TAKING A PATIENT'S CLOTHES

The Master reported that a woman named Kate Pender, who took her discharge from the workhouse on the 22nd, took away some clothing, the property of an inmate named Jane Ward, who was a patient in the infirmary. Pender was wardmaid, and had charge of the woman, and when the woman came in it was Pender's duty to take the clothes down to the porter and deliver them into his keeping, and he took an inventory. Pender took only a portion of the clothing and kept the rest in the infirmary until she got an opportunity to get them out of the house which she did, to pawn them. The woman told him of her loss, and he told the police of the matter, with the result that Pender was arrested and convicted. She got a week in jail.



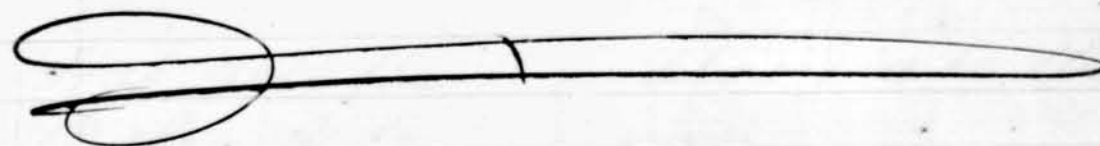
