that Mr. John Maguire, Schoolmaster, be granted by this Board a Superannuation Allowance during his life, at the rate of not exceeding two-thirds of the amount of his present yearly salary as Schoolmaster—payable out of the Consolidated Fund—on the grounds that for over twenty years past Mr. Maguire has faithfully discharged his duties, and his resignation at an advanced age leaves him without adequate means of future livelihood.


