mr. Richard Gleeson, Non Sec Fishermino association Ballyhack, forwarded the following resolutions which were adopted at a meeting of the association on the 12th april 1908: Proposed by mr. Richard Gluson, Ballyhack, and seconded by m. Samuel Kearney :- "That we call upon the bounty bouncil to creet the Hulks that they promised, to protect against the north west gales, as suggester by the boinnitter appointed to go into the matter, namely - m. Ennis, and m. Peacocke." Proposed by m. Patrick toley, and seconded by m? william Barron :- "That we petition the Board of Irade © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

to creet at least two more lamps on the quay, as the present ones are not sufficient to ensure safe landing, and also to creet two protection gates, one on each gap, as some lives has been lost in this place not being sufficiently protected one man, in this place, the first day of this year, (a poor stranger) walked out in one of those gaps, and was picked up and taken to neurossenion where he died two days after "

Proposed by m? thomas Walsh, and seconded by m? michael Foley: "That having reforence to the fact that the Department sent down here one of their fishing bommissioners, m? Greene, to make investigations, and he promised that whatever the Docks would cost to repair, that the Department would subscribe half the amount, and provide us with a large boat, when the docks were put in order also to send down a man to take charge of her when going on deep fishing voyages, until we would be competent to do so ourselves. We now call on them to give us their assistance to enable us to carry out the project."

Proposed by M? michael walsh, and seconded by m? John oneill :- Shat we call for an inquiry to change dates of opening season for fishing from 1st march to middle of September as the present time is too early, that is from 1st February to 16th August, and weekly close time escended to size oblock on Saturday evening."

Proposed by M? Martin Kenny, R. D. C., and seconded by M? John Cahill :- "That we beg to call the attention of our members of Parliament to the great necessity of a reconstruction of Board of bonservators as constituted at present, they are in no way in sympathy with the fishermen; and have the law amended so that popular men shall be elected to such Boards." The Secretary directed the attention of the bouncil to a letter received from the under Secretary Dublin bastle, under date 2" October and no 27, 364, from which the following is an extract : I am directed by the ford Justices to inform you that their Excellencies are advised that the duty of maintaining © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES and controlling the piers of arthurstown and Duncannon, rists on the interford bounty bouncil but that Ballyhack harbour appears to be the propwhy of the waterford Harbour bommissioners."

The Chairman pointed out that from the letter of the hord justices it appeared that Ballyhack Harbour was vested in the waterford Harbour bommissioners, and if the bounty bouncil spent money on it they would run the risk of surcharge.

of the bouncil taken bounsel's opinion and he advised that the bounty bouncil had no legal power to carry out any works at Ballyhack.

on the motion of mr. bummins, seconded by m? Browne the following resolution was adopted:-"That this bounced regulat mr. Ifrench, m. P. for South Wescford, to put a question in the House of bommons as to whethis it was not correct that this bouncil were willing to eschend a reasonable sum of money to establish some protection for the boats of the poor fishermen at Ballyhack Harbour, and were advised that this harbour is under the control of the waterford Harbour bommiscioners, who will not carry out the necessary work at this Harbour, or facilitate anyone else to do so. That me Ifrinch ask what redress the fishermen have in these circumstances, to compet the waterford Harbour Commissioners to put the harbour white a condition that will allow them to prosecute their industry, as they are debarred from obtaining help from their own to bouncel, in consequence of this Harbour being vested in the waterford "Harbour Commissioners That this bouncil also desire to call the attention of m? Ifrench to the anomalous position regarding the Harbours of arthurstown and Duncannon, at which the waterford Harbour Commissioners levy and collect dues, while the piers have to be maintained by the westford bo. Council. That a copy of this resolution be forwarded mr. Richard Gletson.

Diverted Roads.

The following recommendation of the Finance bommittee came up for consideration -

W. Elgu reported that he had taken bounsels opinion in connection with the Railway diverted roads in the bounty bouncil had adviced that where the roads had been passed by two justices the bounty bouncil, under the act, must take them over, but they are not bound to take over fences, nor are they bound to keep the fences in repair." "It was ordered that me blace request the Railway

"mo murphy, moved and m? Nore seconded the confirmation of the recommendation directing m? Elger to apply to the Railway bo, for a copy of the justices certificate stating that the diverted roads in question were in good order"

Bt S. & W. Railway bo's, interference with Roads W" Elgu reported that as directed by the bo bouncil he had prosecuted at wescford petty Sessions the bt S. & W. Railway bo, for breaking up roads at Kilrane, to lay down waterpipes, altho' the bo bounced had repused their sanction to an application of the Railway bo, to lay these pipes. M" Elgu said he insued two summonses one for each wood, and the magistrates held that in the circumstances there was a technical offince, and fined the Railway bo, 1/2 and costs of court in each case."

lovery lown bommissioners & Sarastill Quarry under date 16th may 1908, the following who read from M. Denis murphy, lown blerk, Gorey "At the meeting of my bommissioners held on 13th inst., the following Resolution from Gorey Irade " fabour League; was unanimously adopted kesolved- that we protest in no measured terms against the action of the westford bounty bouncil, in specifying for stones from the Sara Hill Guarry to be used on the roads adjacent to the Sown recently taken over by M. Denis murphy, thereby failing to keep faith with the @WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES Every Stonebucakers, who memorialised them some time since we believe their order if persisted in will do an immensity of harm to the 20wn of Every, by depriving a large number of its residents of some useful and remunerative employment." "I am also to quote your bouncil's Resolution on this subject, under date 20rd may 1906. "Diz-"That own Secretary be directed to inform the memorialists of Every Hill Guarry, that the bounty bouncil have decided to purchase the Sara Hill Giarry, and chat they are of opinion ther action will not in anyway interfere with the locisting utility of the borry Hill Quarry or the people employed there."

