The Guardian's late Engineer writes as follows:

July 1st, 1892.

Gentlemen,

By letter No. 22625 from the Local Government Board, I am directed to refer to you for information in respect of Cottage No. 59 S. Gorteen, which was condemned both by Mr. O'Brien Smith and self and ordered to be taken down and re-built with proper materials and workmanship which has never been done with the exception of about 18 inches of north gable and which has to all appearance been rebuilt with the same materials again. Again as to this Cottage it was sworn in Dublin to be of bad material & workmanship, both by Mr. O'Brien Smith and myself yet it has been allowed to be proceeded with and for giving a certificate on the recommendation of the Clerk of Works I was paid to the tune of £15-0-0. I suppose because I had not seen the Cottage (which I was not bound to do at any stated time and only then twice which might have been on the same day) and as the Clerk of Works was supposed to see them once a week at least, he ought not to have been astray by information he supplied and on which I acted. It also seems strange that Mr. O'Brien Smith can condemn one day and pass same work the next, even after Major Gen. Stappen's letter to the L. G. Board in respect to the use of bad materials.

The Guardians Solicitor wrote, enclosing Notices to Quit to be served on the three tenants, named Michael Cahill, Ballycuoney, John Keefe, Cuvraghmore, and John Rowke, Carranave Upper.

The documents in duplicate were signed by the Chairman, General Tapper and Mr. Dooly; were countersigned by the Clerk and sealed; and witnessed by the Porter. The following resolution authorizing the proceedings was adopted unanimously: -

Resolved: - That the 3 notices to Quit, which have been received from the Board's Solicitor be signed by the Chairman and two other Guardians, countersigned, sealed by the Clerk; and that Mr. Bolger be instructed to carry out the Board-order of the 2nd instant in these cases.

The Chairman moved the following motion, of which he gave notice on the 25th ultimo, viz: -

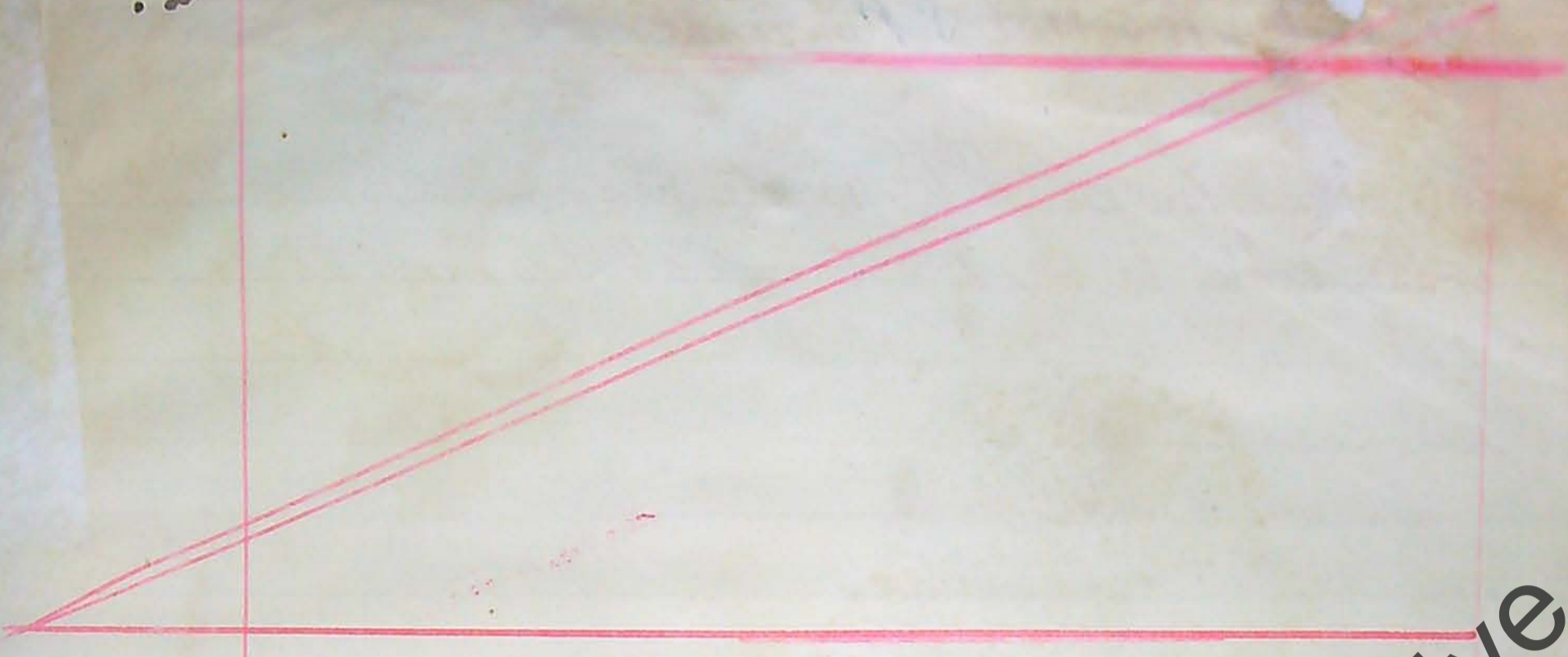

I duly received yours of 8th inst. intimating that I might use my discretion in accepting the rent of tenants of cottages by instalments. I shall where practicable, avail myself of this discretion, but the chief difficulty is ~~with~~ the costs. 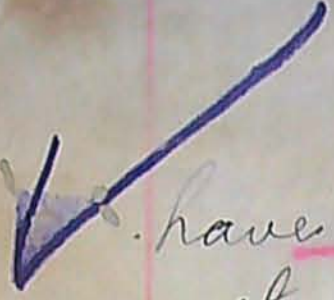

In two of the cases, No. 56 Fethard, and 191 Hilltown nothing has been done for over two years which is very reprehensible, and in the latter case I understand that £40 has been certified and paid to the contractor, whereas Mr. Bullen sets down the value of the work executed at £14. An explanation of this should be afforded and immediate steps taken to have these works completed.

I enclose herewith a letter received from the Clerk of the Union dated 29th instant with reference to the 13 houses not commenced, and the changed sites, some of which do not appear to be as yet legalised, although reported upon nearly two years ago.

As regards the house No. 59^s townland of Gorteen, Electoral Division, Fethard, the gables and offices have been taken down and rebuilt as required and is now completed and tenanted.

The Guardians' attention might be directed to my previous reports dated October, 1891, and December, 1890, and a copy of my special reports and summary sheet enclosed should be furnished to Mr. Bullen for his information.
