

The Oath of the Mayor of Wexford.

AB. You shall swear, that you well and truly shall serve Our Sovereign Lord King ^{James} ~~George~~ the ^{first} ~~second~~, and his heirs, People, in the Office of Mayor of this Town and Borough of Wexford, for and during the Space of One whole Year, ^{beginning} ~~beginning~~ Michaelmas Day now next coming; You shall minister equal Justice, as well to the Poor, as to the Rich, to the best of your Cunning, Wit, and Power, and you shall diligently procure such things to be done, as may honestly and justly be to the Profit and Commodity of the Corporation of Wexford Town and Borough; And you shall also endeavour yourself to the uttermost of your power to see all Heresies, Treasons, Felonies, & all other Trespasses, Misdemeanours, and Offences whatsoever which are or shall be committed within the Liberties of this Town and Borough during the Time of your Office to be repressed, reformed and amended, and the Offenders duly punished according to the Laws; And finally you shall support, uphold & maintain his Majesty's Authority, and Government, within this Town and Borough, the prescribed Customs, Rights, Privileges, Liberties, Jurisdictions, Franchises, Compositions, and all lawful Ordinances of this Town and Borough, and as touching and concerning all other things appertaining to your Office, you shall therein faithfully and uprightly behave yourself for the most Quietness, Benefit, Worship, Honesty, Credit, and Honour of this Town and Borough, and the Inhabitants thereof. — To help you God.

The Oath of the Bailiffs.

You **AB.** and **CD.** and either of you shall swear that you will well and truly serve our Sovereign Lord King ^{James} ~~George~~ the ^{first} ~~second~~, and his heirs, People in the Office of Bailiffs and as Bailiff of this Town and Borough of Wexford for and during the Space of One whole Year now next ensuing, and you shall minister Equal Justice, as well to the Poor as Rich, after the best of your Cunning, Wit, and Power, and ye shall diligently procure such things to be done as may honestly and justly be to the Profit and Commodity of the Corporation of this Town, and shall also endeavour yourselves to the uttermost of your Power, to see all Heresies, Treasons, Felonies, and all other Trespasses, Misdemeanours, and Offences whatsoever committed within this Town and Borough during the time of your Office, to be repressed, reformed, and amended, and the Offenders duly punished according to the Laws, so far forth as you are concerned; Also the Mayor and Burgeses of this Town in your Office you shall duly attend upon, as hath been wont, according to the ancient Custom, and you shall well and truly serve, do, and execute, or cause to be served, done, and executed, all and all manner of Precepts, Warrants, and Commandments to you or either of you to be lawfully given and directed touching or concerning any Matter, Cause, or process to be moved had or depending in the Kings Majesty's Courts to be holden within this Town, according to the Liberties thereof or at large, and shall make due Returns and Answers thereunto & make Certificate thereof according to the effect of such Precepts, Warrants, and Commandments, taking therefore your ordinary and due fees, and you shall diligently, and truly do all other things appertaining to your said Office to the uttermost of your Power. — To help you God.

2^d The Oath of the Mayor of the Staple.

The Constables of the Staple are to take the same Oath, Mutatis Mutandis.

A.B. You shall swear that you well and truly shall serve Our Sovereign Lord King ^{George} and his Liege People, the Mayor, Bailiffs, Burgeses, and Community, in the Office of Mayor of the Staple, and as Mayor of the Staple of this Town and Borough of Wexford for the ensuing Year, and you shall diligently and truly do and accomplish all and every thing and things appertaining to your Office according to the Ancient Custom, after the best of your Cunning, Wit, and Power, for the most quietness, Profit, Ease & Credit of this Town and Borough, and the Inhabitants thereof, taking such fees as you might take by the Laws and Statutes of this Realm. ——— So help you God. ———

The Oath of the Serjeants at Mace.

A.B. and C.D. You and either of you shall swear that you well and truly shall serve Our Sovereign Lord the King, the Mayor, Bailiffs, and Burgeses of this Town and Borough of Wexford in the Office of a Serjeantship and as Serjants of the Mace for and during the space of One whole Year now next ensuing (And you shall well and truly serve do and execute all and all manner of Precepts, Warrants, and Commandments to you or either of you to be lawfully given and directed touching or concerning any Matter, Cause or Process to be moved or depending in the King's Majesty's Courts to be holden in this Town according to the Liberty thereof (And shall make due Returns and Answers thereunto, and make Certificate thereof according to the Effect of such Precepts, Warrants, and Commandments, taking therefore your Ordinary fees and none other; And also You shall diligently give Attendance unto the Mayor, Bailiffs, and Burgeses of this Town, and wait on them as hath been accustomed and as you ought to do, and their Commandments, and Messages to do and say and not alter the same so that it may be prejudicial or hurtful unto the said Mayor, Bailiffs, and Burgeses, or any Other whatsoever. And likewise you shall give Attendance and be aiding and assisting unto the Constables of this Town and Liberties thereof, in any thing that they or either of them shall reasonably and lawfully command or will you to do for the preservation of His Majesty's Peace within the Liberties of Wexford, and You or either of You shall diligently and truly do all Other things appertaining to your said Office to the uttermost of your Power. ——— So help you God. ———

The Oath of the Water Bailiff.

