The following letter under date 6th February 1909. No. 18, 741: '09, miscellaneous; from the Local Government Board, was read :-

"With reference to the preparation of your estimate to provide for the expenditure of the bounty during the nesct financial year in connection with liability for land purchase, "am directed by the Local Evernment Board for Seeland, to inform you that they have now been furnished with a copy of a certificate of the bommissioners of national Debt, from which it appears that the sums with drawn from the Eugranter Fund during last year under Section 29 of the Land act of 1903 amounted to £1,139: 19: 2, and consequently this sum will be deducted from the Grants payable to be bouncil during the current financial year on account of "insufficiency of incom."

in reference to the arrears in purchase annuities under the acts of 1891 and 1896; the Board have been informed that they may be regarded as inconsiderable, but no precise information can be forthcoming for nearly another month with respect to the similar arrears inder the act of 1903. During the year ended in 1908, however, the withdrawal from the quarantee fund on account of such arrears executed the repayment thereto by \$589 19:3. and this sum, which may be regarded as an approximate measure of the county liability in the matter, when added to the sums mentioned in the first paragraph of this commencation gives a total of \$1,679 16.0. Local Inquiry- Stancy Bridges. under date 3nd Fibruary the following letter no 5142ig, was read from the Local Government Board :-

I am diricted by the focal Government Board for bieland, to itale for the information of the weeeford bounty bouncil, that they have had under consideration the minutes of evidence taken at the inquiry held by their bhief Engineering Inspector, mo. P. C. bowan, on the 30th September last, with regard to the alleged affective condition of certain bridges in bounty westford, together with the inspector's report thereon. She Board derive to briefly refer to the circumstances which led to the inquiry. It appears from the widence that the bounty Secretary was informed in august last, that the Beeps Bridge was dangerous for traffic, and that on the 15th August a horse billonging © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

to folonel walker had put his hind legs through one of the planks of this bridge and made a large hole Two special meetings of the founty founcil were held to consider the matter, and they appointed a formittee to visit and report on the condition of the Deeps and Ferrycarrig Bridges. The fommittee visited these bridges and they reported that as regards Deeps Bridge all the planks in the opening span- forty six in numberwere unsound, and they invited the attention of the bounty bouncel to upwards of twenty planks taken from the bridge which they caused to be filed outside the fourthouse, to show the condition of the timber They further added that with begand to the substructure of the bridge, while there did not appear to be defects sufficient to cause actual danger, a considerable outlay seemed to be necessary to put the bridge in that efficient and serviceable condition in which they considered the Council would desire to maintain the bounty works.

With regard to Ferrycarrig Bridge; the forminittee reported that it rescaled such a state of decay and unsoundness, especially in the planking of the carriage. way and footpath, as to make the statement of Assiatant Surveyor Grennan, that the bridge was safe for traffic within the two months preceding their inspection, incredible. Sixteen planks laken from Lerrycarry Bridge were also placed outside the Courthouse for the inspection of the bounty bouncel. To dangerous did the Committee consider the state of this bridge, that unless they had been able to arrange for its immediate repair they would have taken the responsibility of closing the bridge. In their opinion the unsatisfactory state of the bridge was not due to defects in the specification, which appears to be fairly satisfactory, if reasonable attempts at earrying it out, had been made by the contractor and if the conditions thereof had been enforced by the bounty Surveyor. The Substructure also appeared to need ton. siderable repairs. The Committee made certain recommendations in reference to the thorough depair of the Deeps and derry carrig Bridges, and in Conclusion they © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

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drew attention to what appeared to be one of the underlying causes of the extraordinary state of dis. repair into which the Ferrycarrig Bridge had been allowed to fall, namely, the extreme economy practised which they submitted was economy of a type likely to prove eventually esthemely expensive The figures for the period from march, 1901 to the 8th August, 1908, are as follows with segard to this bridge :-

Amount actually expended in the period from march 1901 to August 1908 £660.000

And the Committee added that in their opinion it was the first duty of a public body to keep the works in their control in good and sufficient repair for the purpose for which they were designed to serve. This report was adopted by the bounty founcil who, in addition to employing an expert to inspect the bridges, asked for a sworn inquiry to fin the. responsibility for the condition of the bridges over the Slaney .

