John Smith, Duke an ex soldier, was admitted here during the week. He broke a considerable amount of delph and also a large pane of glass. He was committed to the "ental Hospital on the following day."

The Acting Secretary Co. Wexford Public Health Board forwarded copy of Minutes of the last meeting of that body, and also copy of a letter received from the Department on the subject of Sub-committees for the purpose of Outdoor Relief. The letter stated that a proposal having been made to establish Sub-Committees of the Co. Board of Health to carry out duties which will now be performed as before by Relieving Officers, the necessity for such Sub-committees no longer exists; stating the procedure to be adopted for the districution of the Relief and the sheeking of the Relieving Officers' accounts, and concluding stating that a central Sub-Committee of the Board should be formed to deal with new cases of outdoor relief as recommended by the Relieving Officers.

The Board were unanimous in favour of the original proposal that each Board of Guardians be the local Sub-committee for the administration of Outdoor Relief.

The Acting Secretary of the Public Health Board also wrote stating that it had been decided to transfer the healthy and chronic cases at present in the Infirmary (the latter with the approval of the Medical Officer) to the Bounty Home in batches of 30 or 40 each weekbed and bedding to be sent either in advance, or with the inmates. Patients in the Hospitalwhom the Doctor would not allow to be removed should be transferred to the District Hospital or kept until the Co. Hospital has been set up.

The Guardians decided not to transfer any inmates until it was decided where the County Hospital is to be situated.
