What I have now stated to be correct regarding my first appointment under the Town Commissioners, Mr. Hymn also very fully described the extent of District which another Sub-Sanitary Officer had to travel over and the arduous to duties he would have to perform but he did not so fully describe my District although he proposed a resolutionto reduce my Salary, I will now forthe information of the Board of fuardians explain the extent and Condition of my district thereby shewing the amount of duty I will have to perform under the Julic Health act, my District meets the Wesford Union at the Fot and foose the New Moss Union at the termination of the Townland of Nathtutin 3 miles beyond Clouroche and the Carlow Union at mount Leasters This District atonquitto including a large Stretch of Country also includes Seven Villages, namely, Clouroche, Kellamo, Kilterly, Caim, Bree, Tedgate and Oylegate, also the town of tomiscothy the estent & population being one of the largest in any rural Sanitary District in Seland Containing 17 lodging houses and 11 Slaughter houses to be inspected and reported on with all other premises, The Salary first fixed by the Juardians Was \$ 25 a year or about 1/5 per day for my district which I have endeavoured to describe, Mr Hym moved to have the £25 reduced to \$ 10 a year or about 6/2 perday and mi Before now intends to move that the Talary for me lenderthe Gullic Health Act be fired at I Bayear or about \$10 aday, I have in the foregoing explained What I Consider Called for in Connection with the Subject, I now respectfully ask the fundians to read and judge for themselves and in Conclusion I must add I would Prot trouble the Board with this letter had het Hymn been Correct when he undertook to explain to the francians the Conditions of my late employment

under the Town Commissioners and also if had to have fiven as fell a disoription of my District as he did about others.