The accuracy of the report of the formittee was fully borne out by the evidence taken at the inquiry, and the contention of the founty founcil that it was the fault of the bounty Surveyor that they were not in the proper condition they should have been, appears to be justified. m Cowaw, who inspected the bridges prior to the Inquiry reports as follows :-Taking them in their order down the river from Enniscorthy, their Condition at the time of "the anging was as undernoted :-(1) Edermine Bridge. A number of planks in the "drawbidge floor were partly rotten, and I had "no difficulty in passing a small penknife "through the three inch planking near the edges © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

but leaving wood all round the hole. This is a comparatively new bridge built in 1897-8, "He roadway over it is macadam except at the " short opening span. The substructure appeared to "be in a sound condition so far as a somewhat " superficial laamination enabled me to judge. ho " complaint was specially made as to the condition of this bridge, but the resolution of the founty Council sefers to all the bridges over the Slaney. " between onniscorthy and wexford. Repairs occently "made on planked floor have not been carried "out in accordance with the specification. Defective "planks have been patched and not replaced 2) Deeps Bridge. The evidence clearly shows " that the timber flooring of the opening span of this "bridge was not carefully maintained in good order, " and the evidence of dergeant maker and other "witnesses is contincing as to its unsafe con-" dition in the month of August, 1908 The Deeps bridge like the Edermine Gridge has a macadam roadway, except over the draw. bridge or opening span. The substructure of "The bridge, including the files, caps, and braced " is not in a sound condition, and regimes extensive renewals and repairs. when I inspected " the bridge on the 29" September, 1908, I found new "planking had been laid over the whole of the "opening span, but that some of the piles were "greatly decayed. I had no difficulty in Ricking away a large part of the head of a principal "file at the opening span, pieces more than a

cross section falling into the viver. "13). Ferrycanig Bridge. This bridge is en. " lively constructed of timber and has a planked , "deck or floor, on one side there is a footpath. "The decking is made with three inch planks which " are laid across the carriage - way, but lengthways along the footpath. "The evidence proves that the floor of this bridge has not been carefully maintained for many "years, and that its condition was very unsound ; © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

foot long and voughly, about four inches (square)

"and unsafe in recent months. when I inspected "The bridge on 29" September, 1908. I found the "carriage-way generally in fair condition as "viewed from above, though there was a number "of very doubtful looking and worn planks in "it I had no means for lifting the planks. It "number of planks were not properly spiked down and in consequence the spaces between them "were uneven and rather wide in places, to "that there was some risk to animals crossing the bridge, especially sheep. moreover the loose "planks were very noisy when schicles passed over them, and in dome cases they were too short. The spaces at their ends had been clumsily covered by short pieces laid on top "of the floor. The wooden eurbing of the foot-" path was decayed in several places, and a number of the planks on it in very bad "condition. with the heel of my shoe I stamped "a hole through a plank and on shamping "on another plank it went to pieces and fell "into the over. The substructure of this bridge " including piles, caps, stringers and bracing "is in a better condition than the corresponding " parts of the Deeps Bridge, but there are some defective limbers in it. The condition of the "floor of this bridge must have been very bad " in August, 1908, as since then, so new planks "have been laid down. (4) westford Bridge. This is a long bridge with a roadway of macadam carried 'on iron decking except at the opening " span where the roadway is formed with "three. inch planks. The roadway planking "was in fair order when I inspected it. The " substructure is of timber and has been very "heavery larred, so that it is difficult to ad-"certain its condition. I found a number of " decayed timbers near the opening span, which " Should be carefully examined and made good by renewals or repairs. "The macadam on the roadway of the © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

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bridge has been allowed to wear down to a bad flat shape (though the specification provides for "a converse surface and thickness of 8" of stones) so "that it does not readily discharge vain water "to the drainage openings at the sides this un-"doubledly linds to deterioration of the superstructure, and should be remedied as soon as possible The condition of all the bridges was on "29th September discreditable to the bounty, and evidently as segards the Genycarrig and Deeps Bridges has prequently been dangeroud for public traffio. Three of the four members of the formittee gave eardence at the inquiry in support of their report to the bounty Council and pointed out that the bounty Surveyor had been requested to ack for more money from the bounty bouncil to put the bridges in order, but that m? webster would not do this, and that the bounty surveyor had sever been refused any money he asked for the bridges The bounty surveyor in his evidence stated that dince his appointment in 1891, he had been in charge of these bridges, but that he had made no special report with regard to them.

