re-Labourers Acts 3rd Scheme.

Dear Sir;

We have read the several petitions which have been presented against portion of the Scheme, and from a cursory examination of them the following observations occur to us:-

As to Site No. 52- The petitioner offers an alternative site and if the Landlords consent to the taking of this alternative site can be procured, and the Guardians consider it fairly suitable, it is almost certain that the Privy Council will not force the

petitioner to give the present site.

Site No. 86:- The petitioner John Phelan does not in our opinion set out sufficient grounds for having this site refused - No doubt the fact that the Labourer declined to allow his present house to be repaired is somewhat against the case of the Guardians; but then Grangel may never be the tenant, and in any event can only be a weekly tenant liable to be evicted on a week's notice. The chief point in the case is whether the statement in the petition that there is the neighbourhood of the Lowland in question sufficient accommodation for Labourers is true or false. The Guardian of the Division should be prepared to give full evidence on this question of accommodation.

The petition of ratepayers respecting this site allege the sufficiency of the existing accommodation.

The Guardian of the district of or labourers or other persons interested should be prepared to shew there is a want of accommodation and to give specific instances and it will be necessary that we should carefully take down their evidence on the subject.

Like observations apply to the petition of Ratepayers in respect of site No 89 on the lands of J. B. Stearn except that the Guardian should cause enquiries to be made as to the size and condition of the houses which the petitioner alleges are unoccupied.

As to the petitions of Patrick Dooley and ratepayers against site 90 similar evidence should be brought forward and steps should be taken to test the accuracy of the statement that a field of three acres is bisected and access to water for 16 acres cut off.

With reference to James Conways petition against site 94 of course the Guardians should be prepared to give evidence as to the want of accommodation and in particular as to the allegation that water can only

conveniently be procured by passing through
petitioners yard--.

With regard to the petition of Patrick Meany
if his statement that he has already on his
farm a Labourers cottage with one acre of land
attached is true we think it very likely that
his petition would succeed; and unless the Guardians
of the District has reason to think otherwise, we
would suggest that this site be not pressed.

We return petitions and would suggest your
writing the Local Government Board that a committee
will meet at an early date to decide on the action
of the Guardians with reference to all these petitions.

Dear Sir,

We have gone through those sites included in the Provisional order which have not been appealed against, and we enclose a list of 19 sites in which we think there is a reasonable probability of obtaining the consent of the owners and occupiers to the Guardians taking possession without waiting for the Provisional order to be confirmed. We have omitted those in which the owners property is in jeopardy because there could be no consent obtained in these cases without considerable expense. It ought however to be borne in mind that if the Guardians now enter into contracts for the building of cottages on these sites the money for payment of the Contracts must be paid out of the general funds of the Union or by an advance from the Bank, because the loan for the purpose of the Labourers Acts cannot be available until November or December.

Repairs to Labourers' Dwellings.

Gentlemen,

In complying with your order of 7th inst., I visited the four houses mentioned. At No. 33 Terrarath I found the porch over the front door loose and in danger of falling down; it requires immediate staunching. The dashing around the window in the south gable appears a little defective, but on account of the door being locked I could not get into the bottage to get upstairs to examine it as closely as I would wish. The chimney top and tiles require a little pointing with cement.

At bottage No. 28 Aclamon between five ~~and six~~ and six perches of the fence are completely broken down; the remaining portion about five perches is likely to fall. I would recommend that the whole fence

about ten perches long be rebuilt. There are three slates twisted to one side which require to be set right, and two of the window fastenings and sashes want tightening.

In John Doyle's cottage No. 4 barnagh, where the wall is thin opposite the fire place the mortar fell out, and a small piece of mortar on the other (the parlour) side is also off, and a small piece of flag loose in the wall.

No. 9. John Powers cottage Ballyvelig.

There is no leak in this house as the tenant complained of, but there is a portion of the inside plastering on the south end of the house that should be knocked off and redone. The rendering of the whole house was coarsely done, and in particular the room over the parlour. It would be a great improvement to this cottage to have this particular room, plastered over the laths, between the rafters so as to prevent cold wind

coming in. One slate replaced and a little
 cement around the chimney is necessary.

The floor in kitchen is somewhat worn by
 constant sweeping but not so bad as to require
 a new one; a small piece close to fireplace
 should be replaced with a little concrete. All
 these houses are badly in need of paint.







I have to report for the information of the New Ross Board of Guardians that at 7.30 am on 8th instant the Police found that the Labourers Cottage at St Leonards (Intern) from which John Hall was ejected some five weeks since had the glass of three windows completely smashed evidently by stones and that the Gate pillars leading up to the cottage had been partly pulled down.

They found John Hall lying in an out office at the rear of the cottage, who stated that he slept there for the night; up to the present the Police have no material evidence as to who committed the injury
