We find that a Balance of £73 a 17 p appears to be the amount of moneys due by the Several Tenants of the Corporation Estate to and for the 25th day of March 1797, which when paid, there will be a Balance in the Treasury of £42 a 0 p.

We find that the said Balances to each £32. 13. 0 p - £16. 16. 0 p and £165 a 5 p reported to be due from John Fox, Bostochie Jacob Glynn, Garrison Read &c were with Vouchers and Cash Paid according to an Order of Assembly of the 30th of June 1794, into the hands of Doctor Jacob and we find on Examining his Accounts, Vouchers for the expenditure of the said sum of Balances

We find that the Volls for the year 1793 - 4 - In Ladys Mayoralty set for the sum of £635 Sterling and that the Expenditures in that year did not appear by Vouchers amounted to the sum of £600. 17. 6, which left a Balance in favour of the Corporation of £34 a 2 p.

We find that in the years 1794 - 5 - The Volls set for £600, in the Mayoralty of the late William Headon Esq. and that the Expenditures in that year, as per Account to Vouchers amounted to £506. 13. 9 leaving a Balance to be accounted for of £93 a 6. 9 p.

We find that in the year 1795-6 - The Total Debt £9050 0 0 being the Mayoralty of Lord Loftus and that £452 10 0 of that sum was paid into the hands of Doctor Jacob and that he expended as his account £488 10 0, That thereby a Balance became due to him of £36 0 0, from which Doctoring £34 2 6 - a Balance due by him in the Mayoralty of Lady, leaves a Balance now due to him of £2 6 6.

We also find that Two Bonds of Ambrose Hughes Esq: to the amount of £452 10 0 - are now in Doctor Jacobs Possession - agst which Ambrose & Hughes has an Account, which at present the Committee cannot ascertain as his son, who has the ^{now} Vouchers is in England.

We find that the certain Annual Expenses of the Corporation amounts to £270 11 6 and that the Probable Contingent Expenses amount to about £200, making in the whole, the annual sum of £470 11 6.

We have examined the several Leases from the Corporation in the hands of the Town Clerk and we conceive that no accurate Report can be made until such time as a correct Survey of the Lands shall be made, which we recommend shall forthwith be done.

At said Assembly the Mayor declared the Revd John Reade & Wm Daniel Agst 6th of Westford his New peculiar Freemen and they were sworn accordingly.