At admitted that Mr. J. J. Ryan, who was appointed Assistant Surveyor, was contractor for Deeps Bridge at the time of his appointment and that the contract had not been broken although he (the bounty Surveyor) had lähen up the contract on a ten days' notice, and that he subsequently wrote to Ryan's father that so long as he would carry out the work satisfactorily he (the bounty Surveyor) would let him have the bridge unte the expiration of his son's contract (march 1909). Mr. Webster also admitted that he for even the threatened

webster also admitted that he prequently threatened the contractors for the Deeps and Ferrycarrig Budges with proceedings for their neglect to keep the bridges in repair, but that he had not seported them to the bounty bouncil, or taken proceedings against them. She stated that Assistant Surveyor Grennan was in charge of the bridges over the Claney, but that he was not required to report on their condition, nor was the founty Surveyor able to produce any reports as to their condition during the last seven years except correspondend. © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

The further deposed that he inspected the Deeps Bridge in July last, and found nothing much wrong with it, but he made no note of this inspection or of the other occasions on which he had been over it, and he stated that Ryan got a good deal of extra work (dudden damage orders) in connection with Deeps Bridge. At also admitted that Ryan, Senior, was not a Satisfactory Contractor, and that it would have been better for him to have got some one else to do the work when he took up the contract in 1906, on the appointment of Ryan Junior as Assistant Surveyor. Assistant Surveyor Brennan stated that all four bridges were in his district, and that he had no special directions from the bounty durveyor about them. That he never inspected the bridges nor the roadway carefully. That he had informed the bounty surveyor that he went over Ferrycarrig Bridge, and found a dangerous plank had not been removed, but that he did not consider it his business to inspect the bridges. He admitted that the instructions to assistant Surveyors contained a clause that all gullets, bridges, and other work should be earefully examined, and where repairs were needed the bounty Surveyor should be notified, but that he did not look at the bridges at all On careful consideration of the evidence the con. clusions which the Local Government Board have arrived at, are that :-(1) The condition of the four bridges in August 1908. was defective, and that the Gerrycarrig and Deeps Bridges

abere at that time unsafe for traffic. (2) The responsibility for the state of these bridges lay with the bounty Surveyor.

my Webster appears to have taken no effective

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steps to ensure that these bridges should be put into and maintained in a sound and safe condition even as regards the superstructure, no arrangements were made by him for careful systematic inspections. how do any records of their condition at orasonable intervals seem to have been made, and although new regulations were made for the discharge of the duties of assistant Surveyor in may 1906, consequent upon an inquiry held by mr. bowan in January of that year, © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

which provide for the careful examination of all bridges by the Assistant Surveyors, no segular seports were veceived by the Country Surveyor, nor did he appear to expect any.

Something might be said in the defence of the bounty Surveyor, as to the great age of the Terrycanig Budge and Deeps Bridge, and the gradual way in which such wooden Structures deteriorate; but, with proper administration since 1891, when M. webster was appointed. Here bidges should have been practically rebuilt many years ago; and in any case if due regard has been paid to the specifications for the maintenance of the bridges they could not have fallen into the bad condition in which the Inspector found them on the 59th

The Board have not thought it necessary to refer to the report of the Ryan b. E. of the 22" September, 1908, on the bridges, as he did not attend the Inquiry in support of his report although particularly requested by telegram to attend.

The foundy surveyor is the officer of the bounty bouncil, and it remains for them in the first instance upon the consideration of this letter, and the menutes of evidence forwarded herewith, to decide what action they deem it necessary to take with regard to their officer.

the bounty Surveyor further deposed, and it was not controverted, that it was with the knowledge and in accordance with the wishes of the founty foundil that he served mr. I. J. Ryan with a ten days notice, and look up the work because mr Ryan could not become an assistant Surveyor, and continues as con. tractor at the same time. The contract however, does not appear to have been terminated, and in law mr. J. J. Ryan seems to be still the contractor. as matters now sland his appointment and any payments of Salary made to him, appear to be illegal having regard to dection 44 of the Grand Lury act. 1836, as adapted by the Local Government (Adaptation of Irish bractments) order 1899. The bouncil should therefore consider whether my Ryan can be relained in office. The evidence given by m. Brennan at © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

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the Inquiry raises grave doubt as to his competence to hold the position of Assistant Surveyor. It is for the bouncil to determine whether he should continue to be Intrusted with the discharge of the besponsible duties devolving on him.

On the motion of my Stearn, seconded by Mr. Peacocke, the following resolution was adopted :-"That this matter be postponed to an adjournment of this meeting to be held on the 17" instant at 10 O'block

a.m., That each member of the Gounty founcil, me webster, bounty surveyor, Assistant surveyors Ryan, and Brennan, and Mr. R. W Elgee Solicitor to the bounty bouncil, be furnished with a lopy of the letter of the Local Government Board.

That the attention of m. Elgee be called to the paragraph in the letter of the Local Jovernment board seferring to the payments of salary made to Assistant Surveyor Ryan.

"hosecution of Road. Contractors.

