The following was read from the Clerk of Works:—GENTLEMEN—I beg leave to lay the following report before you for your consideration. The three houses in Ballyhogue are finished and occupied. In Ballyhuskard three houses are finished, if they meet the approval of the committee appointed to inspect them by the board. In Ballyvaldon two houses are nearly completed. I must remark that the construction and workmanship of those houses are of a superior quality, and far exceeds what is required by the plan and specification, which, I think is creditable to the contractor, Mr. T. Dempsey. In Boleboy three houses, two of which are nearly completed. Mr. N. Fortune is the contractor. I must also remark that the workmanship on those houses is of a superior quality, and will compare favourably with any other houses in the Union.
