Gentlemen,—The following is a statement of the facts of the case to which Mr. Denis Lawler's letter of Thursday To the Chairman, Board of Guardians, Euniscorthy Union.

Newtownbarry, Sept., 19th, 1877.

Gentlemen,—On the 9th instant, I issaed a visiting ticket for a young man named Devereux, (now dead), who had taken suddenly ill. Made enquiries before doing so, and teumed that his father held only 4 acres of land. As it appears the Doctor refused to act on it, and two days afterwards brought it back, and from what he said, asked me to destroy it, which I did. In the absence of an enquiry, as to whether the ticket should be given or not, I beg to tender my resignation as a Member of the Newtownbarry Committee. of the case to which Mr. Denis Lawler's letter of Thursday last refers:

On Sunday evening, the 9th of this menth, a ticket, signed by Mr. Lawler, was presented to me to attend the son of a man named Devereux who, although holding only 4 or 5 acres of land, is generally believed to be in comfortable circumstances, and to have some spare money. I learned at the time, that two messengers were sent—one to the town to see if a ticket could be got, and another with a fee, in case of failure to get the ticket. The ability to pay being thus proved, I remonstrated against their trying for a ticket, but as it was got I attended on it within two hours. After the attendance, Devereux, knowing that I was aware of his having sent the money, paid me a nominal fee. I am, sir, your obedient servant, DENIS LAWLER. nominal fee.

On Mouday I went to Mr. Lawler, who after hearing the circumstances, at, once withdrew the ticket. On that evening I had a message from the patient, who appeared to be going on favourably under the treatment adopted, and renewed his needleine. On Tuesday morning, Devereux came to me, saying that his son had got worse during the uight. From what he mentioned, I believed that an operation might be required, and as the necessary appliances and assistance were not at band here, I urged him to lose no time in sending him to the Infirmary in Enniscorthy. I also gave him a note for the Master, asking him to admit the case, and to send for Dr. Furlong without delay. Late in the alternoon, when I thought the man had long since arrived at the Infirmary, I got a telegram informing me that Dr. Drapes, who was of course paid for his attendance, would be with me at 7 o'clock to see the case. We visited, and did the best we could for the patient, but without succeeding in our endeavours as he died the following night.

It was protested against but acted on, and the attendance was continued after its withdrawal, though I take it for granted that the Issner would not withdraw the ticket on my representation, if he did not think himself warranted in doing so. In conclusion, I beg leave to say that I think I would not be doing my duty, as an Officer of the Board, if I allowed, what appeared to me to be an imposition on a public charity, to pass without taking some measures to prevent it. To have the ticket cancelled a month atterwards would be of very little use for this purpose, and I adopted the only means which appeared likely to effect it—acquainted the issuer of the ticket with my reasons for thinking the person not entitled to Medical Relief at the expense of the Union, and it was then for him to withdraw the ticket or not as he thought fit.


