A CARBO-PLATE is also supplied in the place of the blank board. This is made of a special grade of metal, and at the same time provides an excellent support for the carbon paper, which is held in position by a special device, and can be drawn without touching the lower leaf.

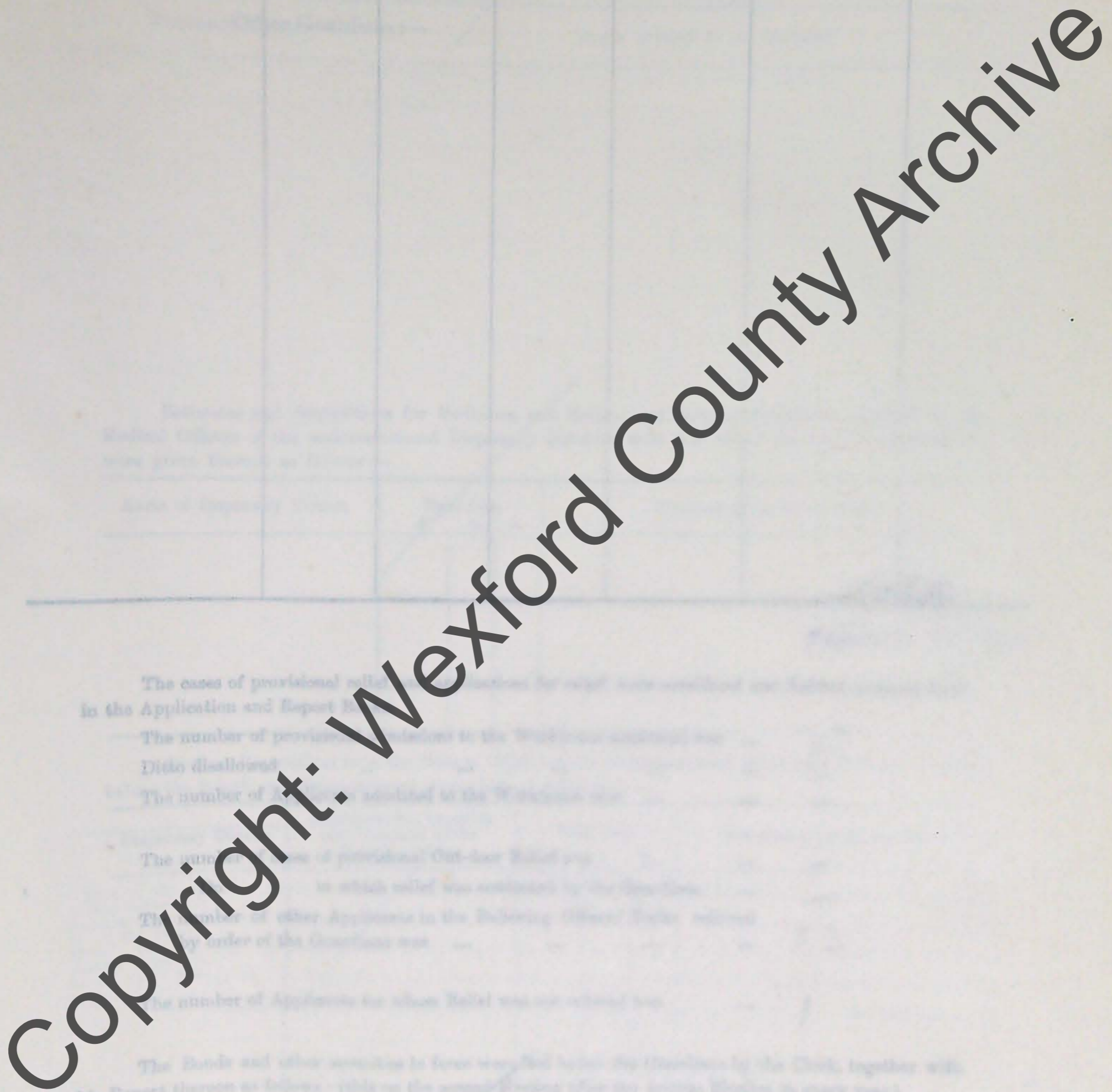

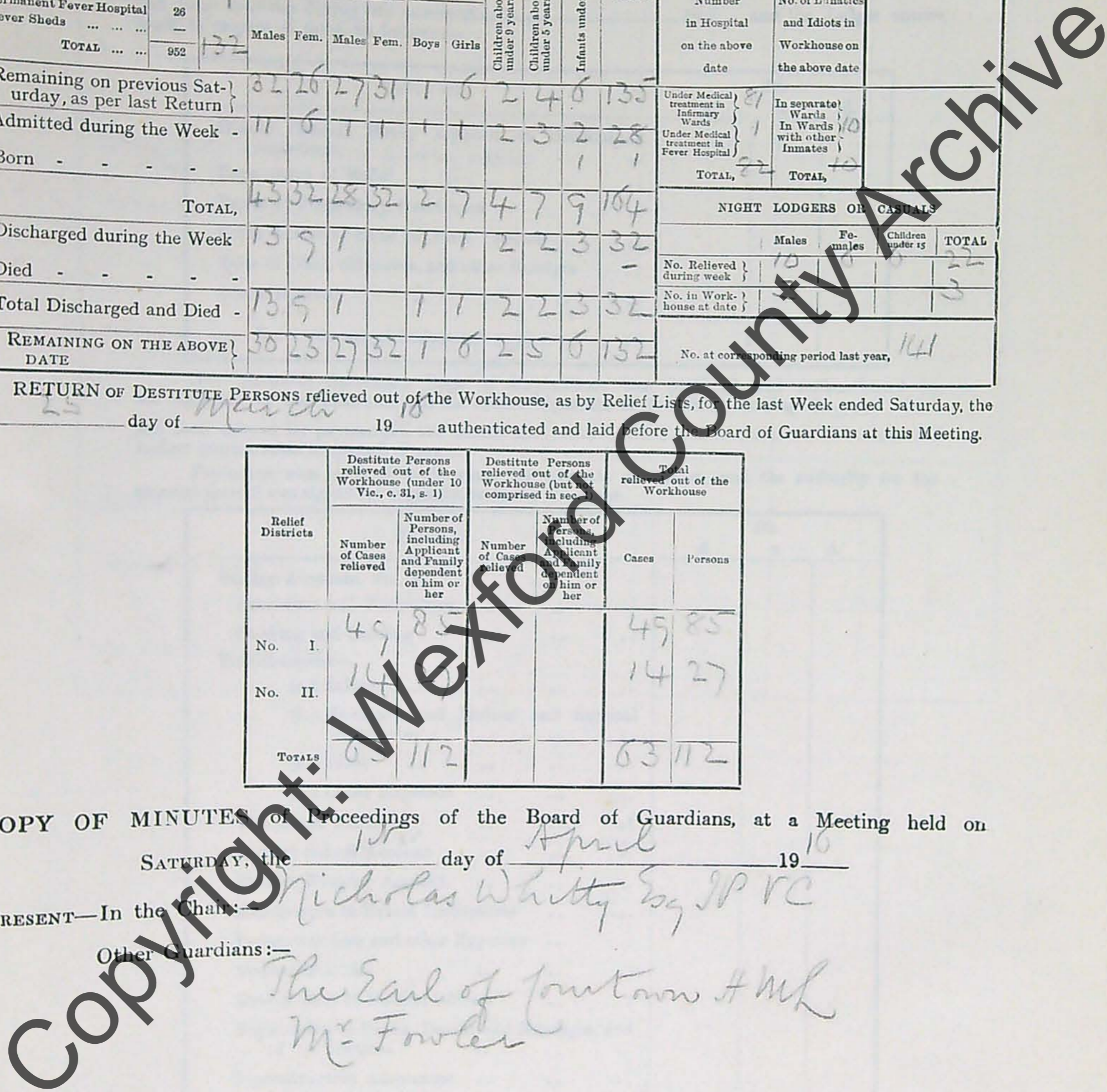

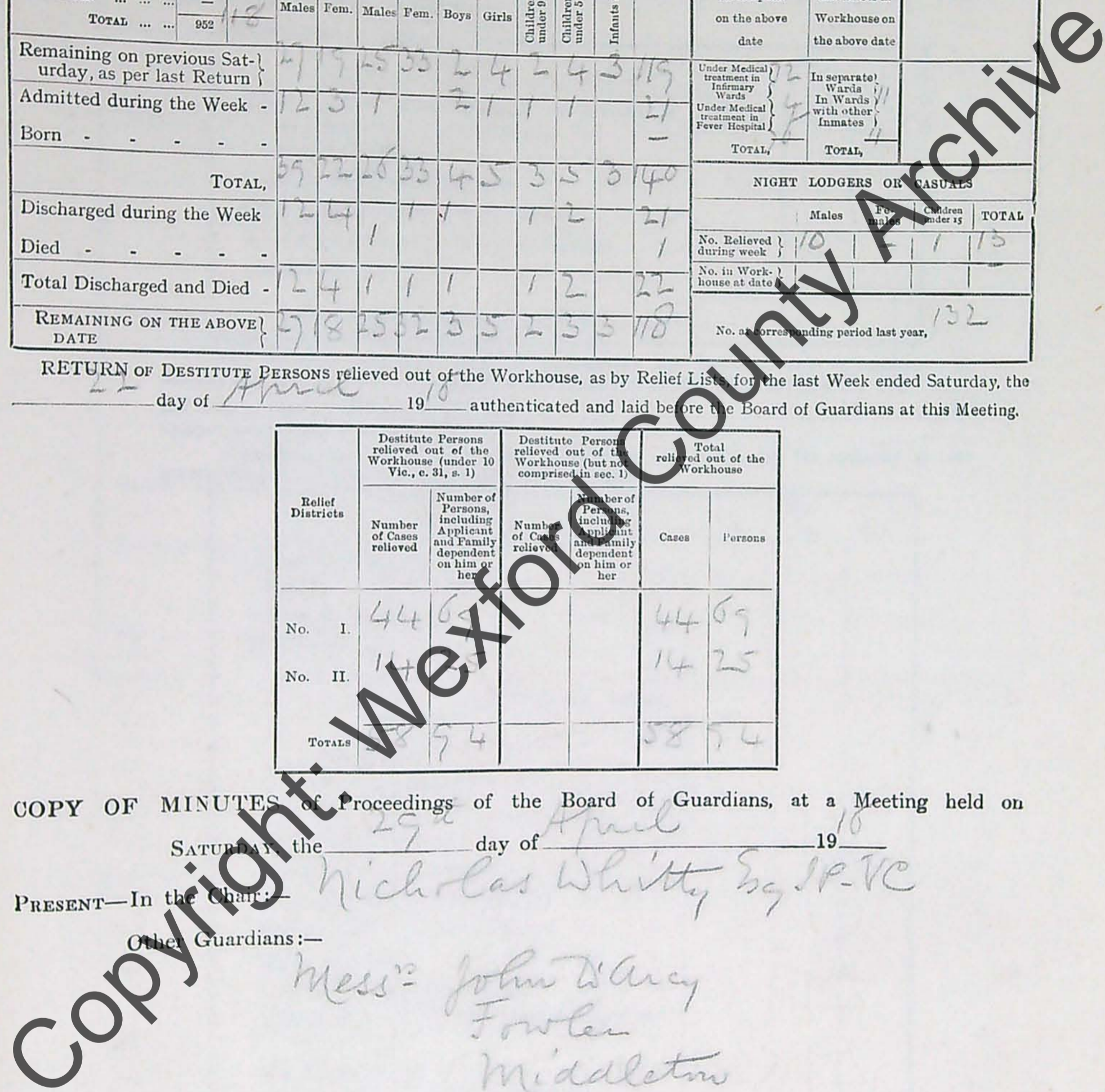
