Extension of time for payment of Delits. Circular letter from the Gocal Sovernment Board, No. 22. U. 1903. Miscellaneous, under date, 19th Geb 1903. was read. This letter pointed out that the Gocal Sovernment Board would enforce the provisions of section ST [7] of the Local Eovernment (Ireland) act 1898, except in eases in which it is clearly proved to their satisfaction that there was a reasonable cause why the debt was not paid, or for not taking legal proceedings within the prescribed period.

Regulations-focomotives on Highways. Letter No 71679/1902, under date 9th Jeb 1903 (Sealed Order, Amended General Regulations under the focomotives on Highways Act 1896, was read by the Secretary, who explained that a copy of these regulations had been supplied to each member of the bounty bouncil

Letter No 15090/1903. Weseford Rural District, from the Local Government Board, under date 16th March 1903. was read

The focal Government Board enclosed eopy of Minutes of Proceedings of the Westford Rural District boincil of the 7th March, with a Copy of the Local Government Board reply. The County Surveyor explained that this matter had been settled Orders had been obtained against the Railway Company, and they were carrying out the work of repairing the roads which had been damaged by them.

Counto Financial Half Year. Circular letter No. 42 M. 1903. Mixeellancous, from the

Local Government Board, under date 25th March 1905. was read. According to this communication the Local Government Board have decided to direct that all accounts both as regards receipts and esependiture, shall be closed and balanced for audit as at the end of each financial year, or, in the case of accounts required to be closed half yearly as at the end of each half year.

The following letter No 17920/1903 Weseford bounty, under date, st April 1903 was read from the focal Government Board.

I am directed by the bocal Government Board for Ireland to acknowledge thereceipt of the resolution adopted by the bounty bouncil of weseford at a special meeting held on the 23rd ultimo, proposing to adopt the system of half yearly meetings for the transaction of the business of the Council now dealt with at quarterly meetings; and in reply I am to state that the bocal Government Board, have given directions for the preparation of an order under section 12 of the Gocal Government (breland) act 1902, authorising the bounced to hold half-yearly instead of quarterly meetings. A draft of the order will be forwarded to the bouncil for their consideration in due course.

As regards the salaries of the bounty and Assistant Surveyors, the Local Sovernment Board will be glad to learn the result of the bircular issued by the bounty bouncil to the bontractors, inquiving whether they will consent to half yearly instead of quarterly payments in respect of their bontracts, before the Local Sovernment Board proceed to deal with the question the following recommendation had been made by the Sinance bommittee.

Lord Stopford moved the confirmation of the itinute of the Finance Committee with the following rider, And that the Secretary to this bouncil issue a burcular to the bontractors who have not already replied as to whether they are in favour of continuing the quarterly payments, or would be satisfied to accept the amount due to them half yearly." w! Hearn seconded the resolution which was adopted nem lon.

Complaint by a Road Contractor. Richard Kelly. Road Contractor, Ballygabert came before the meeting, and complained that although he had his road in good order some of his money had been detained by the County Surveyor. The selecting having heard a statement from the bounty Surveyor, dicided to take no action in the matter.

Representatives of the Bussat Meetings Sealed order from the Local Government Board No 18/ M. 1903. as to the exclusion of the represintatives of the Press from meetings of public bodies was read.

Reports as to audit of Accounts. Reports as to the audits of the accounts of Enniscorthy union and District bouncil, New Ross union and District Council, Weseford Union and District Council, and District Asylum, received from the Local Government Board were laid before the meeting

Abstract of Mortgages - Board of Works-Payment of Instalments of Loans.

The Board of Works forwarded an abstractof the Deed of Mortgage intered into between them and the weseford Rural District bouncil for a loan of \$ 250, under the babowers (Ireland) acts.

The following circular letter from the Board of works under date 23rd March 1903. No. 14338-02, was read.

I am directed by the Commissionves of Public works to state that it has been brought to thur notice that there has been a failure on the part of the bounced to fulfil the undertaking with reference to punctual payment of instalments of their loans which was given by them before their last loan was submitted for the sanction of the ford Commissioners of His Majesty's Dreasury. The undertaking was to the effect that the instalments in repayment of the loan for which they were then applying, as well as of any existing loans would be remitted at the dates at which they became due-Viz- 1st May and 1st November in each year. Notwithstanding this undertaking it has bun reported to the Board that the instalment due the 1st November 1902, was not brought to their account in the Bank of Ireland until the 6th November 1903. The Board douct me to request that this corcumstance may be brought under the notice of the bouncel, and that it may be conveyed to them that it is most necessary that the undertaking given should be strictly observed, and that payment of the instalment on the 1st May 1903. and of all future instalments should be punctually made, as a second default would sviously affect the question of the granting of any further loans to the bouncil " The Finance bommittee made the following recommendation on the matter.

