Special Meeting _ 3rd April 1906

A Special Meeting of the bounty bouncil, was held in the County Council, Chamber, Courthouse, Wexford; on 3 . April 1906.

Appointment of Secretary.

Under date 10th march 1906, (letter no. 12,654-1906 Wexford bounty) the following was read from the Local Government

With reference to the Minutes of Proceedings of the Wexford Country Council, on the 26th ultimo, relative to the appointment of min n. J. Frizelle as Secretary to to the County Council, I am directed by the Jocal Government Board for Ireland to state, for the information of the County Council, and that the Board have approved of my frigelles appointment to that

Under date 13" march 1906 (letter no. 1324/06) the

Department of Agriculture, wrote:

With reference to your letter of the it Instant. I am directed by the Department of Agriculture and Sechnical Instruction for Treland, hereby to express their approval of your recent appointment by the Westford County Council as Clerk to the Local Suthority under the Diseases of Animals Acts, at a salary of £48 per annum, such appointment to take effect from the same date as your seperate appointment as decretary to the Wexford Council Council."

Relative to the bond to be entered into by the Secretary, the following letter (no. 16412-1906 Wexford bo) was read from the Joeal Jovernment Board:-

I am directed by the focal Government Board for Ireland, to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 16th instant relative to your security as Secretary to the Westford County Council; and I am to return, herewith, the draft bond submitted by you, and to state that the Board see no objection to its acceptance by the County Council."

Mr Elger said he had perused the draft bond, and had inihalled it on fehalf of the founcil.

Under date 3rd April 1906, the Secretary of the Post Office wrote asking for the consent of the Westford fountly Council to the placing of an over ground telegraphic line along the public road fetwern Oylegate Post Office, and Edermine Ferry Railway Station.

The Reports of focal Jovernment Studitors in connection with the accounts of the following fodies in respect, of the half year ended 30th September 1905, were read for the Meeting: founty founcil; founty formittees of Agriculture, and Sechnical Instruction; Weafors, Gorey, Enniscorthy, and New Ross, Guardians; and Rural District founcils; District function report of Enniscorthy Rural District founcil, m. J. Golger moved and the Chairman seconded: Shap m formolly, blerk, be requested to call the attention of the R. D. Gouncil to the necessity of having follerton Doran enter into a new bond in connection with follection of Kents of follages, as pointed out by the Suditor

Road Maintenance Inquery.
Under date 5th march 1906 (letter no. 12415_1906 Wexford Go)
the Jocal Government Board wrote:-

"I am directed by the focal Tovernment Goard for dreland to forward, herewith, for the information of the Weaford Country Council, a copy of a letter received from the Country Surveyor in regard to the inquiry recently held into the system of road maintenance in Country Weaford; and I am to state that the Board regret that in the third paragraph of their letter of the 23th ultimo the words "The fountry Surveyor admitted" were by an inadvertance in drafting the latter made to apply to the final clause of that paragraph without qualification, and they are of opinion that the words "except in a few instances" should have been added to the paragraph.

While the Board are glad to have an opportunity of rectifying the clerical slip in their letter, which the founty Surveyor has pointed out, it in no way modifies the general effect of the evidence or their conclusions arrived at thereon'

The following is the copy of the letter of the founty Surveyor referred to in the letter of the focal Yovernment Board:

Board to the founty found, re the Sworn Inquiry (recent) in this founty, when the matter came before the founty found to day, I drew attention to an in. accuracy which occurs at the end of the third paragraph It is stated there that with reference to checking the measurements of road metalling made by my assistants, I admitted that I only intervened in cases of dispute between the Assistant Surveyors and Contractors.

If you turn to page 109 of the transcript of the Short, hand notes taken at the Inquiry you will see that I made no such admission, fut on the contrary, I stated that I had measured myself, to check the Assistants, the material on ten different roads

prior to the ya of november, of which only two measurements were made on account of disputes between the Assistants and fontractors

I shall feel obliged if your Board will be good enough to have the matter made right with the least possible delay.

