If however it is estimated that a deficiency will arise Aulf the deficit may be borne by the Treasury, and half by the bounty bouncil. The Chancellor of the Exchequer also promised to defray half the cost of treating persons who are heither Ensured persons hor the dependents of insured persons. Such treatment may be (a) In a Sanatorium: (B) In an hospital; boundy Infirmary; or cottage

hospital; (C) in an institution or home for advanced cases; (d) in the tubesculosis dispersary, and in the patients home.

It must be clearly understood that more than half the cases, will receive treatment, lither in the duberculosis dispensary, or in their own homes. Many cases well be entitled to treatment under the Medical Charities act, by the Dispensary Medical Officer. Others will be able to contribute something, towards the Cost of their treatment; and some will be able to defray the entire cost.

It appears that the hormal travel, of the sand along this coast is from South to horth and the tindency being to self up in the slackwater on the lee side of any projecting headland or pair, will in this case Cause deposit on the horth side of any new fiet, unless Steps be taken to So diet the currents, and carry the drift beyond the piet, into deep water.

Meders winn and King proposes to obtain this result, by Sending the lind of the new pier at an angle to the northward, and further directing the Scow of the ebb hide, post the pier end by means of a half tide breakwater. I am not satisfied, that this result will be obtained, and Mesers brinn and King, are themselves

not in a position, to give a definite undertaking. It is always difficult to estimate result; from alteration and interference of existing Currents, by new works and in this case without Julle information, the improvement is problematic. Under any Circumstances, you must clearly understand, that dredging, will always be hecessary. Though no doubt it will be more lifective, and will be reguered at longer intervals. In this Connection, Istrongly advise the placing of a hand worked grab dredger to travel along any New per, or extension, and this should be worked. ley the local people, as may be bound hecessary. to preserve the Channel, and allow the Scow, from the Shires, to act to the best advantage. I pointed out to ll bunn, that in my opinion, the position of the proposed half the breakwater, would cause erosion, in the angle to the horst. of the present life boat house, by forming a funnel mouth directing and confining the waves, with a Storm from the horth East. It was suggested to alter, the angle of this breakwater accordingly. agrees, some form of open-work structul, with possible a solidend, and laid off. at an angle, similar to that proposed, for the end of the entirely toled per, would cause the least interference with existing Currents.