That if the Board of Works forward their Receivable Orders in time for the Quarterly stretings of the boundy bouncil, which are held on the first Suceday in each February, stay, August and November, they will be paid. That this fact has been brought to the attention of the Board of Works on at least two occasions, and we would point out to the Board of Works that we are precluded from making payments of this nature except at a quarterly meeting. We consider the threat of the Board of Works in their circular letter No 114, 5338 as entirely unwarranted and uncalled for, in face of the promise of this bouncil to pay these Receivable Orders, whenever they

come to hand in time to be dealt with at a quarterly meeting. W" Dempsey moved, and the bhairman seconded the adoption of the recommendation of the Finance Committee Passed unanimously"

Proposed Basin at burraclos. The following letter under date March 7th 1903. from M? Francis Killeen, Ballyneskarbottage burracloe, was read.

> "At a steeting held in bureaclos recently it was decided to bring before the bounty bouncil a proposal to build a Basin as shelter for the numerous Fishing Boats of this coast. I have been instructed to apply to you to get we webster to inspect the place. I enclose you a map of the place and a rough sketch. If we webster would want any information about soundings etc. I can supply him, if he would kindly let me know what day he would call."

The bounty Surveyor stated that he had made a preliminary examination of the place, and he considered to make the proposed basin would be a very expensive work. He did not think that it was a suitable place for a harbour, and the question was if a

more suitable place could not be procured higher up the coast.

On the motion of the Chairman it was decided that the consideration of the matter be poetponed till we welster makes an inspection of some other site, and his report thereon has received the consideration of the Piers Committee."

The following letter was read from M? J. Bolger Forns under date March 13th '03 "I beg to apply to the bounty bouncil for the sum of \$2: 2: 32 amount of rate overlodged which I paid M? John Walsh, on his last collection on increased valuation of my place to \$60.

The present valuation fixed by the County Court judge being £38: 10% and the rating on this amount is £3: 13: 7."

The following recommendation of the Finance Committee on the above was confirmed on the motion of Mt Peacocke seconded by Mt Dempsey. -

ut Peacocke proposed, W? Donohoe seconded and it was passed - "That we refund u? John Bolger, the sum of \$ 2: 1: 10 excess rate charged in consequence of his valuation being reduced on appeal to the bounty = bount judge from \$ 60 to \$ 38: 151-

The following recommendation of the Magistrates at Forns petty Sessions of the 4th March '03 was laid before the Meeting.

That we the Magistrates, sitting at Forns petty " Sessions bowrt, consider there is a necessity to have the floor laid with cement and windows painted, and we request the landlord to bring the matter under notice of the bounty bouncil" -

The following letter from Mr. joyce, Petty Sessions blerk, Eaghmon, under date 14th March was also laid before the meeting.

I beg to inform you that the recent

storm inflicted considerable damage on the outside of the bourthouse, at saghmon. Some states were also blown from the roof and the building requires immediate repair. The sinance bommittee recommended that these repairs should be carried out by the respective landlords.

on the motion of M. Hearn, seconded by M. bodd the recommendation of the Finance Committee was confirmed

under date 13th april '08 the Jour blerk, Hew Ross urban bouncil wrote that Philip Kelly was doing little or nothing with his contract within the urban Distuct, and in consequence the roads in his charge have worn very considerably. His bouncil consider that some action should be taken by the bounty bouncil to have these roads put into order as the Distuct bouncil should not take them over in their present condition on the weight of Kelly's contract in July, 1904

W! Webster, bounty Surveyor stated that he had reported to the Proposal bommittee, the manner in which Philip Kelly was carry out his contract. She difficulty in the case was that this was an old Grand jury contract, and portion of the road was now in charge of the urban District. He did not know if he had power to prosecute Kelly for the manner in which he was doing his work on this portion.

On the motion of the chairman it was decided to leave this matter in the hands of the bounty Surveyor, and that if he considous it necessary that he consult the Solicitor to the bouncil.

bollectors' Somers & Smith-Changeof Swetus - Collector Edward Somers wrote that John Doyle, Moneyhore, one of his Swreties had died, and offering the name of Chomas Furlong, of Dranagh instead.

Road bonbiact of Philip Kelly-

bollector Smith wrote that we & Richards one of his swreties wished to be relieved of his bond, and offering in his place, 2 homas Smith, of Lara Hill.

On the motion of Lord Stopford seconded by M? g. D. Doyle, it was decided to accept the names offered by both bollectors.

M.P. visited Fethard about two years ago in order to inspect this pier and the site proposed for a new one, and I understand that they entered into communication with the bhief Secretary, and the Department of Agriculture and rechnical Instruction with the view of obtaining a government grant for the construction of it. It would therefore be well if the Chaveman could now make a statement as to how the matter stands, because if there is any reasonable prospect of as new pier being built in the near future it is simply folly to be spending money on repairs to the old one.
