Special meeting- 12th December 1905.

A special meeting of the Country Council was held in the Council Chamber, Courthouse, weseford; on 12th December 1905.

Present W. M. A. Ennis (vice Chairman) presiding. Other Councillors- Messes & H. Peacocke, J. Bolger, Matthew Doyle, g. a. Doyle, M. Hickey, John Bolger, D. Dempsey, J. B. Hearne, P. Cleary, J. Donohoe, J. Cummins, J. E. Mayler, James Codd, John Sinnott, D. Kavanagh, N. C. Murphy, Edmond Hore, Mark Godd, John J. Kehoe, J. asple, a. Kinsella, and M. Browne.

W. R. W. Elger Solicitor, were also in attendance.

The Chairman moved: "That the Council resolve themselves into a Roads Committee of the Council, for the purpose of considering the report of the Sub-Committee of the Roads Committee! Mr. Kehoe seconded. Passed.

The report of the sub-bommittee as appearing on the minutes of 17th November 1905 was then considered, a printed copy having been supplied to each member of the bouncil, the bounty and assistant surveyors, and mr. Elge.

The Chairman moved: "That the report of the Roads Committee be adopted, and that a copy thereof be sent to the hocal Government Board for Ireland, and that the Board be requested to hold a swom inquiry forthwich, in order (on the facts disclosed in the Report) to five responsibility for the heavy loss of the Ratepayers' money, which has occurred, and to take such steps in reference thereto as the circumstances of the case may demand the hocal Government (Ireland) act of 1898, having omitted to

provide be bouncils with adequate powers of control in this respect. The scope of the inquiry to cover the entire present system of road maintenance in this bounty, with a view to the adoption of such (if any) as may seem desirable and likely to conduce towards efficiency."

M. Peacocke seconded.

M. Browne moved as an amendment: - That this Council adopt the report of the Roads Committee and, with a view of taking measures to inforce the proper management of the roads, we hereby resolve to direct mr. Welster to before next summer) have the depots and receptacles for stones properly and perfectly levelled. That for the future the Contractors be requested to have the amount of the specifications in the depots by the 15th august. That next year our Roads Committee be requested to measure some of the heaps of stones, and if they are of opinion that the Surveyors have made a mistake, an independent Engineer be called in, and if he agree with the bommittee we then proceed as we may be advised, against the Surveyors. That the Surveyors be allowed two months from august 15th to October 15th to measure the stones, and that we recommend the bouncil to rescind the resolution which states that the stones should be in the depots by 1st September. M. Kinsella seconded.

"That the officers implicated in the Report of the Roads bommittee should be afforded an opportunity of making any explanation they desire in connection with the report.

m. bummins seconded.

this amendment carried.

m. A. C. Murphy demanded a poll, which was taken with the following result: - For-messes Browne, Hearn, How, M. Codd, Peacocke, Mayler, Dempsey.

Kinsella, John Sinnott, asple, J. a. Doyle, Kavanagh, bummins, Hickey, m. Doyle, and Cleary - 16.

The Chaviman then declared the amendment carried.

Statements were then made by the bounty and

assistant Surveyors.

M. Webster (County Surveyor) said in the course of his remarks - I may say out boldly and straight to your face, that as I have already stated - I was with the bommittee when they made these measurements and I am satisfied they acted fairly in the matter, and I am not going to go behind their figures. and no matter who is holding the Inquiry, I will stick to that. you may be sure of that. But. I will not say that in addition to the discrepancies shown in some of these measurements that the Contractors have been given about 15 per cent benefit of the doubt. I don't agree with that, and we wentury. earefully into the measurements. There are only two cases perhaps where there was some little doubt about stones having been taken out as to what the proper measurement would be.

after discussion a vote was taken on the resolution in favour of a sworn inquiry by the Local Govern-

ment Board with the following result.

The Chairman declared the resolution carried.

The minorial of the Rate bollectors, as appearing on the minutes of the bouncil for 1th November 1905, was then read for the muting.

Each Member of the bouncil had been supplied with a copy of a Return moved for by Svi Chomas Esmonde, Chairman of the bouncil, and giving the following information - amount of Collection, amount of Remuneration, amount of Guarantee payment, amount out of pocket each year, Gross cost of Collection to the County, amount proposed to be paid for Collectors, amount of Irricoverable Rates.

"under date 11th December 1905 (letter no 69031-1905 Wescford 60) the hocal Government Board wrote forwarding for the information of the bouncel, eopy of letter addressed by the Board to the bollectors in last give in regard to their remuneration and security. The hocal Government Board pointed out that the terms of their letter had been inaccurately described by the bollectors in the memorial presented by the bollectors in the memorial was as follows: "Besides this, the hocal Government Board informed the bollectors that in every

bounty in treland, except this, the bounty bouncil have paid the Guaranter Society's expenses, or otherwise recouped the bollectors for this expense."

in their letter of the 9th june 1905 (No 36,085-1905

westford bounty) was as follows:

Dam to add that in some bounties, the bouncil pay the premiums on bollectors bonds while in others they make a contribution lowards the cost"

m. Donohoe moved: - "That the Rate Collectors be called upon to provide Guarantee Society bonds, and that this Council pay for same."

m. Dempsey seconded.

mr. Browne proposed that the bouncil pay the Guarantee payment for the five Rate bollectors

giving security by Guarantee Society. m. Kehoe, seconded.

Mr Browne subsequently withdrew his amendment

and m. Peacocke moved the following:-

"That subject to the sanction of the Local Government Board the Rate bollectors who have given the security of a Guarantee Society be paid the difference between the rate at which they agreed in the first instance with the Guaranter Societies, viz: - 6/- per cent in the \$ 100, and 15% per cent the premium charged now.

M. Brown seconded.

on a show of hands there voted: - Three in favour of the amendment, and ten against. A. vote was taken on m. Donohoe's motion by a show of hands, but a poll was demanded which resulted as follows:-

- Gorey Road Contractors -

The following was laid before the meeting from the Borey Road Contractors' Association: - Resolved - That in view of the treatment that myself and other Contractors have received from the County Council, and their Surveyor. I propose to hand over my road to the County Council, if they pay me a reasonable price for the breaking and carting of the stone. In order to facilitate the Co. Council if the Council prefer steamrolling.

Signed. James Murphy Seconded. John Ouley.

The resolution was penanimously adopted. "On the motion of W! Ennis seconded by W! Hearn the following resolution was adopted:
"That the Lord Lieutenant be requested (owing to the damage caused by townst parties to the eggs and young of the rare species of wild birds which bried on the Salter Islands and the Kuragh Islands) to make an order under the Wild Birds Protection act 1894, prohibiting for five years the taking or destroying of the eggs of wild birds of any sort on these Islands, and to diclare the said Islands to be a protected area within the meaning of the said act."
