Sir

The momentous Question of a legislative Union between Great Britain and Ireland has been so generally and so profoundly investigated that in our conception no New Argument can now be adduced on that Subject, the Information we have received from such a Variety of Discussions satisfactorily confirms the Opinion we had early entertained that the Measure was indispensably necessary to Tranquillize this Kingdom, To extend its Commerce and to elevate it to a more dignified Situation by giving it in every Imperial Concern a weight proportioned to its Population and to its Riches We Therefore earnestly entreat, if the Subject should again be recommended by our Gracious Sovereign to the Irish Parliament you will use your utmost exertions to have it carried into immediate Execution on Terms impartially liberal and honourable to an Interruption of that Communication, which previous to the last Session of Parliament had constantly subsisted between you and us, An Interruption which arose from the unhappy Distractions of the Country we implore that in the single Instance of the Question of Union you vote in Parliament did not accord with our wishes, we yet hope that the Enquiries which you have no doubt made on a Measure of such Magnitude and Importance, have so satisfied your Conscience on the Necessity of it that the Request we here make will lay no unpleasant restraint upon you, During a Series of many years you have been our faithful Representative and you have done Honour to our Choice of you, by evincing an unshaken Loyalty to our Beneficent King, a zealous Attachment to our glorious Constitution and in using your best efforts to promote the Prosperity of this Kingdom, Receive our grateful thanks and rest assured of our most affectionate Attachment.

Resolved Unanimously that James Boyd Esq. whose Seat in Parliament we now deem vacated by his Absence from the Poll in Wexford, be Re-elected with Zeal & Fidelity for which we hereby return our sincere and hearty thanks, we also take this Opportunity of expressing

Our decided Approbation of his Conduct both as a Magistrate of the County of Wexford, and as a Captain of the Yeomanry Corps of Wexford Cavalry in each Situation of which he has been Unremittingly Active and Spirited.

A Jury having been sworn to try the Right of Luke Whitney and John Reilly Petitioners for their Freedom in Right of Apprenticeship the said Jury found they were Entitled to their Freedom & they were sworn accordingly.

Resolved That the Mayor do Issue a Proclamation against Foustalling &c. and do Offer a Reward of One Guinea to every or any Person who shall give Usefull Information & any Expense that the Mayor be Out to in the Prosecution or Defence of any such Commeny on that Account shall be defrayed by the Corporation.
