Sharpe v. Guardians

I presume the Guardians would be desirous of closing all accounts in connection with this case so I have with send you my costs of defending the action and prosecuting the Counterclaim.

These costs amount to £160-6-1 but you will observe that £82-15-3 of that sum is cash outlay paid for Counsel's fees, witnesses expenses &c. The taxed costs of the counterclaim amounted to £46-0-10 which as you are aware the Guardians have already got credit for, the amount having been deducted from Mr. Sharpe's judgment, as stated in my letter to you of 1st August last.

It is probable the Guardians will deem it more satisfactory to have these costs taxed and therefore I enclose a form of Requisition which should be sealed with the Union Seal, and signed by the Chairman and two of the Guardians at the Board meeting. If the Guardians wish to be represented by a Solicitor, the name of that gentleman should be written in the space for that purpose left in the requisition - The employment of a Solicitor to appear on these taxations is rather expensive and

and is usually productive of little advantage to the Guardians, who may prefer to dispense with such attendances. If so, they should pass a resolution to have the costs taxed and that they do not desire to be represented by a Solicitor on such taxation



4 - Where the holding approved of by the Guardians is a very small one, or is demesne land, or a home farm, or a holding on which a house has been already erected under the Labourers Acts, the Surveyor should be empowered to select a site on the most convenient farm in the immediate neighbourhood having regard to the foregoing conditions.

I duly received yours enclosing for my perusal two representations, one from Glynn Electoral Division on behalf of John Doyle, and the other from Kyle Division on behalf of Patrick Byrne - Doyle's representation appears to be all right in point of form - Byrne's representation is signed by a sufficient number of Ratepayers, but some of the signatures do not appear genuine - I wish to call the attention of the Guardians to the fact that two representations from this Division on behalf of a person named

named Pat. Byrne and in each case seeking to have a cottage built on the lands of Thos. Doyle of Innacarrig, have been already considered by the Board, and rejected. I do not know if the present applicant is the same person but it may be well to have enquiry made on the subject.

I also enclose a representation from the Division of Old Ross which was forwarded to me by Mr. James Doyle P.L.G. This representation is quite correct in point of form, but I must again refer to the fact, that as the proposed site is not on the lands where the alleged unsanitary house exists the Local Government Board will probably disapprove of the application.

With regard to Representations already approved of I desire to bring under the notice of the Guardians a few cases in the Electoral Division of Kilmokea - In two of these cases sites have been selected on the lands of Captain Barrett Hamilton. Now on looking through my notes of the Inquiry held in 1886 I find that an application was then refused on the ground that the proposed site was on a "Home Farm" of Captain Barrett Hamilton, and I fear that the same point will arise in the present cases.
