The following opinion of us I. M. Healy 2.6. M. Pon case submitted to him in reference to the boundy Treasurship was read:

On the passing of the focal Tovernment act the existing officers of the Grand Jury including the Treasurer were transferred to the bounty bouncil under Section 115 Sub Section 1. These was therefore no vacancy in that office on the day the bouncil first met, but it was and is competent for the bouncil to create a vacancy by regular proceedure Its power in the matter is made cleab by Section 83 Sub Section 1 which provides that the boundy bouncil shall appoint the Treasurer of the bounty who shall be Treasurer of the Council, and Sub Sections 4. 5+6 show that the Ireasure, may be removed without the concurrence of the focal Government Board (unlike some of the other officers therein mentioned / Section 115 Aub Section 18 however proordes, that existing officers transferred from the Grand Jury shall hold office on the same tenure and conditions as theretofore. It is therefore necessary to consider on what Tenure the Treasurers office is held. The Provincial Bank was appointed under 30 + 31 Nie bap 46 Sec 2. which enables any meeting of the Grand Jury to revoke its appointment and appoint another Banking to. in its place, so that the office was terminable at any moment, at the pleasure of the Grand Jury whose powers in this respect descend to the boundy bouncil Moreover a Banking to is especially excepted from the protection afforded to other transferred officers by section 115 Sub Section 19 of the f. G. Act and is entitled to no compensation on removal or abolition of office. No question can

therefore be raised as to the power of the bouncils to temove the Provincial Bank, from its position as Irasurer altho' there may be a question as to whether at present that power has been exercised in point of low. I have indicated that there was no vacancy in the office of Ireasurer when the bounky bouncil first met, and therefore in my opinion the Revolution of the 22nd April was not operative to dumines the Provincial Bank from the office, as all it does is to appoint another Bank to an office which was then full Notice to a Banking boy of its intended dismissal beforehand is not necessary but there must be in fast a dismissal and in bounty weaford none has yet laken place A resolution to work that consequence should run in some such terms as the following:

That the appointment of the Provincial Bank of Seland to the office of bounty Treasurer of the bounty of bosoford pursuant to the 2nd Section of the 30th + 3 set Vie bap 46 be and is hereby revoked and that the said Banking bo, be and is hereby dismissed and removed from stuid office

When that resolution has been passed in accordance with the process dure regulating the business of the bouncil the office will be vacant and it will be competent to at once field it, by a new appointment. Such a resolution not being part of the Statutory business of the bouncil appears to me to require notice under Rule 8 Article 36 Sub. Section 10. The third rule of this article 36 Sub. Section 10. The third rule of this article and a 3 days' notice to lack member should be given of the business proposed to be transacted used while the existing Irea source cannot refuse to honour the cheques of the bouncil, and if they are dishonoured the Ireasurer is liable to an action, and damages for any injury or loss sustained.

There are more over other penels for a Bank which dishonors the cheques of customers having money in its custody which need not be considered as doubtles the Provincial Blank will at once give effect to its contention that it remains the bounty Treasurer pending solid dismissed and will act with that propricity which its position and status the requires

I need not I think discuss now whether the resolution of 3rd May was legal or not, beyond saying that in my opinion, if the bouncil now draw cheque for any legal disbursement, there seems little doubt that they will be cashed, as it is impossible to conceive that the Provincial Bank would place itself in the serious position of dishonouring them, because of any ultimate purpose in the minds of members of the bouncil. The cheques should probably be drawn on the account to which lack is applicable, but a bank, would be in a very insecure position which dishonoured cheques properly drawn, otherwise, be cause they did not specify the fedger all kept by itself. 
