In reply to your communication relative to the mode of proceeding taken by me regarding the recovery of the poor rate from certain defaulting ratepayers in my district, I wish to lay before you the following statement:—On former occasions I always summoned the above to Clonroche Petty Sessions until the magistrates decided that the constabulary were not to execute the decrees for poor rate or county cess, although the constabulary had done so for several years previous, and until the appointment of Mr. Nolan, the present Petty Sessions Clerk. By this mode of collection very little expense was placed on the ratepayers (whose interests I have at heart as much as any member of the board). I have always treated the ratepayers with prudence and moderation until the time arrived that I should close my collection. I may now tell you the reason why I brought some parties before the County Court Judge:—(1.) Some parties said that having paid me the poor rate I should sue them for it before they would pay it again. (2.) Having called (in some instances over ten times), and the parties promising each time to pay me, I consider—after due notice and warning them—that the course or means I have adopted was neither arbitrary or harsh. It is no expense to the board and it has given me a great deal of annoyance and trouble. The course I have taken is similar to that for all legal debts due either to a shopkeeper or trader. The reason I did not bring the bailiffs to seize under my own warrant is, as you are all, I am sure, aware, that even the sight of the bailiffs on a poor persons holding, at the present time, is enough to cause such excitement as to warrant a breach of the law and commit deeds which he would not otherwise think of doing. I had on one occasion the experience of this tyrannical ordeal, but would not wish to have to do it again. I therefore respectfully request the guardians to lay down some certain course for the collectors to follow, as it appears at present it will not do to collect the rates by legal means or to leave them uncollected.—Yours,

PROSECUTION OF MESSRS. W. O'BRIEN, M.P.; E. WALSH, "THE PEOPLE," AND MR. WILFRID BLUNT.
It was proposed by Mr. A. Harpur, seconded by Mr. J. Hennessy, and passed:—
That we condemn in the strongest manner the action of the Government in sentencing Mr. William O'Brien to three months' imprisonment for seeking the rights of the oppressed tenant-farmers of Ireland at this depressed season. We beg to tender him our heartfelt sympathy in his prison cell, and promise to uphold the principles advocated by him.
The following resolution, proposed by Mr. M. Kearns, seconded by Mr. J. Cummins, was adopted:—
That we congratulate Mr. Edward Walsh, Proprietor of the Wexford PEOPLE, at being the first victim under Balfour's brutal code; and while we admire his attitude in upholding liberty of speech and the freedom of The Press, we assure him that whatever may be the results, he will ever have the sympathy of every Nationalist of this Union in his struggle against tyranny.

That this Board views with horror and shame the inhuman treatment of Mr. Wilfrid Blunt and his charitable wife, the Hon. Lady Anne Blunt, at Woodford by the present miserable and barbarous Government through its responsible officials, and directs the attention of the civilized world to the fact that such an outrage, especially on ladies, deserves the condemnation of every man and woman who is not an inhuman monster.

Sir—My attention has been drawn to an explanation of your collecto. Mr. Somers, in which he excuses himself at the expense of the magistrates at Clonroche and their present clerk for having gone into the County Court to obtain decrees against defaulting ratepayers. May I ask Mr. Somers why he ordered seventeen summonses against parties for county cess, and obtained decrees where debt was proved, and which came before the Clonroche Bench on the 7th of last month—October—if the court was objectionable to him. After Mr. Somers had left the order for the above summonses, he met me and said, "I left an order for summonses in your office. I have others for rates, but I will process them." I remarked to him that would be an expensive way to collect the rates. His reply was, "Oh, Mr. Carr's brother is an attorney; it will cost me nothing." Notwithstanding he parenthetically says, "I have at heart the interests of the ratepayers as much as any member of the board," and, further on, "which I treat with prudence and moderation," and has the cool courage to assert inferentially that it was the action of the magistrates at Clonroche and their present clerk who drove him into the County Court in the face of the foregoing facts.

