That we, The Wexford Board of Guardians, at a meeting specially summoned for the purpose of the consideration of the various proposals for the Reform of the Poor Law hereby reselve as follows:-

I. That we amphatetically protest against and pledge ourselves to oppose by every means in our powet any attempt being made to establish in this county, county rating for any poor law purpose on the grounds that it would throw an additional burden of at least £1900 a year in perpetuity on the rates of this Union; that under the suggested rating area the rates levied would not reflect the finnancial policy of the different Boards, no local committee would get the exclusive credit of its economy or bear the entire brunt of its extravagance as the case might be, to our mind an important consideration and making for the better manage ent of local affairs.
