# Quarterly Meeting - 2nd August 1904.

The Quarterly seeting of the County Council was held in the Council Chamber, Courthouse, westford, on August 2nd 1904.

The Secretary to the Council, the County Surveyor, and w. R. W. Elger, Solicitor were also in attendance.

The winutes of Annual weeting, and of Spicial weeting held on July 15th '04 were read and confirmed.

- Courtown Harbour. -

under date 20th guly (letter No. 42829: 1904 Westford 60)
the Local Bovernment Board, wrote stating they had
made a Provisional Order under section so. of the
Local Bovernment (Ireland) Act 1898, transferring the
business of the Commissioners of Cowitown Harbour
to the County Council.

A copy of the Order had been forwarded to the brish reflice, London, with a view to submission to Parliament for confirmation, and the levencil were requested to put themselves in communication with the Board's Parliamentary Agent; Herbert & Boyce bog local Government Board, whitehall fondow. S. w. who had taken theraps of the Confirming Bill.

Harbour Order 1904" was laid before the electing. It provided for the transfer to the Country, Council of the business arising in the Country, of the Commissioners under the Harbour Acto, and the vesting of all property, rights, and liabilities of the Harbour Commissioners in the Country

Council, except any liability in respect of repayments of instalments of loans guaranteed by the Earl of Courtown.

The costs and expenses of the bounty Council, and of the Local Government Board incurred in respect of the Order, shall be paid by the bounty bouncil, and may be raised equally over the whole bounty.

The Secretary said, that on receipt of the letter from the Local Government Board he had written to un Boyce offering to furnish him any information in the matter which he considered necessary.

The following resolution from w. A. H. Moore Hon Sec., of the North Westford Ratepayers Association was considered with the above: Resolved: That this Association having heard that it is the intention of the County Council to exercind a large sum of money towards the improvement of Courtown Harbour, are of opinion that the result well not be attended with success, and we protest against the Ratepayers being asked to contribute towards such exchenditure but consider that it is the business of the Government to earry out such improvements as are considered nicessay without calling on the Ratepayers to assist.

following recommendation of the Finance Committee: "we recommend the bounty bouncil to inform the Hon Secretary of the North westford Ratenagers Association that the bouncel contemplate the eschenditure of only a small amount on this harbour, and the Department of agriculture to, have expressed their intention of granting half the amount.

The County Council through their Chairman

The following report of & he King Esq Auditor of the focal Government Board, with reference to his audit of the Accounts of the Council, in respect of the half-year ended 30th September 1903 was read:

Sentlemen, I have the honour to report that I have audited the Accounts of the Country of Westford, for the half-year ended the 30th September 1903, and I herewith transmit two copies of the abstract duly certified.

found that certain errors had crept in owing to the dual quotation in the form of linder one case was brought specially under my notice by direction of the bounty baincil, in which the bontractor tendered to maintain 1816 perches of road for "£21: 7 6", per annum being at the rate of 42" per perch, per annum. In this case the rate quoted per perch would work out to a total of £24: 13: 6, and the bouncil wished to know if they could legally pay the lontractor at that pale. contracts, the Country Council, should I think, be guided by the opinion of their legal advisor, while such errors could be avoided in future by amending the Sender Form, so that only one quotation should appear in the material part of it, the other being shown approximately, as a marginal or foot not.

The Clerks of the Rural District Councils, in the Country, with the esception of Enniscorthy have responded creditably to a reference in a previous Report as to the necessity of greater care on their part in the preparation of the Road Forms. In the case of Enniscorthy the Forms contained many inaccuracies. I may, however, add that the Country Surveyor informed me that subsequent Forms from that District show an improvement.

