The number of telegrams sent by residents in the neighbourhood is small, and the telegraph requirements of the locality appear to be

sufficiently met by the telegraph office at anhunslown which is only about one and a half miles distant.

Mr n Kehoe, blerk Wexford Union, forwarded a Bill for 5/4 for balance of fines paid for franchise forms in excess of cheque received

The Finance Committee recommended that this amount be paid and that the attention of the Guardians of the weaford Union be directed to the advisability of establishing boxes for the neeption of these Franchise forms to be collected.

aset bo Surveyor Kehol- Salary

The following letter was read from mr John Kehoe, assistant County Surveyor, under date July of

" I respectfully beg to call your attention. to the fact that I was elected Assistant Country Surveyor on the 28th march 1900, at a salary of \$80 per year, and since then while I have discharged all the duties appertaining to that office I have received in salary the sum of £25" 0 " 10 only I now beg to apply for the balance and trust you will favourably consider my application. I may remind you that the Local Government Board refused to sanction payment of same to me until such time as I had succeeded in passing a qualifying escamination which as you are aware. I have now done. I bell certain that the bounty Surveyor will bear testimony to the officiency with which the duties of the position have been discharged by me".

Mr Peacocke proposed that the request of Mr Kehoe be acceded to, that he be paid a sum of £54 "19" 2 arrears of salary at the rate of £80 a year from the date of his appointment, and that the Local Government Board be asked to approve of payment of this amount.

Mr Dempsey seconded and passed unanimously

auditor's Reports.

The keports of der Baker, Local Government Board Auditor, as to his audit of the Accounts of the Enniscorphy Union and District Council were read.

Half yearly untings

The following resolution was received from the Tyrone County Council:

"That in as much as the Local Government Board have been given power by an Act of Parliament of last session to reduce the number of statutory meetings of bounty and District bounds to two per annum, we request the Local Sovernment Board to make an order to that effect for bounty Tyrone, and thereby save much time and money in accordance with resolutions already passed by this bounty."

On the motion of Mr Browne, seconded by Mr Donohoe, it was decided to adopt this resolution

Co. Surveyors a private practice

The following resolution was received from the Royal Institute of architects:-

" The attention of the Council of the Royal". Institute of architects of Ireland has been directed to recurring instances in which bounty Surveyors, under the new establishment of bounty bouncils, are engaging in private practice both in architectural and Engineering work This Council is of opinion that in the intends of the public service, it is desirable that the bounty bouncils should avail themselves of the powers conferred upon them by Section 115, Sub-Section 18, of the Local yovernment (Ireland) act 1898 for the purpose of making such arrangements with the Country Surveyors as will enable them to devote the whole of their time to their official duties."

Irish National Teachers bongues.

The following resolution from the Irish National Teachers bongress was marked read:

Resolved - "That we earnestly request the serious attention of the members of the new bouncies to the urgent necessity that exists for putting into force throughout the country the compulsory clauses of the Irish Education act of 1892; and we further regulat those local authorities who have appointed School attendance Committees and have elected attendance Officers to see that the compulsory clauses are really and not nominally enforced."

Loan 6000 - Ferry carrie B?

By permission of the Council, Mr Ryan moved the following notice of Motion which had been given by Captain Wacker who was unable to attend :-

> " That the Local Tovernment Board be asked to sanction a loan from the national Bank for a sum not exceeding \$500 to put Ferrycaring Bridge into perfect repair until the required sum is passed by the wexford bounty Council at the next Proposals Committee and that tenders be at once advertised for not to laced \$500 to carry out these repairs."

Lord Stopford moved that the matter be referred to the Bridge Committee to report at the Quarterly meeting in august what sum and how it should be expended to have the bridge temporarily repaired to allow of its being opened for the winter, and he understood that it would take a very large sum of money to make it temporantly safe.

Mr Peacocke seconded the resolution which after some discussion was withdrawn

The notice of Motion by Mr Ryan fell through for want of a seconder. Salaries - J. J. Scheme.

Proposed by Mr Peacocke, seconded by Mr walsh

and Resolved - "That we approve of the action of the Finance Committee in paying the salaries and expenses under the Technical Instruction Scheme of the Council out of the Subsidiary Account on the ground of urgency, and we direct the Jinance Committee to pay theseexpenses in future out of the Subsidiary secount."

Expenses Main Road Inquiry

With reference to the claim of the Local Government Board for £12. 11. 0 expenses incurred by them in convection with the holding of the main Roads Inquiry, the Finance Committee recommended at the treeting of June 23 nd the Council to refuse to pay as the County Council had not asked for the Inquiry and their Solicitor had protested against it.

In reply to the resolution of the Finance Committee the Local Government Board writing under date 11 4 July stated that they felt it incumbent to hoed a local Inquiry into every appeal made by a District Council against the final declaration of a County Council in respect of main roads and they considered that the Westford Country Council and the district Council concerned would have had reasonable grounds for complaint if a similar course had not been adopted in their Country. The Board trusted that the Country Council would remit amount and thus ob viate the necessity of further proceedings in the matter.

The following recommendation of the Finance Committee from the meeting July 17th was confirmed:

" He recommend the payment of the

£12" 11" o for the cost of the main Roads Inquiry, and that same be a bounty at large Charge."

Income Jasc.

Level biossing-Rosbercon.

On the motion of the reacocke seconded by us Donohoe the following recommendation of the Finance Committee of June 22 nd, was unanimously confirmed:

Communications were read from the Solicitor of the Kilkenny County Council with reference to the level crossing at Rostercon, and on the motion of mr searn, seconded by mr Donohoe, it was decided the following reply should be forwarded:-