Estimate of Rate

Under date the 14th Jebruary 1906, the focal yournment Board wrote (letter no. 9401-1906 Wexford Country) acknowledging with thanks the receipt of copy of Estimate and Demand of the Country Council for the service of the Ensuing financial year

Assistant Surveyors

Under date 23rd march 1906 the Local Government Board wrote that an examination of bundidates for qualification as Assistant Surveyors would be held under the direction of the Board at their Offices, bustom Stoust, Dublin, at 10 or flock a.m. on Wednesday and Thursday the 2rd and 3rd of may 1906.

Error in Road Gontract.

Under date 10th march 1906 (letter no.9, 402-1906) the focal Government Board wrote:-

"With reference to the entry in the Ministro of Proceedings of the Wesford founty founcil on the 12" ultimo, relative to an error in a road contract entered into by Mi James Stowell; I am directed by the Jocal. Yovernment Board for Ireland to state that under the encumstances they will raise no objection to the proposal of the founcil to grant an additional Sum of Jen Shillings per annum to me Howell in re.

At the same time, the Board think it well to froint out to the County Council the advisability of obtaining tenders in the manner proposed in the form of tender recently issued by the Board, which was drawn up with a view to avoiding the occurance

of difficulties and possible litigation which might arise in connection with the acceptance of tenders at a specified price per perch."

Cowetown Harbour.

Under date 22 march 1906 (letter no. 1233/06 J.B) the Department of Agriculture, Ebo, wrote:

"Adverting to your Communication of the 27 ultims, emboying a resolution adopted at a meeting of the Weaford Council on the previous day, in reference to Courbown Harfour, I have to stap for the information of your Council, that, in view of the Condition of the funds of their disposal, the Department regret that they cannot at present entertain the consideration of any scheme of improvements at Gourtown that would involve serious expenditure

The Department will, however, obtain a report from their Engineer as to the state of the Entrance to the Narbour in order that they may be in a a position to consider the question of clearing it by dedging"

In the motion of m Donohoe, seconded by m. I. Bolger the following resolution was adopted:

"That this council desires to express the hope that the Department may see its way to give favourable consideration to the question of a grant for the improvement of fourtown starbour as soon as possible.

The founcil would be glad to receive from the Department a copy of their Engineer's
Report, and as the founcil will be under the necessity
of Carrying out (owing to damage caused by a recent
storm) repairs to the outer pier within a month
or sio weeks, they would be glad to have the views
of the Department on the subject of the diedging of
the harlow before them, when the question of the
repairs will be under consideration"

Jood and Drugs Inspector.

On the motion of mr r. & murphy seconded by the Chairman, Sergeanf Christophu Breadon. R. J. & Killerick, was appointed Ex-officio Inspector under Jood and Drugs Seps, vice Sergeanf Farrell R. J. & transferred

She following letter under date 13th march 1906 was read from the blenk of the Consiscorthy Urban Council:

"With reference to your letter re about informing the Wirban Council, that the County Council had refused a motion to Contribute towards same.

I have been directed by the founcil to request that the founty founcil reconsider their decision in this matter, considering that Considerity has to contribute its share of £678.10.0 towards the repairs of Bridges throughout the founty, not considering that they have also to contribute to Piers, Marbours, etc.,"

The Secrebary said that the amount of the Contribution asked for by the Urban Council was £9 On the motion of Mr Donohoe seconded by the Chairman if was decided to refer the legality of a Contribution for this purpose to Mr Elger, the founty Council having decided that the main roads scheme should cease as from 31% march 1906.

Substitution of Security.

The following letter from John murphy, Road Contractor Ballygarron Kilmuckridge, under date 26th march 1906 was read:

"With reference to my contract no. So Gorey Rural District, for the maintenance of 492 perches of road between the bounds of the farony of boolroe and Kelmwehredge, I would be glad if you would give fermission to substitute as one of my sureties the name of my fohn White Ballylurkin, Kelmuckredge to replace the name of mis william Ransome Ballygarron.

