The following letter from messes m. J. Obonnor 16. Solicitors, under date 26th January 1905 and which had been postponed for the election of the new bouncil, was laid before the meeting. "We are acting for the following five Rate bollectors, - John Barden, borse, Fethard; Francis Blake, boddstown, andrew Lennon, Edenvale, John mullett, Bree; and John Sinnott, Ballyelans pavidotown; all of these are bound in a bond of £900, escept mullett, whose bond is £600. Heretofore they have been paying at the rate of

6/2 in the £ 100; to suarantee Societies, for this Bond; that is \$2: 14/0 for the kgoo and \$1: 16/0 for the \$600. Now the Guarantee Societies, have increased their rates of charges from 6/2 in the £100 to 15/2 in the \$100; so that the £900 would be chargeable with \$6: 15% and the \$600 with \$4: 10%.
