on Behalf of the Corporation of the Town of
Wexford

The Town of Wexford in the year 1816 petitioned the Crown for a Charter for Incorporation of their Town under the 3^d and 4th Vict Cap 12, which being granted, a Mayor, Aldermen and Town Councillors were regularly appointed thereunder, and the Corporation embodied and have been since acting.

On the 24th of February 1852 Mr Isaac Ganeck wrote a Letter to Mr Benjamin Vicary the Town Clerk of the said Corporation presenting his Claim to be admitted as a Freeman of the Town of Wexford, and stating he based his Claim to his freedom as the eldest son of a Freeman of 60 years Standing, to which he stated he believed he was entitled, and requesting of Mr Vicary to bring forward his Case at the next meeting of the Town Corporation.

See Copy of Mr Ganeck's Letter sent herewith

It is believed Mr Isaac Ganeck bases his Claim to his freedom of the Town of Wexford on the Act of the 2^d and 3^d of William the 4th Cap 18 see I and on the Act of 3^d and 4th Vict Cap 108 sect 7, 8 and 9.

Since Mr Ganeck has made his Claim to be admitted as a Freeman of the Town of Wexford, on the grounds of being the eldest son of a Freeman of Sixty years Standing, the Books of the Proceedings of the Old Corporation from the year 1790, (the said Books being destroyed in the year 1798), and also the Books of the present Corporation having been examined by Mr Vicary the Town Clerk to see if there was any Custom or Precedent, to entitle the eldest son of Freeman to claim their Freedom as a matter of Right, from the Corporation but there does not appear to be any entry on those Books of any person having ever been admitted as a Freeman on the Grounds put forward by Mr Ganeck nor do the Inhabitants of the

the Town know of such a Custom having ever prevailed in the Old Corporation.

The present Council of the Corporation are desirous of getting the advice of Counsel to know if Mr' Cooneck, is entitled to claim his Freedom of the Town of Wexford from them on the grounds put forward in his letter to Mr' Benjamin Hickey Esq^r and Counsel is sent herewith a Copy of the Charter of 7th January the 1st under which the Old Corporation of Wexford was embodied,

Counsel will please Advise if Mr' Isaac Cooneck is entitled to claim his Freedom of the Town of Wexford from the Council of the present Corporation, on the grounds put forward by him viz^t He being the eldest Son of a Freeman of Sixty Years Standing

If Counsel doth of Opinion that Mr' Isaac Cooneck is entitled to his Freedom of the Town of Wexford. He will please state on what grounds and under what Act of Parliament, he is so entitled, and the Stamp Duty to be payable by him on such his Admission to his Freedom.

Copy, Opinion of, Henry O'Hara Esq

In My Opinion Mr' Cooneck is not entitled to be admitted a Freeman of the Borough of Wexford in right of his being the Eldest son of a Freeman.

The Charter of Janv^r the 1st was, and so far as the Rights of Freeman are Concerned, None is the Governing Charter of the Corporation, that Charter Directs the Corporation to be Constituted of a Mayor, two Bailliffs, twenty one Free Burgess, and all other Freeman Sojourners in or within said Town a Borough. But it does not declare what shall be the Qualification to entitle a person to his Freedom, the Right to the Freedom is therefore dependent on the particular Custom of the Borough. It would appear that Persons were admitted

the Freedom of the Borough in two ways, one by nomination of the Mayor, who during his year of Office had the right to appoint two Special Freemen. And the other by virtue of the Party claiming the Freedom having served his apprenticeship to a Freeman, in addition thereto New Freemen admitted in pursuance of the 14th and 15th Cap 2 and the New Rules of 1672 whereby Foreigners, Strangers and Aliens as well others, as Protestants who were or should be Merchants, Traders, Officers, Seamen & should come to reside in the Town should be admitted Freemen, on complying with the Conditions imposed by the Statute and New Rules. But it does not anywhere appear by the Statute or those rules, that the right or Benefit of a Freeman were made descendible to the sons of such persons. By the Evidence before the House of Commons, the decision of the Election Committee, the Speaker's Letter dated the 15th March 1830 sent to the Mayor of Wexford, and also the Report of the Municipal Commissioners in 1835. It seems to me that the only right or heritable title to admission as a Freeman of Wexford is either by virtue of the person having served Seven years apprenticeship to a Freeman, or by a person having brought himself within the provisions of the 14th and 15th Cap 2 and the new rules of 1672. The Provisions of the Reform Act 2^d and 3^d & 4th Cap 38 and the Municipal Act 3^d and 4th Vict Cap 113 do not in my opinion in any manner enlarge those rights or titles. These Acts only preserve to Freemen the Parliamentary Franchise and the Benefit of certain Charitable funds and Institutions where such Freemen were or should be entitled to their Freedom by Birth, Marriage, or Servitude to the exclusion of all Peculiar or Honorary Freemen. But still saving the right of persons claiming the Benefit of Freedom either by Birth or Marriage or Servitude to be regulated by the Statute, Charter, or Custom which Conferred the Franchise in each Separate Borough.
