Place a sheet of one-sided carbon paper, face downwards, between the first and second leaves, and then the sheet of black board after the Duplicate. Write upon the first leaf with a Duplicator or Manifold Slip Pen, and two copies will be the result.

In the case of a Triplicate Book, a sheet of two-sided carbon paper is placed between the 2nd and 3rd leaves, and then proceed as above.

A CARBO-PLATE can also be supplied to take the place of the black board. This is a plate which grips the carbon, and at the same time provides an extra hard plate, made of aluminium, which gives an extra clear copy, and enables the carbon paper and support to be placed in position for writing and withdrawn without touching the carbon with the hands.

The Clerk as directed last week attended Petty Sessions and applied to have the 20 Vaccination cases adjourned. The Magistrate adjourned the cases for six weeks.

Read four letters from Messrs P J O'Flaherty, Home the Vaccination prosecutions - that have been adjourned. and advising that it is provided by 1898 Victoria Cap. 56 sec 22 that the Commissioners now represented by the Local Govt. Board are empowered to accept the resignation of Guardians. This would imply that the Guardians cannot resign unless with the consent of the Local Government Board. If the Local Government Board consented to the resignation of Guardians they could of course continue to act as District Councillors. They believed therefore that the Guardians could not resign without the sanction of the Local Government Board.