It is innecessary to point out that the Gorey Hell Quarries are seriously interfered with I may say that the recent specifications confining the material to be taken from Lara Hell quarry for roads in and around Gorey, amounts to a peremptory decree to completely close up the borey Hell Quarries, so far as employment by stonebucaking is concerned, and this means depriving 6 to 10 families of employment during the winter months.

At a meeting of some members of your bouncil held here 23rd January last, touching the matter of direct labour. I am sure you will remember that I indeavoured to draw attention to this very question of interfering with the working of the Goory Hill Quarries, by giving the monophy for road material required in and adound Gorey to Lara Hill Quarry.

Goury Hill stones were always considered good road metalling the main street of Gorey is a fair test of their quality. It is not desired to increase the output more than formerly from Gorey Hill. But is capected at least, that your bouncil will not be a party to deprive several working families of Borey of the means of support, even if they never passed a Resolution on behalf of this very question, and it is to be hoped that the Resolution referred to will be observed."

mo webster said that Gorey Hill Quarry stones were not in his opinion, particularly good and were not to be compared with the material at Lara Hill Quarry If the people round Gorey wanted good roads, they must give up using Gorey Hill Quarry, and use instead the stones from Lara Hill

"It was agreed to postpone the matter until mr. a Kinsella, the bouncillor for the District, would be able to be present."

Baseter Stonebreaker

M. Browne moved, and mr asple seconded, confirm ation of the following recommendation of the Ishana bommittee :-

"That the Secretary be directed to write to meson Baseter to, makers of the Stonebreaker at Lara Hill, saying that the County Council consider that their quotation for "jaws" are too high, and point out that before going elswhere for "jaws" they would be glad to know if the makers could not give them a lower quotation."

"on the motion of mo Hore, seconded by motion a hearty vote of thanks was passed to motionis, and motion for their kindness in paying a surprise visit to Sara Hill Guarry, and escamining so closely into its working" motion and motion Rolger replied suitably.

New Quarries

Mr. bummins moved, and mr. murphy seconded the following recommendation of the Finance bommittee - "That the bounty Surveyor be directed to report as to "the best quarries which he can find in the four Rural Districts with a view to a bommittee being appointed to inspect these quarries, and report to the bouncil."

Embankment Great Island

under date 21st april 1908 the following letter was read from mr. Pope; blerk new Roses Rural District bouncil: "I am directed to inform you that at the © WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES half-yearly meeting of the new Ross District bounced held on "the april, the following order was made with reference to Road no 75 (660 perches between * Priesthaggard crossroads and the penction of the Greatisland and Ballinlaw Road; Dig:-

"That the bounty bouncil's attention be drawn to the embankment at this point, and that we request them to take legal proceedings against the owners to have said embankment put into proper repair immediately."

"W! Webster said that he had received a letter from M? H. b. Wallace, that he had been imployed by mr. Syndall, to carry out the necessary work at the embankment."

The Secretary was directed to inform the new Ross District bouncil that m. Lyndall was having the work carried out

Contour Harbour.

under date 16th april 1908, the Department of Agriculture and Dechnical Instruction, whole letter N. 2116-08, 3. 8. relative to dredging of bourtour Harbour:-

I have to acquaint you, for the information of the westford bo. bouncel, that the fishermen of bourtour have drawn the attention of the separtment to the fact that the mouth of the Harbour at the place, is choked with siltage; and to state that the Department have found by experience that this Gredger Fag an Bealach" is too large and draws too much water to enable it to remove the obstruction. Inquiries are in progress with regard to securing the services of a 'smaller Dredger which, if the bounty bouncil were prepared to co-operate in providing part of the expenses incurred might be utilised to clear the Bar; but up to the present no suitable vessel has been discovered. In the meantime, the Department would be glad to know whether the bounty bouncil would be willing to assist in such a project' under date 29th april 1908 (letter No. 2501-'08 7. B) the Department in risponse to a resolution from the Proposal. bommittee of the bounty bouncil wrote as follows :-© WEXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL ARCHIVES

Adverting to your letter of the 17th instant, I have to state, for the information of the Weeeford to Council that the Department are not prepared to contribute towards the cost of carrying out the ordinary work of repair and maintenance of the Piers at Courtown." "On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by M. Hore, the Secretary was directed to ask the Department if they would, as their contribution to the Scheme provide a small dredger, for the Weseford to bouncil for the upkeep of the harbours along this coast, if the bo bouncil would undertake to maintain the craft. The County bouncil are quite willing to cooperate with the Department with regard to the improvement of Courtown Harbour.

That as we understand a deputation is being arranged by the bo bommittee of agriculture, to wait upon me? we Russell, m P. View President, Department of agriculture, with regard to the establishment of an agricultural School in the bo weseford, that the bo bouncel members of this deputation be requested to take the opportunity of interviewing the Sice President of the Department on the subjecting of providing a dredger for the weseford Harbours"

On the motion of the Chairman the recommendation of the Finance Committee agreeing to the request of Courtour Harbour Committee that Tooloal Bags be procured at a cost not exceeding to was confirmed."

Gorey Road Contractors meeting The following addressed to the Gorey Rural District Connect was forwarded to the County Council, by directions of the Corey District Council:-

m. Chairman & Gentlemen,

I have been requested by a number of road contractors who attended a meeting on the sth inst., to forward the following resolution adopted at said meeting.

Personally I don't think much about it, however, when I was asked to write something I was loath to refuse, as I am tired of the whole business The Presiding bhairman at your last meeting suggisted a strong resolution, yet I fail to see who the resolution should condemn, swrely not your bouncil, as you have stood by the contractor in voting against direct labour. And it is my opinion that we can scarcely blame me webstor when he was acting under difinite instructions from the bounty bouncil.
