In connection with special minute to be made in eases in which the lowest tender for works had not been taken by the Proposal bommittee, and a copy of which had been supplied to each stember of the bouncil, the Proposal bommittee at the steering of january 31st recommended that the Secretary be directed to eavy out the regulation of the bocal Government Board in the matter on the motion of the bhairman the minute of the Proposal bommittee was confirmed.

With reference to the subject of improving the landing facilities at Poulduff, the Department of Agriculture and Iechnical Instruction, wrote under date, 11th Aovember 1902 (Letter No 3334/02 that they were prepared to increase from £500 to £500 their mascimum contribution of one third of the actual expenditure on the motion of the chairman, the following resolution was adopted. That our Secretary be directed to acknowledge the receipt of this letter, and inform the Department of Aquiculture and Iechnical Instruction that the matter is engaging the attention of the boundy bouncil"

Collector Lennon - application Increase in Poundage

Under date, zanuary 28 " 1903. W. andrew hennon, Rate Collector wrote applying for an increase in his poundage. We hennow in his letter of application pointed out that, owing to the decrease in the rates since his appointment his poundage had been reduced to the amount of between \$ 15 and \$16 on years collection. This reduction together with payment of annual premium for security bond was a serious loss to him. Besides he had a very straggling and rugged distuct, and his rate of poundage was inadequate to compensate him for the onerous and laborious duties he had to perform. Many of the principal ratepayors in his distict had informed him that they were of opinion that his remuneration for the collection of the rates should be equal to that paid the other collectors The following recommendation had been made

on this application by the Finance bommittee. "That the bounty bouncil refuse the application of bollector Lennon, as he intered into a contract to perform his duties at a poundage rate of 6° in the k."