In consequence of the marked prevalence of erysipelas in the district, and in view of the danger of its becoming an epidemic, as it threatens to diffuse itself widely, I would suggest the advisability of the inhabitants being made aware of its highly contagious nature, as they seem quite ignorant of the fact, and so have been unsuspectingly spreading it from house to house. I have in every instance warned the occupants of infected habitations, but as I am only called in when the fever has unmistakably declared itself, or rather when some complications such as pneumonia baffles the efforts of self-constituted doctors, the warning comes too late. I have distinctly traced the dissemination of erysipelas to three houses, through persons not cleansing their hands and changing their clothes after being in attendance on patients suffering from that disease.

Explaining the reason why he had not summoned Mr. Linnott to meetings of the @Y Co. as read in Mr. Linnott's letter on last Board Day as to non receipt of notices of meetings of @Y Co.

I wish to remark that Mr. Moffat's negligent attendance in the past would warrant me in considering a notice to him as useless. In referring to the minutes I find that the last time he attended our meetings was 27th November, 1885. A meeting was convened by the Clerk of the union on 4th May, 1886. On 12th October, 1886, a special meeting was called by me, and for which I sent him notice; on May 3rd, 1887 the Clerk of the union called a meeting. At all these he made himself conspicuous by his absence. He never attended since November 1885. It is true I sent him no notice last special meeting as no primary or fast-binding resolution was adopted. The object of meeting was to obtain a site for the erection of a doctor's residence to a place more central than where the present doctor resided, under the consideration. I believe I have full power to summon the meeting, nearest

representatives to attend such meeting, and as Mr. Blacker kindly consented to give a lease, provided the consent of the tenant was obtained, I did not deem it necessary to call a meeting, beyond a slight consultation with a few who reside near me. Another reason why it need not be looked as of much importance is: the doctor will pay the yearly instalments, and the undertaking will then be of no injury to the ratepayers, who Mr. Moffat and his party devote their time and interest to, while it will, after some time prove a great boon to the ratepayers of the district, who myself and supposed brother unrecognised representatives attend. On all future occasions we will be happy to give Mr. Moffat a chance of improving his zeal in participating in that noble work, the improvement of medical relief of the poor, and urgently expect his attendance in future.

GENTLEMEN—In reply to Mr. Nolan's letter regarding the mode of collection of poor rates and county cess adopted by me in my district, I beg to reiterate every remark in my former letter, and I wish to point out the evasion of Mr. Nolan in not even mentioning the instructions given to him by the magistrates as regards the constabulary executing decrees obtained for poor rates and county cess. But Mr. Nolan made himself special by pointing out to the magistrates that it was the collector should execute the warrants and not the constabulary, although the latter always did so prior to the appointment of the now officious petty sessions clerk. Mr. Nolan wishes to know why I sent the order for 17 summonses to his office; let me tell him that I was ordered to do so by Mr. Carr. I also tell Mr. Nolan that I have no objection to the court in Clonroche, but I have to the charge that is made in the law at Mr. Nolan's request. I give the most emphatic denial to the statement of Mr. Nolan as to the conversation of my consultation with Mr. Carr for the recovery of poor rate, as he (Mr. Carr) had nothing whatever to do with it. Mr. Nolan did ask me if I served six days notice on each of the 17 parties that I was going to summon. I said that I had but there were others that I had not served, but that Mr. Carr would process them (and I may state that he did so). Now, you see whether Mr. Nolan's statement is correct or not. Our conversation was confined to county cess, and there was nothing about poor rate. In conclusion I beg to say I'll be directed by the Board in future, any rules or regulations they may lay down I will carry them out to the best of my ability and knowledge.

DR. GREENE'S REPORT.

Dr. Greene wrote, in reply to the Local Government Board, relative to the prevalence of erysipelas in the Ferns district. He regretted to state that since his last report no less than four deaths had resulted from that disease. He was glad to say that the epidemic now showed signs of abatement, no fresh cases having come under his notice for the past week. He believed the original cases were in part due to climatic influences, and also, to a certain extent, to unsanitary dwellings and bad water supply; but a few isolated cases having arisen sporadically, it immediately manifested its highly contagious and virulent nature by those in attendance or in its vicinity being subsequently seized with the fever, although having no abrasions of

surface. In all cases where patients could not be removed to the fever hospital, he insisted on rigid isolation and other prophylactic measures, with the result of in most instances confining the disease to those prematurely affected.
