I beg to state that I attended at Oulart Fever Hospital on Friday last for the purpose of taking Stock of Clothing &c. &c. in that Establishment; which I found correct and in good order and the Hospital particularly clean. The Chimneys require to be swept very badly. as the nurse cannot light the fires and the Labels are falling off the medicine bottles owing to the dampness of the House. The Yard and walk require to be cleaned up as the grass has grown up to the very door.

I also attended at Newtownbarry Fever Hospital on Saturday last for the purpose of taking stock of Clothing &c. &c. in that Establishment which I found correct and well cared; but the Hospital is in a bad state, the walls are split and appears to be separating from each other as also from the loft and would require two or three iron ties placed in the walls in order to keep them from falling.

The Dashing outside has completely fallen off with the exception of that on the east side, so that the rain water oozes through the walls and will cause the plastering inside to fall off.

The Nurse told me that the Hospital was not whitewashed for the last five years, the Yards require to be cleaned up and gravelled and a few panes of glass in the windows.

I consider weather slating the best means of securing the walls, and cheapest in the end particularly as the materials are so convenient to Newtownbarry.
