- Wescford Prison .----

The following letter under date 27th June 1905, (No. 12969 104) from the Secretary, General Prisons Board, Dublin basele; was read for the meeting:-

"I am directed by the General Prisons Board to state, for the information of the wexford bounty bouncil, that the prison premises at wexeford, which were closed for prison purposes by order of His Excellency the ford Lieutenant dated 17th Sept '04, will, under section 31 of the Prisons, Ireland act, 1877 (40 9 41 bic C 49) become vested in the bounty bouncil as successors to the Grand jury at the expiration of 12 months from the date of the closing order, and I am to request

that you will ask the bo bounced to appoint a representative to take over the prison on the 16th September nesct from a representative of the Board, who will be at the Prison on that date for the purpose."

"It Reacocke proposed: "That a Committee be appointed to inspect the prison premises, and to confir with the Weseford Municipal Council, to see if they would agree with the bo Council, to take over the premises for some public purpose. That the Committee report to the next meeting of the County bouncil, and make any recommendations they consider advisable. That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the General Prisons Board; that they be asked to direct the Caretaker of the prison to allow admission to the Committee, anytime they desire."

"On the motion of M? murphy, seconded by m? Dempsey, the whole bouncil were appointed a committee to meet at the Prison on the 22nd July at 10. O'clock."

- The Bull Ring monument-

The weseford Borough association wrote asking the bouncil to assist at the unveiling of the Monument, on the 6th august.

M! Dempsey proposed :- "That all the members of the bouncil possible attend the demonstration of the unveiling of the '98 Monument." W. Kinsella seconded Passed.

A letter was received from the R. J. Constabulary wescford, asking that Sergeant wom Farriel be appointed to Killinick petty Sessions district, and Sergeant Patrick white, be appointed to Zaghmon, and Duncormack letty Sessions Districts; as esc-officio Inspectors

under the Food and Drugs acts." "On the motion of me asple, seconded by me Kehoe, the appointments were made."

- Ine Library -

The following letter was read from Surgeon major Stafford, Rosslare, Mansel, wimbledon; under date 7th July :-

On a former occasion I offered to present to the bounty bouncil of wescford, a complete set of the bolumes of the Encyclopoedia Brittanica, and a Book lease to match, in the event of a Freehibrary for Wescford being established by the bouncil, and my offer was accepted. Since that date I have retained the Books temporarily of course, in waiting to hear from you that the Free fibrary had been authorised by the bouncil.

As it does not seem probable, however, that the library will come into excistence in the near future, and as I desire to send on the books to weoeford, I have now to request that your bouncil will be so kind as to permit me to transfer my offer to the mayor of weoeford asking him to accept the gift for the town to be placed either in the mechanic's Institute or some other suitable Institution, as the bosporation may approve, to which the people may have access under proper municipal control.

On the motion of "M" Kinsella, seconded by m" Kehoe, the following resolution was passed : "as the bounty bouncil are unable to establish a free library they would be glad to see the kind offer of Swigeon major Stafford, transferred to the weatford Corporation."

"That the Department be requested to take active steps in prohibiting the removal of horses from any of those specified infected districts into own bounty, to fairs on other markets, or shows, and that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Department, to the bounty bommittee of agriculture, and to the bounty bouncil." M' Peacocke proposed, M' Browne seconded; and

it was passed :-

That we back up the resolution of the Westford agricultural Society, and communicate with the Department of agriculture, suggesting that they restrict horses coming from anyarea included in the Epizootic hymphangitis Order to any fair, market, or show; in this bounty.

That in view of the fact that this disease has been introduced into Ireland by the negligence, of Government officials, we consider the full value of any house compulsorily slaughtered in connection with this disease, should be paid in full by the Government"

Nour of meetings -

"m" burning moved, "that the bounty bouncil meet at 12 0'block noon in future." The motion was not seconded and fill through.

Re- distribution -

The following resolution was passed, on the motion of M. Donohoe, seconded by W. bummins. "That we regard the re-distribution Proposals now before Parliament as a gross violation of the Ireaty of union, which was forced on this bountry by fraud and corruption of the grosest kind, and as indicating clearly that no justice is to be had under the said union, and we call on the srish members to resist the proposals inch by inch by obstructing Parliamentary Progress, and by harrassing in every possible way the present © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES perfidious Sovernment which holds no mandate from the bountry as regards this scheme, and which has lost the confidence of the Electors and is consequently violating every rule of bonstitutional Government.

That we pledge ourselves and those werepresent, to sustain morally and financially the Irish Party in their resistance of English Governmental perfidy, and that copies of this resolution be sent to more John Redmond, and the bounty member.

-Education Act. -

Proposed by M. Donohow, seconded by M. Browne, and passed :- "That we pledge our support moral, and material, to the batholic School managers of Ireland, in their resistance of the new School Board Regulations, which we ful have been issued with the insiduous object of demoralising and destroying Primary Education, and we agree with his Eminence Cardinal Logue, that it would be better to suffer now temporarily be resistance, than to cooperate with the vicious proposal of miseca schools, which would have lasting bed resulto; and that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to m. J. Redmond M. P. and the bounty Members"

- Lease to asylum. -

We Peacocke proposed that the leave from mis Preston, to the bounty bouncil, for the Emiscothy District asylum Committee, of a strip of ground required for the Electric Lighting System, be sealed and signed. We Kehoe, seconded Passed.

- Jelegraph Station Ramsgrange me bummins proposed :- That we again call the attention of the Postmaster General to the fact that the people of Ramsgrange have a decided guevance in the refusal of the Post office authorities, to establish a Delegraph

office at Ramsgrange, notwithstanding that the people of the locality have offered the usual Guaranter. A request for the establishment of this Delegraph Station was passed two years ago, and we cannot see any reason why the request was not complied with. shat a copy of this resolution be sent to the Postmaster General, and the bounty members. Special meeting - 22nd July 1905.

That the bommittee report to the nesct meeting of the bounty bouncil, and make any recommendations they consider advisable.

That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the General Prisons Board; that they be asked to direct the baretaker of the Prison to allow admission to the bommittee anytime they desire."

"The whole bouncil to be constituted the bommittee."

after inspecting the prison premises the following resolution was adopted, on the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Mr. N. C. Murphy "That a bommittee of four be appointed to go fully into the question of the taking over the westion, from the Prisons Board

and the purposes to which it may be applied in future with most advantage to the Ratepayors, and to the bounty bounced. That the bommittee be empowered to consult with a similar bommittee appointed by the weeford borporation, should that body decide to appoint them with the view of ascertaining whether the buildings could be utilized for any public purpose, the joint bommittee to report to the bouncil."

the following bommittee were appointed to represent the bounty bouncil; Misors Ennis, and Peacocke, also Mr. John Bolger, In the event of Mr. John Bolger, being unable to act Mr. J. Bolger to take his place. Mr. J. B. Hearne, should mr. Hearne be unable to act, he is requested to name a bounty bouncillor from the new Ross District as his substitute.
