Both questions were referred to the Finance Committee Letter 10.17084: 1900 (Weseford bran District) stogether with a copy of a letter written by the Lown black of Westford, and referring to the Demand made by the bounty bouncil on the Weseford brown District bouncil were read! The Secretary explained that the Demand had been made out in accordance with the Act of Parliament and the directions of the Local Government Board. There was however aneslight error in it. The District Council had been charged a share of the compensation to be pain to be sislawn one of the Poor Rate Collectors and as the Council had paid the entire amount of compensation

Ane M. M. J. Obonnor, late Poor Rate bollector, for their portion of the area within which the latter gave his services it was not the intention to charge them with any of the other compensations. This had been eseplained to the Town blerk. The Demand was merely an estimate of the amount which the borporation would have to pay The actual amount had to be worked out for the leager account of the wroan District and was of course based on the actual expenses.

Accounts of the bounty bouncil of the bounty wex ford for the half year ended the 30th September 1899 and beg to forward an Abstract of the same duly declare a and certified, in which will be found a fully detailed statement of the receipts and expenditure under the several heads of service.

With reference to the collection of the rate as it was only struck on the 17th August and the Warrants handed to the collectors on the 23rd of the same month, only a comparatively small portion of it was collected and lodged prior to the close of the half year under audit. I have to call attention however to the fact that bollector Doyle made no lodgment and I desire to point out to the bounty bouncil that they should insist on all the collectors complying strictly with the terms of the obligations contained in their bonds. The amounts lodged by them should invariably agree with their Abstracts, as carelessness in either overlodging or underlodging (as has occurred in some instances tedds to cause more or less confusion in their accounts.

The quarterly return of proposals for payments fur--nished by blerks of District bouncils appear in some cases not to have been properly filled, as to the localities and measurements, and also as to the classification of expenses. This important matter should in future receive the attention of the officers concerned.

It would be advisable, I consider to have a copy of form 14 (recommendations as to proposals for payments added by the bounty Surveyor to his report to the District Councils I lodged by the blerks of the Kural District bouncils, with the Secretary to the bounty bouncil as at present there is no record in the secretary's Office as to the amounts of payment to contractors which have been deferred or struck off.

Main Roads Schime.

May 1900 from the Local Government Board stating their Inspector Me & Lynch-Staunton would hold an inquiry into the appeal of the Westford Mrban District bouncil against the final declaration adopted by the bounty bouncil concerning the main roads in the bounty, was read.

The following resolution from the New Ross broan bouncil the consideration of which had been adjourned from the last meeting of the bouncil was read:

That our Solicitor be instructed to write the Dublin Wicklow and Westford Railways bois Solicitor, and state that the Urban bouncil strongly object to the street at Rosber con being reduced in wiath as proposed in their plans, and if the Railway bompany purpose going to Parliament to reduce the width, this bouncil will oppose them there, and that the bounty bouncie of Westford be informed of above and that they be requested to take similar action

On the same matter the following letter under date May 10th 1900 was read from her John John Jown blerk, New Ross

I was directed to call your attention to the fact that the Dublin Wick low and Wexford Railway Company in their alterations of the public roads all Rosbercon in connection with extension of their line are reducing the public road from Hy to 18 feet exclusive of footpaths, and that the bounds is of opinion that the reduced width will not offer sufficient accomodation to the public in this much use a thoroughfare. The boun at trust your bouncil will not permit the public right to be interfered with in this manner."

The Secretary said that after the receipt of this letter the Parliamentary Agents of the Railway bompany forwarded to him copy of their amended Bile with reference to this matter, and he had communicated with the blerk of the New Ross Urban. District asking if his bouncil wished to lay their views before his bouncil beyond the terms given above; he had received from the blerk of the Urban bouncil the following letter dated may 19th 1900

I beg to acknowledge the recipt of your letter of the 17 minst restative respecting the Bill for the amendment of the. New Ross New Ross and Waterford (Ict, and to say it was considered at a specially noticed Meeting of the Urban District bouncil held last night. After a conversation on the subject of the great public inconvenience that would be caused by the narrowing of the street in Rosbercon the following resolution was unanimously adopted in reference thereto:

That this bouncil have nothing further to add to their resolution passed on the 9th inst and transmitted to you on the 10th, but to earnestly request that the bounty bouncil will kindly leave nothing undone to prevent the public nights being interfered with in the street in Rosbercon