On the motion of Mr. Peacocke, seconded by M? Kehol, M Webster was given permission to prosecute Daniel lonnors, bontractor for Road no 58 in wexford, and Patrick Soyle, bontractor for Road no 45 in wexford.

Deferred and Struck off Payments.

The Jocal Government Board wrote letter no 16,058: 1909 under date 8" February 1909, enclosing copy letter which they had addressed, to the westford Rural District; as follows:- no 16,058: 1909. wexford bounty. with reference to your letters of the 9th December, last, and the 21th ultimo, relative to the question of payments to road contractors, I am directed by the Local Government Board for Ireland to state that they have taken legal advice on the subject of bounty Surveyors certificates, and they are of opinion that the only part of the founty Surveyors' recommendation which the District bouncil are authorised to deal with by making a proposal, or the bounty bouncil by passing a resolution, is that © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

relating to the amount of money which he recommends shall be them paid to the contractor, Neither of the Councils have any power to deal with any part of his recommendation, which relates to depening payment or striking off money. They can only deal with his recommendation for payment which in itself constitutes the application in respect of which the Diahuis bouncil may make a proposal which in its twom is to be considered by the bounty bouncil and dealt with by passing a resolution with respect to it. With regard to the question of deferring payments in the case of maintenance contracts I am to state that the Board are of opinion that Circumstances might arise in which the bounty Surveyor would deem it equitable and justifiable to defer rather than stuthe off in the event of the contractor not performing the full amount of work on a boad in a particular guarter. They consider however that no payment should be defined save in a very exceptional ease, and when the founty Surveyor defers a payment it will rest with him to satisfy the Auditor as to the propriety of his action, and as to the correctness of the certificate for which he is responsible marked. Carnegie Hero Fund.

Trievances Rosslare Fishermen

Under date 21" January 1909, mr bdward Wrikham Fort, Rosslare, forwarded the foclowing:-Gentlemen.

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At the meeting of the Rosslare Fishermen and others interested in the project at which over eighty persons were present, it was decided by resolution un. animously to lay some of the principal grievances of the Rosslare Fisherman before your bouncil with a view that your bouncil would take some steps to assist in having these grievances remedied

There are at present engaged in the herring fishing from Fort to Brelygeary about thirty two boats, each with a new of four hands which would total 128 people on this portion of the beach, as well as others from weaford. and occasionaly in a good season some boats from Kilmore, come to Rosslare. The average amount of money earned for the fast three years was about I too per year. (This average is taken from the boastquiards statistics). This sum would be more than doubled if the grevanees at present existing could be averaged.

The chief impediment to the fishing is the remains of five old wrecked vessels sunk on different occasions in Rosslare Bay. Three of those old wrecks are very injurious, as they are situated in the very best fishing portion of the bay. Those three old wrecks cause damage estimated at fless each year in loss of nets alone, - and in one fair fishing season, it is estimated, that the loss of herrings would total \$ 900, Owing to the existence of these three old wrecked vessels. If these vessels could be removed each boat engaged could carry an additional train of 6 or seven nets more than can be used at present, and 15 or 20 boats more thank at present engaged could fish with comfort and safety. The great annoyance and extra labour caused by those wrecks is very considerable, and when in their bicinity, very often the boats must have in their nets, otherword they would lose them by becoming enlangled in this sunken wreckage. This hauling in has often caused large losses to the boats, as it might be at time a shoal of herings would be swimming in that locality of the bay. © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

Tow the request of the fichermen to your Council is, that they take steps to have this sunken weekage removed from the Bay, - The removal of this weekage may not cost much money, and it is the first favour ever sought from the bound or Department in this orienty. Several Costly jobs on Puirs and Aarbours have been done elsewhere through the bounty. This is our direct request from this quarter, and the Rosslare Sishermen hope the bounded may favourably consider it, by doing which they would greatly augment the meagre income of these small holders and fishermen in the signity.

The past wet seasons wrought great havot on the small holders in Rosslare, and they scarcely had the amount of seed sown in many cases, and were it not for the herring fishing many would not survive in this quarter. If small deputation would wait on the bounty bounced and further explain matters if necessary." The following resolution was adopted on the motion of the Chairman seconded by my searn:-

bomplaint re. Roads.

In connection with complaints made by Jather Walsh P.P. Bullymum as to roads in his district the following letter to No Janning m. G. G., was read from Jather Walsh:-"In reply to yours I beg to say there is no good quarry in Castlebridge parish or in this parish. The nearest I thinks is at Drumgoold, near Enniscorthy. There is another, I heard, at Brownswood, near Enniscorthy also fairly good. I send three samples of road material, one near dereen, the same as last week, but more of it. It is largely used on many roads about Screen, Castlebridge and Blackwater.