On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by me Dempsey, if was decided that John White Ballylutin Kelmickredge be accepted as swrety for John Murphy Ballygarron, for road no. 80. Yorey Rural District.

Mubrankin - Castle .

Under date 26 February 1906, (letter no 3276-06) the following letter re mulrankin fastle was read from the Secretary of the Estate Commissioners:

"With reference to your letter of the 16" inot, I am directed by the Estates frommissioners to inform you that the Board of works have declined to have muliankin Gastle Vested in them, but, as the preservation of the ruins may be a matter of local interest, they have suggested that the fourty fouriel be approached to take over the Vesting"

On the motion of my Browne, seconded by the Chairman if was decided that this letter be held over until Sir Thomas. It. I besmonde Chairman of the Council fe after to attend. The Secretary was directed to forward a copy of the letter from the Estates Commissioners to Sir Thomas Esmonde.

Compulsory Dupping of Sheep Circular no. 1342/06 from the Department of Agriculture Etc., (Veterinary Branch-March) was read. The circular pointed out that Sheep dupping had been taken up with great activity by local authorities in Great Britain and that failure on this side of the channel to adopt similar means for the suppression of sheep scaf cannot but, in the end react prejudicially on the large hish export trade in sheep.

"On the motion of me teacocke, seconded by Me Store the following resolution was adopted: - That we approve of the principle of compulsory dispring of Sheep. - When this matter was previously before the founty founcil, one of the strongest reasons for their refusal to per the order in motion, was the fear of exhorbitant eapenses for inspection. The founty founcil would be satisfied to provide sheep dipping appartice if the Government would place at their disposal the the services of the Gonstabulary free, for inspection furposes. That a copy of this resolution be forwarded the Chief Secretary for Ireland, Sir Intony Mi Donnell, and the founty Westerd Carliamentary representations

"Un the motion of mr Beacocke seconded by Mr Murphy if was decided that the amount of compensation given owners for compulsory acquisition of land and losts incurred at the hearing of the petition for the widening of Gloneranny Lane. £ 77.13.10 be a charge on Jorey Rural District"

under date 20th march W. R. W. Elgee wrote that af the Weaford Assisted, W. Justice Tilson had reduced the amount of the decree in the criminal injury application of mesors me, Alpline V. The Country Council from £128:12:5 to £81:1:8 fut gave the claimants £11:19:10 for their losts, and witnesses expenses in the Gourt below, and £20. costs, and witnesses expenses on appeal being in all £113:1:6, which is to be levied.

"We the Commettel Constituted in accordance with the foregoing desolution of the Wesford County Council having given the matters intrusted to us. most Careful and mature Consideration, embody our unanimous Conclusions in the following recommendations, which if carried into effect, would in our fudgment provide an efficient and prostical bystem of road maintenance, and Supervision at reasonable and moderate Cost. County Surveyor

1. - as the system of quarterly payments to Road Contractors will confpletely terminate in June 1906, we recommend that the Salery of the be surveyor as from September 30th 1966. he restored to the amount at which it stood on date of transfer of his service to the bounty Council, viz - a Salary of to box annum, with in adartion an annual allowance of the 50 for a blent.

allowance of £ 50 for a blest.

2. — In view of the persistently unsatisfactory manner in which the bounty Turveyor has hitherto performed his duties, in spite of repeated warnings and censure, this Committee would, under ordinary Circumstances, re-commend the Countie to Call for his immediate resignation, but regarding the findings of the hocal Government Board on the recent Inquiry, as a suggestion that Mr. Webster, should be given one year further wherein to realise the grave responsibility imposed upon him by virtue of his office, and to endeavour. To fulfil his duties, to the entire satisfaction of the bouncil

the bommittee are disposed to recommend the bouncil. to fall in with this suggestion, subject however to its being distinctly understood, that the question of the bounty Surveyor's retention of office or otherwise, remains to be dealt with by the bouncil, at the conclusion of this probationary term or at

any future period

3. — We recommend the bouncil to require the bounty

Surveyor to exercise efficient supervision in future over the measurement of road metalling quantities, by personally.

