The desease was not confined to a particular part of the district. We believe that the desease was spread by the practice of anding children to school before they had completely recovered. The cases of typhus fever occurred principally in the Faythe and Maudlintown and were probably due to overcrowding ill-ventilation and filth, Phthisis and diseases of the respiratory organs caused a very large proportion of the deaths, these deseases are prevalent to a large extent in the district owing to many causes the principal being impure air overcrowding destitution and accummulation of filth, Many of the dwellings of the lower classes are unfit for human habitation and can scarcely be rendered so by any sanitary improvements: much however could be done by the people themselves to Keep them clean. We recommend that frequent inspections be made of the worst portions of the town that the inhabita be compelled to keep their houses clean and that disinfectants and limewash be used freeley where necessary.
