Wexford Urban Council Technical Instruc-tion Committee.—Draft Scheme. The Committee proposes to erect a contral technical school to include Workshep Mathematics, Drawing, net only of a special character for artisans, but of a general character for ordinary students : Practical Geometry, Physics, Manual Instruction in Wood and Iron, Mechanical Engineering subjects, Coach-building, and from time to time, as occasion may require, other subjects of a more general character. We propose to place a capable head-master in charge of the school, a man if possible who has served an apprenticeability as an engineer to a good firm, and who, either before or after his apprenticeship, has had a two or three years' day course at a technical college, and who has had some experience as a teacher. An assistant teacher or two would also be necessary. The students to be divided into the following classes r (1) Artisms employed during the day. (2) Boys and girls leaving elementary schools with a fair elucation at the age of 12 to 15, and who may be employed during the day time. (3) Boys and girls who have been as the elementary schools but who are in a position to continue at a day school for two or three years. We propose that arrangements be made with the day schools by which the teacher of the technical school, and the workshops connected therwith, be at the service of these schools in the day time. The technical school would be available by night for students in classes (1) and (2), and why day for class (3). We think it desirable for draw the attention of the partment to the fact that the great majority of the artisans of Wexford are employed in mechanical work-shops. Wexford has a population of about 12,000, and is the centre of much industrial activity. The principal industries are the manifusture of agricultural implements (this transh alone keeping two large fac-tories, employing 350 hands, constantly at work ; and there is another in course of creation which will em-ploy about 100 hands) : cole building and repairingby about 100 hands); cycle building and repairing-gineering, manufacture of malt, distillation of whis-y, bewring of beer, manufacture of gas and bi-pro-ets, manufacture of mineral water. A large number mechanics are also employed in printing, coach-iding, boat-building, pipe manufacture, harness and ther work, and the manufacture of Portland cement. . There are about 1,000 or more hands employed these and other local industries, and a good pro-rition are men whose work demands skill and ex-cience of a general kind. On the other hand, the rk of many of those employed in the engineering rps demands skill of a retriviet character, for ex-ple, experiments in using only a particular hand or ching tool.