The other two samples are taken from the road from -Ballylucas and Bullymum, on which there is much traffic of Innistorthy people, coming to the seaside in the Summer. It is very soft material and soon turns into mud. The more of this stuff is put on the word the worse the road is, as there is much more mud on it. We are only four miles here from Edermine Railway station, so that if the Arklow stones were brought down by rail, as I hope they will, two hours would can't them here. I hope no more of this bad, wretched stuff will be allowed as it only makes the roads much worse " m & Brennan assistant bounty Surveyor weste as follows:-" with reference to Father walsh's letter to my fanning and the sample of material from Ballyfarroque, I beg to state, that I did not approve of this material on contracto to 139 Emiscorthy R. D. and no go westord R. D. I refused to return a measurement for it, and defend the contractors' money, until he should screen the material. It was in consequence of this action of mine that the contractor (mr. areliam whelan) © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

came before the bounty bouncil in December last and asked that his contract be broken. The bounty bouncil though, they did not come to any definite decision about the matter, delmed to think that the contractor should be allowed to opread the material this year, and that his quantity thould be reduced if he had to get quarry stones next year. After consulting the bounty surveyor, I decided to allow the boutractor to spread the material this year.

Father Walch is right when he says this is not the worst material. It is considerably better than was used on the same wad last year. Similar material is used on the following contracts in the vicinity. Emiscorthy. R. D no 170 Thomas linnott. the 173 George Browne, no 177 Patrick Brien, no 181 moses Brien, no 249 Junes Byme, no 276 20th attelan, no 314 James Walch, no 300 Semon button. Weaford R. D. no 109 Richard Tortune, no. 110 Sinion revelle. no 128 Indrew murphy. no 155 Thomas Browne, no 163 Richard Fortune, and no 1644 Edward Browne.

On some of these roads the material is much better than the sample, on others considerably worst. I understand that this material has been used for a long period on the roads mentioned. I think if this pil gravel were screened it would keep the roads in fairly good repair, as good as field stones usually do. In the new specifications for this district, screened gravel is being specified. So far as I am aware there is no good guarry in the incinity. There is a guary at Blackwater mill, but the material is only middling.

There are two fairly good quaries at bastlesow - Dorans and bonnolly's - 3's miles from screen and 7 miles from Blackwater - a better quarry at Ballyboggan, 4 miles from Joreen and 7's miles from Blackwater, a good quarry at Ballymury, 5 miles from Blackwater, and 6's from Screen; Kerlogue quarry which is the best in the district is 8's miles from Screen and " from Blackwater, & Brownswood is about the same distance.

With reference to the postocript to Father Walsh's letter, I beg to any that the case is not as stated. The road referred to, is that running from Killala through the streets of Blackwater to Ballyconigan Lap. - ro 314 boniscorthy R.D James walsh Ballyconigan, Contractor. Before I saw the Blergyman mentioned by Jather Walsh at all, I had decided rot to measure the material . pit gravel that was three parts sand, and about ten jards of field stones. I measured the field stones and refused to measure the rest. I requised to measure this slately material on several roads in the same orcinity. In the case under discussion the Contractors money was deferred. At the Emiscorthy R. I bounde half- yearly meeting my moses Fortune. J. P., D. C. Com plamed of my action, and stated that the material was very good, etc., and several bouncellors backed him up.

I mally the matter was left in the hands of the bounty surveyor, with a recommendation that the material be allowed for this year. m. webster and I after consultation agreed to let the contractor spread the quarry stones as a trial on the Sea end of the road which is very sandy. The contractor was to screen the gravel and spread it on the Blackwater end. The contractor fulfilling these instructions so far as the quarry stone was concerned, but did not screen the gravel. Ite spread it as it was, contrary to instructions. The blergyman who informed Father Walsh, was incorrect.

W. Janning proposed .- That a supply of Java Shell Stones be brought by rail, to the parishes of Bastlebridge, Black. water and Ballymum, and that the contractors for the main. tenance of roads within these parishes be required to use a reduced equivalent of these stones instead of the present material they are using".

W. webster said that he thought Kerlogue stones were very suitable.

There was no seconder to my fanning's proposition, and the matter therefore fell through .

m whelan Garrylough, one of the Contractor's concerned Said, he could not consent to draw stones from Kerlogue. He was satisfied to put on a reduced amount of stones from murphy's quarry if he could get it.

m. webster said there was excellent stones in Murphy's quan The matter was referred to the bounty Surveyor and m R. Brennan assistant Surveyor.