In the absence through ill-health, of the Secretary, his duties with respect to audit were efficiently discharged by the Acting Secretary, we Frizelle,

In connection with the report of the Auditor the following resolution was received from the Enniscorthy Reval District Council:

"That in futive the accepted bontracts, specifications, and Bonds, after being perfected, be handed to the block of the Reval District bouncil, to enable him to fill up Forms 11. 12 +14, lowestly, and at the same time check the calculations made by bontractors; and inable him to give the bouncil an idea as to the solvency of the Sweties; which cannot be done hurriedly in a noisy evouded bourthouse, such as Enniscouthy

The documents referred to to be forwarded to the Secretary of the Country Council, with Form 11; when completed after each adjourned quarterly or Half yearly reeting."

w. I Bolger proposed the confirmation of the following recommendation of the Finance Committee:

"That acting on the advice of our Solicitor we consider it would be inadvisable, what the tenders and specifications should be parted with by the Secretary after the bonds in connection there with has been perfected; but the block of the District Council or his assistant, can at any time escamine these documents in the County Council Office before preparing Form ""

Ausing out of the paragraph in the auditor's Report as to road contracts - we Browne proposed, we Peacocke seconded; and, the following recommendation of the Finance Committee, was adopted: "That for the future we recommend the bo. levenoil, to take into consideration in tenders for road contracts, only the amount per perch; and that any error occurring in the calculation per bulk be rectified."

Reports of Local Government Auditors, as to audits of the accounts of westford union and Rural District Council; Enniscouthy union, and Rural District Council Council, Gorey union, and Rural District Council in respect of the half year ended March 1904 were laid before the seeting.

The report of the auditor as to the accounts of Enniscouthy union earled attention to an increase of 200 in outdoor relief as compared with the year 1900, and to the continuance of the undesirable

practice of selling the brops of the farm on eredit.

In the report of Enniscouthy District Council the auditor called attention to the escressively large amount of arrears due by the tenants of

In the report of Govey District Council the auditor referred to the large balance in the hands of the Rent Collectors at the close of the half year, and suggested that the usual monthly lodgment of their collection should be made before the close of the financial half-year. Marked - "Read"

- Mountgarrett Bridge.

The Secretary said that sometime ago, a resolution was adopted by the bouncil, that they should in conjunction with Kilkenny County Council, appoint a taretaker for wountgarrett Bridge.

The following letter under date 27th July of was read from the Secretary of Kilkenny County Council. In reply to your inquiry of yesterday's date the County Swiveyor was empowered on 20th April last to employ a baretaker for nountgarrett bridge

Finance.

under date July 12th '04 an application was read from the block of westford Rural District Council, asking for payment of the balance of the demand of the District Council, to enable them to next the half-yearly instalment of loans when it became

W! Peacocke proposed, that the following recommendation of the Finance Committee, be adopted: "That we accede to the application of the westford R.D. Council for payment of the balance of their demand, and the Committee trust, that having done this, there will be no application for an advance on the Demand for next year." we Brown seconded. Passed.

Malicious Injury Claim. The following resolution was received from westford Rural District Council:

That we desire to draw the attention of the learnty bouncil, to the malicious injury case of Walter Brien, in Forth for the burning of a house stated by Bruen himself to be unfit for human habitation; and beg to inquire whether any evidence of value of this house, was elicited by the Solicitor to the County Council, as wembers of this Council, state that expert evidence could be obtained showing that the house could be repaired for 610; (whereas the amount claimed, and awarded was \$25) and the bouncel desire to know, who is responsible for obtaining evidence in malicious injury cases."

On the motion of we walsh; seconded by we Kehoe the recommendation of the Finance Committee, as follows, was adopted -

"we have been informed by our Solicitor that from the evidence given in this case it would appear that the house was in thousugh repair, and had never been condemned by the doctor as insanitary.

Evidence was also elicited both from the Applicant and from a surgeant of Police, as to value.

The Solicitor of the bounty bouncil, is anscious to. cases from any individual ratepayer. The District Council can, if they so disire, employ

a valuer to give evidence."

Confirmation of Minutes of Finance & Proposals Committees

- Swine Fever.

Council.

Department of Agriculture, wrote asking what action had been taken by the executive bommittee entrusted with the management of the business under the Diseases of Animals Acts, as to the adoption of movement regulations under the Swine Fever Order of 1900.

The Secretary said that the Diseases of Animals Acts beommittee, had considered the matter but in view of its importance had referred it to the bo.

W. Reacocke, proposed the following recommendation of the Finance Committee: "That as according to the statistics of the Department of Agriculture there appears to have been a gradual decrease in Swine Fever since 1893, we consider it unnecessary at present to adopt any movement regulations with reference to this disease.

