Dr. report -

As I presume it is only that portion of Captain Hamilton's report that relates to the proposed changes in the hospital department that has been referred to me I shall deal with it alone. I quite concur with his suggestion that the cells in the idiot departments should be removed, retaining one at each side of the house for the temporary isolation of refractory patients. With regard to the Fever Hospital, I find it quite impossible to do justice to the different classes of patients owing to the want of a suitable probation ward. And I may remark that it is not quite in accordance with our present views of sanitary science to have the Dispensaries of No. 1 and No. 2 districts under the same roof and communicating by doors with the Fever Hospital. Three days each week crowds of people coming up there incur the risk of taking any contagious disease that may happen to be under treatment. I would therefore suggest that a more suitable place be provided for the Dispensaries, and the present one could then be turned into a probation ward. I should have mentioned that the bath-rooms should be enlarged by one and a half feet and be very useful.
