- Proposed Purchase of Hulk at Duncannon The following report of bommittee in connection with the proposed purchase of hulk at Duncannon the property of the waterford Steamship to, was laid before the meeting:

The Committee appointed by the Country Council, to visit Duncannon for the purpose of examining the hulk officed for sale to the Council by the waterford Steamship too, met on Thursday seet

October 1907.

There were present - messes m. A. Ennis, and g. bummins, The bounty Surveyor was in attendance; also the local Committee with their Chairman, - Rev D. murphy 6.6, Duncannon

An employee of the waterford Steamship bo, attended to answer any questions which might be asked by the bommittee.

The bommittee inspected the hulk, and found that the vessel was composite built of 3/8 inch vion plates, length 55 feet ginches, and breadth 18 feet.

She is moored with four anchors, with two go fathom cables, two 25 fathom cables, spare cable inch and a quarter stud link, 26 fathoms on deck, and with four shouler mooring chains about 20 to 30 fathom. The length of the gangway is 44 feet and width 10 feet. Shortly after being placed in position at Duncannon the

hulk sustained damage to some of the plates. were temporarily stayed with oak beams etc., which remain there still.

She has apparently been let run down a good deal and would require her decks caulked, and a thorough scaling and painting; with various minor repairs. The ganginary appears to be in rather a delapsdated condition and well require considerable repairs.

The bonnetter assuming that m' Elgerascertains that the bounced would have legal power to purchase; recommend that an offer of 625 be made to the waterford
