Arrangements made to carry into operation the recent Vaccination Act

The Board having made arrangements for carrying into effect the provisions of an "Act" passed in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty, "to extend the practice of Vaccination," took into consideration the general terms of the Contracts to be entered into with the Medical Officers of the Union, and other competent Medical Practitioners who may be willing to contract for the Vaccination of all persons resident in the Union, and they are of opinion that the terms of such Contracts should be as is set forth in the following form (Poor Law Commissioners form dated 5th September 1840)

The sum of Eight pence the motion of Mr O'Haberty seconded for each case up to 200 by Mr White. It was resolved that the sum of four pence for each case of remuneration to be paid to each beyond that number the Vaccinators in this Union shall be as offered by the Board according to the scale recommended by the Poor Law Commissioners, namely one shilling for each case of successful Vaccination when the number shall not exceed Two Hundred, and six pence for each case beyond that number. The Clerk read letters from the Poor Law Commiss^r, confirming the appointment of Mess^{rs} Michael Doran, Moss Doyle, Darby Nolan and Mich^l Warren the collectors of the Poor Rates of the Union, and from the Commissioners Architect, Geo^g Wilkinson certifying that the furniture as contracted for by Anthony Doyle, was delivered at the workhouse and that the same was inspected and approved of by the Clerk of works.

The Chairman assisted by the Commission took down the votes as they were tendered for Doctors Plourke and Craufield respectively when there appeared for the election of Doctor Craufield Twenty One and for the election of Doctor Plourke Nineteen votes, on which the Chairman declared Dr. Craufield duly elected as Medical attendant to the Union Workhouse.

Applications for the situation of Clerk to the Workhouse were read from Mr. Mathew Murphy and Mr. Wm. Hutchinson, who were called in and examined as to their qualifications.

It was proposed by Mr. Macalister and seconded by Mr. Rickard that Mr. Mathew Murphy be appointed to fill that situation.

It was proposed by Mr. Walsh and seconded by Mr. Corcoran,

that Mr. Wm. Hutchinson be appointed to fill that situation and on summing up the number of votes there appeared for Mr. Mathew Murphy Twenty Seven and for Mr. Wm. Hutchinson six votes whereupon the Chairman declared Mr. Mathew Murphy to be duly elected as Clerk to the Union Workhouse.

Applications to fill the situation of Matron to the Workhouse were read from Catharine Nolan and Elizabeth Bloney both of whom were called in and examined.

Mr. P. White moved which was seconded by Mr. P. Melinck that Catharine Nolan be appointed to fill that situation, which on being put from the Chair was carried unanimously.

Applications for the situation of Porter were read from Robert Ashe, B. Moriarty, George Maguire, Wm. Nelson and James Roice, after which the candidates were called in and examined.

Mr. John Corcoran proposed and The Rev. J. R. Mawhood seconded the nomination of Robert Ashe.
