Porsons Pharmacy act 1908.

The following bircular letter under date 24th april was read from m. arthur. J. Ferrall, Registras Pharmacuitical Society of Ireland:-

As there appears to be a meconseption in some quarters as to facenses under the Poisons tharmacy act, 1908; I am directed to state, for the information of your bouncel, that such freenses may not be granted for the general sale of Poisons, but only for the sale of "poisonous substances to be used exclusively in agriculture, or horticulture for the destruction of instets, fungi, or bacteria, or as sheep depo or weld killers which are porronous by reason of their containing arsenic, tobacco, or the alkaloids of tobacco; the general sale of poisons being received to those who, on Escamination, have given proof of their competence to deal with such angina armena. It is assumed that, in dealing with applications for ficenses your bouncil will bear in mind Section &, sub-section 2 of said act, 213 - Before granting any licence under this Section of the local authority shall take into consideration whether in the nighbourhood where an applicant for the licence carries on or intends to carry on business the reasonable requiriments of the public with respect to the purchase of such poisonous substances as © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

aforward are satisfied."

"As the intention of the Government is so clear and as interference with the rights of qualified persons would be likely (by driving them out of the country) to result prejudicially against the public interest, it is hoped that your bound will decline to grant a license for any place in which the reasonable requirements of the public are already satisfied."
