Proposals for Payment.

Proposed by the Chairman: That the Proposals for payment formulated by the Proposal formittee be adopted subject to the orders noted theron and initialled by the Chairman Passed

Scholarships.

On the motion of the Chairman the standing orders were suspended to enable him to move the following resolution which was adopted nem. con:

That in view of the promised Edwarmment Bill on the subject of university beducation in Ireland, this founcil requests this majesty's Tovernment to take into Consideration steps for enabling local authorities (within the area administered by them) to place higher education within the reach of Children of persons of plendes means, by providing, both independently and in confunction with the Department of Agriculture and Jechnical Induction for Ireland, scholarships, (awarded through competitive escamination) tenable in an institution of university standing. That this purpose can be achieved either by direct provision in the forthcoming Bill or by amendment of the Jechnical Institution State of 1889, and 1899.

That as the westford Country found has already, by re-Dolution, agreed to provide students of this Country with Scholarships limited to the subjects specified in the Submical Instruction stats 1889, and 1891, which are insuffice to qualify students for matriculation in an University, we request the Right Non A Burell m. P Chief Secretary for Ireland, to receive a small deputation which would place before him in detail the views of the Wiseford founty founcil on this important, subject.

That Sir J. It I Comonde (Chairman of the founcil) and mesors bunis, Donohoo, and Placocke, be appointed the deputation for this purpose, and that the Chief Secretary be requested to receive them at an early date.