The focal Authority have always taken/active measures in rigidly earrying out the regulations of the Department.

Repairs to Piero. Este.,—
under date june 16th 1904 (letter No. 4826:04) the
Board of works wrote referring to a communication

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from the County Surveyor intimating that he was taking steps to have certain repairs carried out at Duncannon Pier. The Board understood that considerable repairs were effected last year, but it had recently been reported to them that some princing and pointing should be done to the pier, and they had no doubt that the Council would cause the matter to be dealt with

the Board of works, wrote that it had been reported to them that the masonry of barnson Pier, requires re-pointing in several places. The concrete on the South side of the pier requires repairs and the inside of the pier requires repairs and considerably during the past winter.

The Board would be glad to hear that these matters will have the attention of the bo bouncil.

Board of works wrote that it had recently been reported to them that the inside of the quay at arthurstown is silting up with mud to such an extent that vessels at times have to discharge part of their large lefore getting alongside. This matter was brought under the notice of the bouncil by the Board's letter of the 9th February last.

The Board would be glad to hear that the necessary action to put the harbour into a proper state of repair will be taken at an early date.

- Main Road Scheme -

The following motion of which notice had been

previously given was moved by we store.

"I hereby give notice that I will move at the resct weeting of the bounty bouncil, to be held on the 2nd august 1904 - "That at the eschiration of the period for the present wain Road declaration in July 1905, no new declaration be entired into but that all roads in the wain Road Scheme be scheduled as district roads."

To allow of the matter being fully discussed by the District bouncils, we work, agreed to the postponement of the motion to the next half-yearly meeting of the bouncil in november."

- Technical Instruction -

under date 22th July the Department of agriculture Elo, forwarded lircular 12. Technical Instruction- (Reguestion for sanction for special subjects) asking that the Country Council, should state that they were of opinion that the following subjects of instruction, which are not included in the branches of science and art, with respect to grants are at present made by the Department of Agriculture of Dechnical Instruction, are forms of instruction required by the circumstances of the district and request that they may be sanctioned by the Department - bookery, faindry, work, Dressmaking, (including douseholdsewing) and cutting out; Housewifery, Sick Mussing; Dairy work, Bee Keeping; Poultry Kearing and Articulture.

In connection with the above the following resolution was read from the North westford Ratepayers Association:

Resolved: "That this Association protests against the great eschense on the Ratepayers incurred by the employment of so many fectivers and Instructors on Dairying, Poultry, Bee-Keeping booking, etc., and considers that the money so eschended has not shown and good practical results."

adoption of the following recommendation of the

Finance Committee;

Instruction schemes of the bounty are carried out at a great expense to the ratepayers, Pioneer lectures are given entirely at the expense of the Department of agriculture, and the amount spent in connection with the agricultural, and Dechnical Instruction schemes represent less than half the sum realised by the rate of a penny in the tothe balance being applied for five Stock Schemes,

The Department of agriculture contribute five-ninths of the eschenditure incurred for Live Stock and agricultural Instruction, and the bouncil is of opinion, that the Instruction generally has

been attended with good results.

The Committee are sorry to observe that the north exescion Ratepayers' association, a body which claims to be concurred for the betterment of the people, do not use I rich made paper in their communications with the bounty bouncil."

A resolution for adoption was received from a public meeting held in Kinsale protesting against the increased tase levied upon pickled fish imported into the united States from Suland."
"No order was made on the above resolution as we so not been levied on the brine in which the fish were preserved."

The following resolution was read from the Fethard

Co- Operative Bu Keepers Society.

"The Committee of the Fethard Co-Operative Bee-Keepers Society desires to emphasize the necessity which escists for steps to be taken for the prevention of the Disease among Bees, known as bee pest or Foul Brood, and believes that this can only be done by legislation.

This eschemely infectious disease has spread itself over a great part of the bounty westford and is still on the increase, preventing the people from enjoying one of the most profit-

able of the minor industries.

We respectfully wage the westford be bouncil to use their influence with the Department of Agriculture to take measures to stamp out this Disease, and so confer a great benefit on the Country by the protection of the industry of Beekeeping.