Checking the measurements of his Assistants, in regard to at least ten per cent of the total quantity contained in the annual report furnished to the bouncil and that he should indicate by astinisks, for the information of the bouncil, the quantities which he has personally measured, and in the event of discrepancies between his measurements, and those of his Assistants that same should be indicated in the Report.

4. - That the bounty Surveyor be called upon to frame regulations defining the duties of the Assistant Surveyors, for their guidance, and that these regulations be submitted to the

County Council for their approval.

Assistants Surveyors.

5. — We recommend the bouncil to re-applot the bounty into five Assistant Surveyors districts averaging 400 miles each in liew of the escisting arrangement of four district, averaging 500 miles each.

6.—We consider that the bouncil should call for the resignations of Messes Murphy, and heavy, Assistant Durveyors, and we recommend that each be granted a supperannuation allowance of L. 40 per annum.

M. - We recommend that the salary of Mr. Jones, Assistant Surveyor be reduced as from the 30 th September 1906. 15 L. 100. per.

8. - As Ma Kehoe. Assistant Surveyor has given four years? satisfactory service, we recommend that his salary be increased as from the 30th September 1906, to £100, in lieu of the present figure of £80 per annum

9. - We recommend the Council to appoint three duly qualified Assistant Surveyors at salaries of & 80 per annum each rising

by yearly increments of & 5, conditional upon good service to & 100 per annum.

10. - We recommend the bounty bouncil to give to the Assistant Durveyors any reasonable period for measuring road metalling which the bounty Surveyor may consider essential.

General.

11. - We recommend that the bounty and Assistant Surveyord be regarded as whole time officers precluded from undertaking other duties save by esopress permission of the bouncil.

Mr. J. Bolger raised the question as to the explanation to be offered. by the bounty Surveyor as to deferring and striking off money. from Road. Contractors where in one case they had the admission of an Assistant Surveyor that he had not measured the material in the depots.

The Chairman said the Council could not go into this matter as it was not on the Agenda paper, moreover he had consented to receive a deputation of the Gorey. Road Contractors, on Sunday neset, and in the circumstances it would be better if the question was adjourned until the neset Meeting of the Council on the 15th May.

Mr. J. R. Brennan Solicitor, who appeared for the Torey Road. bontractors, promised to prepare a statement of the views of the Road Contractors and send it to the Secretary of the Council, who was directed on the motion of the Chairman to have it printed and circulated amongst the Members of the Council previous to nesct Meeting.

Mr. M. I O'bonnor Solicitor for Mr. Webster County Surveyor, asked to have the Meeting resolved into Committee, as he had a proposal to make to the Council.

The Chairman proposed that the meeting sesolve itself into Committee, Passed.

Mr. O. Connor then stated that as Mr. Webster was anscious to meet the Council and to allow by-gones to be by-gones he

would be prepared to accept a salary of h 700 per annum Mr Webster confirmed Mr. O bonnow's offer, and said that although the bouncil were about having half yearly. payments his duties would be considerably increased over what he had to do under the Grand Jury. He had to pay for a blerk, and could not take private practices and his travelling eschenses and responsibilities were qually increased.

Mr. Ennis moved and Mr Bolger seconded the adoption

of the report of the Committee.

Mr. Doyle moved as an amendment that Messrs. Murphy. and Reary Assistant Surveyors be given a salary of k 100 per annum, and allowed to remain in office.

Mr. Karanagh seconded but after further discussion said he would be in favour of a motion allowing Mr Keary a

Superannuation allowance of L. 60 per annum. Mr O Connor Dolicitor, said that Mr Leary would be satisfied

to accept this amount.

Subsequently the Report was agreed to paragraph by paragraph M'O'Connor Solicitor said he should be taken as objecting to paragraphs I and 2. He respectfully submitted that the County Council had no power to pass these paragraphs unless with the sanction of the Local. Government Board.

Mr. Doyle moved the rijection of paragraph 6.