A.B. You shall swear that you well and truly shall serve his Highness Our Sovereign Lord the King, the Mayor, Bailiffs, and Burgeses of this Town in the Office of Water Bailiff, and as Water Bailiff of this Town and Borough for and during the space of One Year now next coming, and You shall well and truly serve do & execute or cause to be executed all and all manner of Precepts, Warrants, and Commandments to you to be lawfully given and directed touching or concerning any Matter, Cause or Process to be moved, had or depending in the King's Majesty's Court to be holden within this Town and Borough according to the Liberty & Jurisdiction thereof as was accustomed, and shall make due Return, and Answers thereunto, and make true Certificate thereof according to the Effect of such Precepts, Process, Warrants, and Commandments, taking therefore your Ordinary due fees and none other. And also You shall diligently give Attendance unto the Mayor, and wait on him as hath been accustomed, and as you ought to do, and his Commandments, and Messages, truly to do and say and not alter the same so that it be prejudicial and hurtful unto the said Mayor or any Others. And likewise You shall give Attendance and be aiding and assisting unto the Officers of this Town for the preservation of the Peace (And you shall diligently and truly do all other things appertaining to your said Office for the accomplishment thereof to the uttermost of your Power. ——— So help you God. ———

The Oath of a Burgess.

A.B. You shall swear that you well and truly shall serve our Sovereign Lord the King his Heirs and Successors, the Mayor, Burgesses, Bayliffs, and Inhabitants of this Town and Borough of Wexford as one of the Burgesses of this Town and Borough aforesaid, and shall administer Equal Justice to the Poor and Rich after the best of your Learning, Wit, and Power, And also shall well and truly perform fulfill and keep all such good Orders, Rules, and Compositions, as are or shall be made, Ordered, Agreed upon, and Established by the Common Council of this Town and Borough for the good Government thereof in all things Appertaining: And you shall not utter or disclose any Council or Secret Thing or Matter touching the Fraternity or Fellowship of the Corporation of this Town and Borough aforesaid whereby any prejudice, Lye, Hindrance, or Slander shall or may arise, grow, or be to the same Corporation, but you shall in all things belonging to the Fraternity, and Fellowship of the Corporation of this Town and Borough aforesaid, faithfully, discreetly, honestly, and indifferently behave yourself for the most Benefit Honour, Welfare, and Credit of this Town and Borough and the Inhabitants thereof. — So help you God.

The Oath of a Freeman.

A.B. You shall swear that you shall be a true liege Man, and true faith and truth bear to our Sovereign Lord the King his Heirs, and Lawfull Successors, and to the Government thereof as the same is now Established, and your Power shall Aid and Assist the Mayor, Bayliffs, and Burgesses, and other Officers of this Town and Borough for the time being, and to them shall be Obedient and Attendant, touching and Concerning such Matters and things, as they or any of them shall lawfully and reasonably Will, and Command you to do. You shall also well and truly Observe, perform, fulfill and keep all such Orders and Rules as now and hereafter shall lawfully and reasonably be made, and Established by the Mayor, Bayliffs, and Burgesses, and the Common Council of this Town and Borough for the good Government thereof, and also their Secrets you shall well and faithfully keep in all Things to you appertaining. You shall also give, yield, & be contributory to and with the Inhabitants of the Corporation of this Town and Borough, so far forth as you Ought, and shall be Chargeably and Charged to do, And you shall not by Colour of your freedom in any manner or way bear out or Cover under you any foreign Person, Foreigner, or Stranger, nor any of his or their Goods or Merchandizes to the Hindrance of this Town and Corporation, but according to the best of your Skill, Wit, Learning, and Power, you shall uphold and maintain all and singular the Liberties, and Franchises, Privileges, good Customs, Orders, Rules, and Charges of this Town and Borough, and Corporation for the Benefit Advantage, and Credit thereof. — So help you God.

Sutton Merchant, being Part and parcel of the Common of Wexford Situate between the Fair Glace and Arnoch Stream, for the Term of Nine Hundred and Ninety Nine years to commence from this day at the yearly Rent of three Pounds Ten Shillings Sterling, he Paying a fine of Ten Pounds to the Corporation on the Execution of Leases, which are hereby ordered to be made & accordingly

WHEREAS there is an Order on the Corporation Books that One Hundred pounds p Annum shall be paid out of the Tolls & Customs for the Building of a Market House, and it being found, by the Tolls fallen, that so much cannot be paid. Resolved that the Tolls be Appropriated in the following Manner: That the Mayor shall Out of the Tolls & Customs, if he shall execute the Office himself, have Twenty Two Guineas p Annum exclusive of all Expenses.

Resolved that if the Mayor shall have a Deputy, that the Deputy shall have Fifty Two Guineas p Annum out of the said Twenty Two Guineas, and that the Tolls & Customs shall (after Paying all the other necessary Expenses which shall be Ascertained by the Mayor Bailiffs for the Time being and Resident Burgesses and Lodged with the Treasurer) hand over the residue to the Treasurer to Pay off the Debt of the Corporation, and after that to be appointed for the benefit of the Town as the Corporation shall appoint on each Twenty Ninth day of September.

It having been found that the Streets have not been kept sufficiently clean, and that by the Present mode of letting the Dung, that they can not be kept so. Resolved that the Corporation shall be empowered to give the Dung
