I presume the question has been referred to me in Consequence of my laving being engaged in defence of the ejectment on the title brought against the fuardians by the late Mr. Hall Dare in 1863 - The only matter then in Controversey was the piece of fround in the actual accupation of the feed roises Containing about 20 perches on which stood the Fener Hospital, out offices and yard enclosed by a wall, If a right to any land outside of this he now claimed, I amonot in a position to give any information as thathe boundaries of it, or of the site originally intended by Lord Farnham for the Hospital, for this question was not involved in the issue to be true lythe ejectment, - However I learned incidently in the course of my origines that the exemptions in the ordnance survey Comprised Fever Hospital and land 1, 0, 28 statute measure, and that formerly the field upon which the Hospital stands was not let or tilled by the troprieter, but that when Mit Ashton purchased he tilled the greater portion of this field and that same afterwards continued to be and was then in the occupation of the Proprieter or his tenants, Mr. Hall Dare obtained a Verdict against the Juardians at the Summer assires 1863 which was afterwards set aside and a new trial was granted on the terms of hir Hall Dave paying the fundians the cost of the first trial - which he did, But the case was not again brought on in the lifetime of the late Mit Hall-Dare and since his death, his son, the present Mit Hallane took no steps to prosecute the action, Of course of the boundaries of the fround which the Committee consider of right belongs to the Hospital be disputed it would be most desirable to have them defined by an amicable arrangement, but any legal proceedings by the fundians to recover any portion of land which may have been originally intended for the Hospital, but is in possession of m. Hall Dare or his tenent would raise a different question and be attended with many more difficulties than defending their right to what is in their possession,

Whes therefore their long established rights which have not been questioned since 1863 be interferred with, I advise the fuardians not to involve themselves in litigation about the matter, such litigation would be very costly. Lyne Octor for Haherty
