it was ordered that the Solicitor continue to act in accordance with the resolution of the 1st Instant guided by any light that may have been thrown on the subject during this discussion.

The following resolution proposed by Jasper H. Walsh & Co. and seconded by Alderman Simmet was passed:-

Conditions of collector's appointment Resolved - That this Meeting, at its rising, do stand adjourned to Monday the 20th November, & Instant, at Twelve o'clock noon for the purpose of appointing a Borough Rate collector in place of Mr. Mather Barr. That the remuneration be fixed at Sixpence in the Pound on all Rates collected and advertisements issued for applications from competent persons to fill the office, that the applicants disclose the names of two solvent sureties willing to give security in the sum of £200 in a joint and several bond which shall be executed at the collector's own expense. The collector to be bound to collect all collectable Rates within six months from the date he receives his warrant.

The Minutes of the Waterworks Committee from the 1st July 1882, up to the present were read and sanctioned and the Committee's recommendation to permit the sum of thirteen shillings, Special Charges, allotted in error as against Mr Richard Hayes, Main Street North, was approved and the Rate Book directed to be amended accordingly.

The Secretary & Town Commissioners, Limerick, requested the Town Clerk to forward him the particulars and price of the & Two Engine. The Town Clerk brought the matter before the Board and stated that the Engine cost the Corporation when it was bought in the year 1860 the sum of £172. 12s and asked the Meeting to fix a price on it. - Ordered - That the selling price of the & Two Engine and appliances be fixed at £85. The Town Clerk brought before the Meeting the case of the Corporation Tenants, the subject of the Memorial to the & Treasury; and pointed out that the Council had committed an anomaly in the framing of the resolution of the 2nd October last inasmuch as it afforded the Tenants facilities to enter the Land Court; whereas no permission had been given by the & Treasury to that course of effecting a reduction of the rents; but that the Corporation had merely obtained permission to execute leases of 3 years' tenancy at a reduced rent on a surrender by the Tenants of the existing leases.

A Memorial was received from the inhabitants of New-lane praying to have a lamp erected in New-lane in the vicinity of the old Limokahn. Messrs W. J. Quire O'Leefe and Patrick Ryan, were nominated as a committee to inspect the locality and report on the subject.

The Town Council submitted a letter from the Secretary of the Gas Company, stating that the wishes of the Corporation with regard to the rule to be observed when laying gas pipes should receive prompt attention.

A letter from the Honorary Secretary of the Royal College of Music, of which the Prince of Wales is President, was read, asking the Corporation to lend their support in furtherance of the project by placing the Municipal Buildings at the disposal of three local Examiners to be appointed by the Corporation to conduct the local Preliminary Examination of competitors for the free Scholarships to be given away by the College.

It was ordered - that the Town Hall be given to hold the examination and that Messrs Green, Lyons and Fiebermann be communicated with asking them to allow themselves to be nominated as local Examiners.

A notice was submitted from Courtenay Croker Esq, Local Government Auditor, stating that he would attend at the Town Hall on the 10th of January instant, to audit the Corporation and Town Commissioners Accounts for two years ended 31st December last.

The Solicitor gave an explanation as to the result of the cases brought on for the recovery of Rates at the Petty Sessions Court. He informed the Meeting that he had obtained favorable adjudications in all cases wherein Rates only was sued for, but cases in which Special Charges were sought to be recovered were adjourned for the purpose of getting the Law Adviser's opinion on further legal points raised and difficulties by which the Magistrates considered they were beset. The Solicitor also asked permission to appeal to Quarter Sessions in the event of the Magistrates giving adverse decisions in those cases pending adjudication.
 Ordered - that the Solicitor take whatever steps he may deem advisable.

Mr O'Leefe gave notice that he would move at the next Meeting of the Council that all the Advertising, Printing &c required by the Corporation be in future obtained by contract.

Ordered - that a detailed list of all the supplies required for Printing &c be furnished to the next Meeting.

A letter was received from the Land Revenue stating that the amount of rent

received on half year ending 1st May 1882, was £199: 10: 9 and the Arrears for same period £62: 11: 9. Up to the same date there was due by Mr William J. Cositer the sum of £16: 12: 3, who the Receiver considered ought to be compelled to pay. There was three years rent owed by John Roche a joint tenant for a plot of ground in Hill street. The Receiver requested to be informed if he was to allow abatements on the November rents.

It was Ordered - That the letter be referred to the Corporate Solicitor to take such proceedings thereon as he might consider necessary.

Mr Barry made an application to have the rent reduced on his holding for half year ended 1st November 1882 and produced a Deed of Surrender (which had been executed on his part) for acceptance by the Corporation in order that he might apply to the Land Court to fix a fair rent.

The following resolution proposed by Hugh G. Guire Esq. and seconded by Edward Walsh Esq. was passed:-

The following letter from the Mayor was read: -

The Mayoralty, Wexford, May, 23, 1883.

Gentlemen - As I shall be unavoidably absent from the Meeting tomorrow I wish to invite your attention to a report appearing in the newspapers of the proceedings at Petty Sessions on the 16th Instant when the Magistrates severely censured our body for alleged remissness of duty in allowing Mr Cassiter to keep in stock a larger quantity of gunpowder than sanctioned by law. I will first give you the facts of the case. Mr Cassiter is registered on our books to sell gunpowder and from the peculiar construction of his store he can keep only 50 lbs. Our Inspector reported on the 3rd Instant that the time had arrived for re-registering and he was directed to grant renewals provided the Act was complied with. Prior to this inspection, however, by this business the Government Inspector came to Wexford and visited Mr Cassiter's concerns and found on it 118 lbs of gunpowder

in excess. The Corporation then gave instructions to prosecute Mr Cassiter. In
 court Mr Cassiter asserted and has not contradicted on his examination, that one
 of the Magistrates granted him an authorisation to vend 120 lbs. which act on the
 part of the Justice appears to be very questionable. He also pleaded ignorance as to
 the amount he was entitled to hold. I would like to know if this plea holds good
 why did he apply for special powers. I think the Local Authority have earned
 out their part of the law adequately and that the vote of censure passed on us by
 the Bench was quite uncalled for. Consider what right have they to rebuke a
 representative body of infinitely more importance than themselves; and whose
 Chairman is the Chief Magistrate of the Borough and who owe their position to the
 electors of Wexford and not to the accident of birth or fortune. I may further observe
 that it is not the function of the Local Authority to tutor vendors of explosives in
 the law; but that it expressly points out they should educate themselves on it and
 carry it out themselves and that it is only when the Local Authority discover a
 breach of the Statute they are obliged to interfere.
