The following letter from the Rev^d. Mr. Vicary to the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wexford, with reference to the Town Clerk's Salary being restored to its original position and also that the sum of £26:10. be refunded to Mr. Vicary - having been read -

To the worshipful the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wexford.

Gentlemen - I venture to bring before you the position in which my brother Mr. Vicary is placed, assured that you will take those circumstances into consideration.

Mr. Vicary in early life to a great extent gave up his professional business for the duties of Town Clerk, with the well-grounded hope that its emoluments would be continued uninterrupted in advanced life. His father and himself having discharged the duties of the office for a great number of years - and the former having contributed largely by his professional and local knowledge (the latter of which he peculiarly possessed) to increasing the income of the Corporation. Many of the early leases being broken, and the income greatly increased by his means.

Mr. B. Vicary's means of living being almost exclusively what he derives from the Corporation; he feels most painfully at his advanced period of life and with failing health the deprivation of the large sum of £26.10 of which he was deprived about a year ago - an amount equal to what he is allowed for the laborious and responsible duties of preparing completely the parliamentary lists of the Borough - Duties which occupy several months of unremitting application. The salary of the lowest of any Corporation in Ireland.

Mr. Vicary would respectfully remind the Council of the high price of the necessaries of life, and the probability of their advancing rather than declining; making it in fact difficult not to live respectably, but to live at all.

Mr. Vicary would also remind the Council that their income is at present almost entirely free from debt, and in a short time his understandings will be entirely free.

He trusts therefore - that under these circumstances

with claims hereditary and personal, by reason of the
 grave and responsible duties appertaining to the Office,
 the enhanced price of the necessaries of life, his
 failing health and years, and from the unencumbered
 position in which the finances of the Corporation are
 at present. That the Mayor and Council


