Correspondence between the Chairman of the bouncie (Sir Fromac Bomonde) and the Secretary to the Local Government Board with reference to the question of half yearly payments was read. In their letter No 12370: 1902, weschood County, the Local Government Board under date suarch 7th 1902, wrote that "a decision of the County Council & adopt the provisions of the Article referred to (Article 27) as amended can only affect new contracts. The Local Government Board descre the to add that the question of the alteration (if any) to be made in the salaries of the existing officers in consequence of any provisions of the Procedure of Councils Order of 1901 can only be considered after the appointed day after inquiry

as to the actual increase or diminution of their duties consequent upon the change."

In connection wich this matter, the Chaiman read the following Motion of which he had given notice:-

"That article 27 of the Procedure of bouncies Order 1899 as amended by the Local Government (Ireland) Provisional Order Bill no? be adopted by the bounty bouncil of the bounty Wespord and that the Local Government Board be requested forchwith to reduce the salaries of the bounty Surveyor and Assistant Surveyors accordingly."

The specimen of margarine was composed almost intirely of fals foreign to butter. Of the specimens of mick five were of very poor and doubtful quality but not sufficiently so to warrant bertificates of adulteration The remaining articles were of good

quality.

For the Guardians of New Ross Union sise drugs were analysed. One of them, namely, Fincture of Ferric Chloride was slightly difficient in iron i another, namely, bompound Fincture of Benzoin was rather low in extract.

For the Juardians of Weabord Union six drugs and a specimen of whiskey were analysed. The drugs were correct. The specimen of whiskey was of good quality.

One of the specimens of milk was of very poor and doubtful quality but not subficiently so to warrant bertificates of adulteration.
