Gentlemen,

Before knding in our account from 30th november 1898 for maintenance of bour by weakford children in this school Iwould respectfully ask you to take, into your consideration the inade pick amount of the payment made to us, for the past few years. and to increase same to such an amount as will be equal to the rate per chied per week, paid us by other bounties The original agreement made with us by the Irand Juny of this bounty was 2/6 per chied per week, and on the faith of this agreement, we expended, very large sums in providing Suitable accommod a tion for the children to be committed to our school. This payment was however reduced from time to time, in face of our protests and for the chiedren committed to us in this bounty for the past few years we only received if per chied per week, while is or is old committals

24 Committals we received only 1/6 per week. although this reduction was made in case of the bounty wese ford, Industrial Schools the Frand Jury continued to pay 2/6 per week to astane and other Schools outside the bounty. we have children here from many other bounties in Ireland; from the bounty Kildan we receive 2/6 per child per week On referring to the Inspector's last report on Industrial Schools in sectand, the bounty bouncil will find that the actual annual cost of the maintenance of each child in this School was \$ 19. 17. 6 so that a payment of 2/6 per child per week, in addition to the Government Grant of 51per wiek, would still be under the achial cost.
